

### AN END AND A BEGINNING

What a week! Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King. We celebrate the simple fact of where all things began and where all things lead. ### SACRAMENTAL EMERGENCY PROTOCOL

As part of the Mary Queen of Heaven Parish Family, we have established the following protocol for Sacramental Emergencies.

#### WHAT IS A SACRAMENTAL EMERGENCY?

Sacramental Emergencies are if someone is in imminent danger of dying and wishes to receive the sacraments before passing. This also may include those who are under someone's care and are unable to request the sacraments themselves—including but not limited to, emergency infant baptism or last rites of someone with dementia. If someone either has a chronic illness or is not in imminent danger, please schedule an anointing. It is suggested that the sick person receive the sacrament of the anointing of the sick at the beginning of any serious condition—not at the end. **If you are in need of a priest or have a Sacramental Emergency after hours, please call 513-369-9820.**




**FROM THE SAFE ENVIRONMENT OFFICE**

With fall activities in full swing, we would like to remind all parish/school employees and volunteers of the requirements of the Decree on Child Protection. All employees and volunteers are required to have completed **The Archdiocese of Cincinnati: Protecting Children From Sexual Abuse – Archdiocese Of Cincinnati Edition**. In addition, employees are required to complete an online background check, manual fingerprinting, and B4 form once prior to beginning employment. Ohio Department of Education licensees may have additional requirements, and school offices or athletic departments should be consulted

if there are any questions. Volunteers are required to complete an online background check prior to volunteering with youth. Employees and volunteers are required to stay current in completing SafeParish™ quarterly bulletins.

Please make sure you are up to date on completing the quarterly bulletins or you will not be able to work/volunteer with youth until your SafeParish™ account is approved. **OFFERTORY ENVELOPE CHANGES COMING**

We want to make you aware of the upcoming changes to the Offertory Envelopes you receive in the mail. Why make this change? Beacons of Light is asking our parishes to move in the direction of becoming a single parish. Therefore, many things in our parishes will be standardized across all four locations over the course of this initiative. Collection envelopes are one of those areas. Funds received will remain at the parish where they are donated.

Here are the changes effective July 1, 2025:

1. St. Ann, St. Bernard and St. Margaret Mary Envelopes will be mailed bi-monthly starting in June 2025 for July and August. St. James Offertory Envelopes will be mailed bi-monthly starting for 2026.
2. All four churches offertory envelopes will have the same layouts for information, but Church specific.
3. St. Vincent DePaul envelopes will be in only for the months which have a 5th Sunday.
4. The current envelope each parish uses for capital/continued improvements/beautification will be renamed to Building and Grounds, and it will be a quarterly envelope.
5. Holy Day Offertory envelopes and specific flower donation envelopes will be identical in design.
6. Special Archdiocese Collection Envelopes Will Not Change.

For those donation requests that no longer have a printed envelope, we encourage you to continue what donations you would like to make by using your own envelope or by using our online donation platform.

## SAINT ANDREW DUNG-LAC AND COMPANIONS

Saint of the Day: November 24

Patron Saints of Vietnam

Andrew Dung-Lac, a Catholic convert ordained to the priesthood, was one of 117 people martyred in Vietnam between 1820 and 1862. Members of the companions group gave their lives for Christ in the 17th, 18th, and 19th centuries, and received beatification. All were canonized during the papacy of Saint John Paul II.

Severe persecutions were launched at least three times in the 19th century. During the six decades after 1820, between 100,000 and 300,000 Catholics were killed or subjected to great hardship. Foreign missionaries martyred in the first wave included priests of the Paris Mission Society, and Spanish Dominican priests and tertiaries.

In 1832, Emperor Minh-Mang banned all foreign missionaries, and tried to make all Vietnamese deny their faith by trampling on a crucifix. Like the priest-holes in Ireland during English persecution, many hiding places were offered in homes of the faithful.

Persecution broke out again in 1847, when the emperor suspected foreign missionaries and Vietnamese Christians of sympathizing with a rebellion led by one of his sons. The last of the martyrs were 17 laypersons, one of them a 9-year-old, executed in 1862.

In 1964, there were still 833,000 Catholics in the north, but many were in prison. In the south, Catholics were enjoying the first decade of religious freedom in centuries, their numbers swelled by refugees.

During the Vietnamese war, Catholics again suffered in the north, and again moved to the south in great numbers. Now reunited, the entire country is under Communist rule.


