Parents are required to attend a Parent Information Session prior to scheduling a Baptism. These sessions on Baptism are held the second Thursday of each month at St. James or by appointment at St. Bernard & St. Margaret Mary. St. Ann has Baptism preparation classes during Mass+ on the third Sunday of the month.



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

MARY AND ADVENT

Mary is an important figure throughout the season of Advent. We are waiting for a Savior. We are preparing ourselves and our world for His arrival. It is Mary through whom He has come, and as a model for the Church, it is Mary through whom He will come again. Monday, we celebrate the Immaculate Conception. This is not a celebration of Mary conceiving Jesus. It is rather a celebration of Mary being conceived by her parents. Mary is prepared by God Himself to be the mother of our Savior by being kept free from sin from the very beginning of her life in her mother's womb. Her freedom from sin is preparation for the One who will free us all. Tuesday, we celebrate St. Juan Diego who was gifted with witnessing the appearance of Mary, Our Lady of Guadalupe. Wednesday, we celebrate Our Lady of Loreto, the home of Mary where she received the Annunciation, transported by angels to Italy. On Friday, we celebrate Our Lady of Guadalupe. Mary appeared as a native princess bringing great conversions among the native peoples and increased unity between Spanish Christians and natives.

SACRAMENTAL EMERGENCY PROTOCOL

As part of the Mary, Queen of Heaven Parish Family, we have established the following protocol for Sacramental Emergencies.

WHAT IS A SACRAMENTAL EMERGENCY?

Sacramental Emergencies are if someone is in imminent danger of dying and wishes to receive the sacraments before passing. This also may include those who are under someone's care and are unable to request the sacraments themselves—including but not limited to, emergency infant Baptism or last rites of someone with dementia. If someone either has a chronic illness or is not in imminent danger, please schedule an anointing. It is suggested that the sick person receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at the beginning of any serious condition—not at the end. **If you are in need of a priest or have a Sacramental Emergency after hours, please call 513-369-9820.**



THE RITE OF WELCOMING AND ACCEPTANCE – OCIA

The Rite of Acceptance is for the unbaptized who are beginning their journey in the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA), where they formally express their desire to become Christian and are welcomed into the Church. The Rite of Welcoming is for those who were previously baptized in another Christian tradition and wish to join the Catholic Church, as they publicly declare their intention to continue their journey toward full communion. Both rites mark a person's public commitment and initiate them into the OCIA process, which is punctuated by various stages and rites, leading to the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. Please keep them in your prayers.

STEWARSHIP AND THE SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT – PEACE


A fundamental emphasis of the Season of Advent each year is to welcome Jesus, who came in time, who will come at the end of time, and who comes to us every day: in Sacred Scripture, in the Sacraments of the Church, and in our encounters with God and one another. The three Scripture readings for this Second Sunday of Advent center around the idea of being reconciled to God and the readings explain the conditions for that reconciliation to take place in a “graceful” manner. The word “graceful” is intentionally used here, to indicate supernatural help that comes from God, what we usually call “grace,” meant to assist us in doing good and growing the likeness of God in whose image we are created.

The words of Saint Paul to the Romans, found in the second reading for Mass this Sunday, says very plainly: “Accept one another as Christ accepted you.” In doing that, we can be reconciled, that is, in harmony and unity, with others and with God. The first reading for Mass, from the Prophet Isaiah, expresses the concept of being reconciled in beautiful imagery from nature: “The wolf shall be the guest of the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the kid; the calf and the young lion shall browse together, with a little child to lead them.”

It is always important to remember that redemption is God’s work, not ours. Isaiah the Prophet also speaks of the day when “the Spirit of the Lord shall rest” upon us. This gift is perfectly given through the coming of the Messiah Jesus, whereby the Spirit of the Lord will be poured out upon all people. This is called by Isaiah “the spirit of wisdom and understanding,” which makes for the possibility of doing all things correctly, according to God’s will. It is also called a “spirit of counsel and might,” giving people the strength and goodness for doing good. Finally, “a spirit of knowledge and fear of the Lord” will be given, in order that all may delight in knowing, loving and serving God.

We may at times or often feel that such goodness among peoples is impossible, yet with God, all things are possible, Scripture tells us. Like rain that can bring forth grass and other vegetation to parched land, which we experience here in the desert each Spring and Summer, so too, God’s action can do astonishingly great things! Saint Benedict tells his followers in the Holy Rule, “never to despair of God’s mercy,” and that is still true and an important message in the realm of experiencing the salvation has in store for us.

During Advent, we wait in hope for the Spirit of the Lord to rest upon us, to invigorate us and to bring about the transformation that God desires to occur, within us personally, within the Church and within the whole human race.

**FROM THE SAFE ENVIRONMENT OFFICE**

With fall activities in full swing, we would like to remind all parish/school employees and volunteers of the requirements of the Decree on Child Protection. All employees and volunteers are required to have completed **The Archdiocese of Cincinnati: Protecting Children From Sexual Abuse – Archdiocese of Cincinnati Edition**. In addition, employees are required to complete an online background check, manual fingerprinting, and B4 form once prior to beginning employment. Ohio Department of Education licensees may have additional requirements, and school offices or athletic departments should be consulted if there are any questions. Volunteers are required to complete an online background check prior to volunteering with youth. Employees and volunteers are required to stay current in completing SafeParish™ quarterly bulletins.

Please make sure you are up to date on completing the quarterly bulletins or you will not be able to work/volunteer with youth until your SafeParish™ account is approved. OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE

Saint of the Day: December 12

Patron Saint of the Americas and Mexico

The feast in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe goes back to the 16th century. Chronicles of that period tell us the story.

A poor Indian named Cuauhtlatoahuac was baptized and given the name Juan Diego. He was a 57-year-old widower, and lived in a small village near Mexico City. On Saturday morning December 9, 1531, he was on his way to a nearby barrio to attend Mass in honor of Our Lady.


Juan was walking by a hill called Tepeyac when he heard beautiful music like the warbling of birds. A radiant cloud appeared, and within it stood an Indian maiden dressed like an Aztec princess. The lady spoke to him in his own language and sent him to the bishop of Mexico, a Franciscan named Juan de Zumarraga. The bishop was to build a chapel in the place where the lady appeared.

Eventually, the bishop told Juan to have the lady give him a sign. About this same time, Juan's uncle became seriously ill. This led poor Juan to try to avoid the lady. Nevertheless, the lady found Juan, assured him that his uncle would recover, and provided roses for Juan to carry to the bishop in his cape or tilma.

On December 12, when Juan Diego opened his tilma in the bishop's presence, the roses fell to the ground, and the bishop sank to his knees. On the tilma where the roses had been appeared an image of Mary exactly as she had appeared at the hill of Tepeyac.




