BAPTISM OF CHILDREN

Parents are required to attend a Parent Information Session prior to scheduling a Baptism. These sessions on Baptism are held the second Thursday of each month at St. James or by appointment at St. Bernard & St. Margaret Mary. St. Ann has Baptism preparation classes during Mass+ on the third Sunday of the month.



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

HONOR YOUR MOTHER AND FATHER

We are not even certain of their names. The names Anne and Joachim come from the apocryphal Gospel of James. This work is from the 2nd century and is not authored by either of the apostles named James. What we do know is that Mary, the mother of Jesus, had parents and that those parents raised her well. As married couples, and as the Church in union with Christ, our first responsibility is to God. Our second responsibility is to the marriage itself. Our third responsibility is to family, especially our children. Anne and Joachim are models of these three and the order of importance. How do we know this? The fourth commandment is honor thy Father and Mother. There are two expectations included in this commandment: Caring for our parents in their old age, and ourselves living a holy life which reflects well on them as the parents who raised us. Mary's life reflects very, very well on the parents who raised her. Next week will focus on Priscilla and Aquila, a married couple who worked closely with St. Paul who referred to them as fellow workers in Christ Jesus. Let us always be in prayer with and for each other.

SACRAMENTAL EMERGENCY PROTOCOL

As part of the Mary Queen of Heaven Parish Family, we have established the following protocol for Sacramental Emergencies.

WHAT IS A SACRAMENTAL EMERGENCY?

Sacramental Emergencies are if someone is in imminent danger of dying and wishes to receive the sacraments before passing. This also may include those who are under someone's care and are unable to request the sacraments themselves – including, but not limited to, emergency infant Baptism or Last Rites of someone with dementia. If someone has a chronic illness or is not in imminent danger, please schedule an anointing. It is suggested that the sick person receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at the beginning of any serious condition – not at the end. **If you are in need of a priest or have a Sacramental Emergency after hours, please call 513-369-9820.**

STEWARSHIP OF TALENT

STEWARSHIP AND THE POWER OF PRAYER

Prayer is essential to stewardship because it aligns our hearts with God's will. When we pray, we seek God's guidance on managing what He has entrusted to us wisely. Without prayer, stewardship can quickly become a self-centered practice, where we might be tempted to rely on our own wisdom, desires, or sense of control. Here are some ways prayers can support stewardship:

1. Prayer Reminds Us of God's Ownership – When we start with prayer, we remind ourselves that God is the true owner of all we have. Through prayer, we acknowledge that our resources – time, talents, and money – are not ours to hoard or misuse. Stewardship is less about managing our resources and more about being faithful to God's resources. Prayer enables us to shift our focus from ourselves to God.
2. Prayer Helps Us Discern God's Will – In moments of decision-making, prayer is crucial to discern how God wants us to use our resources. Should we donate to a cause, invest in a ministry, or allocate time for a particular task? Prayer opens our hearts to hear God's voice and guides us to be good stewards in a way that aligns with His purposes. As stewards, we need to be in constant communication with the Holy Spirit, who helps us make wise and generous decisions. Prayer invites God into the process, ensuring that our choices are not solely based on worldly standards but on the kingdom's values.
3. Prayer Nurtures a Generous Spirit – Giving can sometimes feel like a burden, especially when resources are tight. However, prayer shifts our mindset from one of scarcity to one of abundance. When we pray, God transforms our perspective on giving. Rather than viewing it as a loss, we begin to see it as an act of worship and a reflection of God's generosity toward us.



STEWARSHIP AND PRAYER GO HAND IN HAND

As we seek to live out the principle of stewardship in our daily lives, prayer must remain at the center of our efforts. Stewardship without prayer can become a checklist of tasks and responsibilities. However, stewardship with prayer becomes a profound act of worship and trust. By bringing our decisions and resources to God in prayer, we acknowledge His sovereignty, seek His guidance, and foster a spirit of generosity.

Let us then approach our stewardship of time, talents, and finances with a heart of prayer, continually seeking God's will and trusting Him to guide our every decision. In doing so, we will not only honor God but also find joy in serving Him with all that we have.


ONLINE GIVING

- Your Ohio tax bill drops to \$450 (\$1,200-\$750)

Fast FAQs

- Do I need to itemize? No, This is a tax credit, not a deduction.
- What's the deadline? Make your SGO gift by the date you file for taxes up to April 15.
- Can I give less than the limit? Yes, but the credit is capped at \$750/\$1,500.
- Anything else to know? The credit can only reduce up to the Ohio income tax you owe for the year.





SAINT JOHN PAUL II

Saint of the Day: October 22

Patron Saint of young Catholics and families

Born in Wadowice, Poland, Karol Józef Wojtyła had lost his mother, father, and older brother before his 21st birthday. Karol's promising academic career at Kraków's Jagiellonian University was cut short by the outbreak of World War II. While working in a quarry and a chemical factory, he enrolled in an "underground" seminary in Kraków. Ordained in 1946, he was immediately sent to Rome where he earned a doctorate in theology.

Back in Poland, a short assignment as assistant pastor in a rural parish preceded his very fruitful chaplaincy for university students. Communist officials allowed Wojtyła to be appointed auxiliary bishop of Kraków in 1958, considering him a relatively harmless intellectual. They could not have been more wrong!

Appointed as archbishop of Kraków in 1964, he was named a cardinal three years later. Elected pope in October 1978, he took the name of his short-lived, immediate predecessor. Pope John Paul II was the first non-Italian pope in 455 years. In time, he made pastoral visits to 124 countries, including several with small Christian populations.

The Great Jubilee of the Year 2000, a key event in John Paul's ministry, was marked by special celebrations in Rome and elsewhere for Catholics and other Christians. Relations with the Orthodox Churches improved considerably during his papacy.

In his 27 years of papal ministry, John Paul II wrote 14 encyclicals and five books, canonized 482 saints and beatified 1,338 people. In the last years of his life, he suffered from Parkinson's disease and was forced to cut back on some of his activities.

Pope Benedict XVI beatified John Paul II in 2011, and Pope Francis canonized him in 2014.
