FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

NOT SO ORDINARY

Today we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord. Jesus is the Light for the nations. Definitely not an ordinary day. Next Sunday we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. Not an ordinary day, but with the Baptism of the Lord, we close the Christmas Season and head back into Ordinary Time. Baptism both celebrates and creates unity. Peter resists the idea of baptizing Gentiles until he sees the presence of the Spirit upon Cornelius and his family. Peter's eyes are opened. Nothing can be allowed to separate people who share the same Spirit. Thinking His Baptism is primarily one of repentance and forgiveness, John resists the idea of baptizing Jesus. Jesus insists. Jesus' Baptism is a celebration of union with us and with the Father. As Jesus rises from the water, the sky is rent in two. For a brief moment, there is no barrier between heaven and earth, between God and His creation. In Baptism we commit ourselves to all others in faith. Nothing can be allowed to stand between us. In Baptism, God commits Himself to sharing His life with His people. He will allow no barrier to remain between us and the life of heaven. Ordinary Time is so called because the weeks are sequentially numbered, not because it is boring or unimportant. God works with us throughout the year, in different ways according to the different seasons, both in the Church Year, and in the movements of our personal lives. Look for God in all the moments. He is certainly in them. Ordinary time is not so ordinary after all.

PRAYER

Lord God, we rejoice in the splendor of Your presence. You have placed Your heart in our hands. We are transformed by the touch. May the hands which have touched you be generous as they reach out to touch others. Your presence goes with us, Lord, and with Your presence, Your blessing.

WHAT IS A SACRAMENTAL EMERGENCY?

Sacramental Emergencies are if someone is in imminent danger of dying and wishes to receive the sacraments before passing. This also may include those who are under someone's care and are unable to request the sacraments themselves—including but not limited to, emergency infant Baptism or last rites of someone with dementia. If someone either has a chronic illness or is not in imminent danger, please schedule an anointing. It is suggested that the sick person receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at the beginning of any serious condition—not at the end. **If you are in need of a priest or have a Sacramental Emergency after hours, please call 513-369-9820.**



FROM THE SAFE ENVIRONMENT OFFICE

We would like to remind all parish/school employees and volunteers of the requirements of the Decree on Child Protection. All employees and volunteers are required to have completed **The Archdiocese of Cincinnati: Protecting Children From Sexual Abuse – Archdiocese of Cincinnati Edition**. In addition, employees are required

to complete an online background check, manual fingerprinting, and B4 form once prior to beginning employment. Ohio Department of Education licensees may have additional requirements, and school offices or athletic departments should be consulted if there are any questions. Volunteers are required to complete an online background check prior to volunteering with youth. Employees and volunteers are required to stay current in completing SafeParish™ quarterly bulletins.

Please make sure you are up to date on completing the quarterly bulletins or you will not be able to work/volunteer with youth until your SafeParish™ account is approved. 

ST. JOHN NEUMANN

Saint of the Day: January 5

Patron Saint of Educators/Teachers

Perhaps because the United States got a later start in the history of the world, it has relatively few canonized saints, but their number is increasing.

Saint John Neumann was born in what is now the Czech Republic. After studying in Prague, he came to New York at 25 and was ordained a priest. He did missionary work in New York until he was 29, when he joined the Redemptorists and became its first member to profess vows in the United States. He continued missionary work in Maryland, Virginia and Ohio, where he became popular with the Germans. At 41, as bishop of Philadelphia, he organized the parochial school system into a diocesan one, increasing the number of pupils almost twentyfold within a short time.

Gifted with outstanding organizing ability, he drew into the city many teaching communities of sisters and the Christian Brothers. During his brief assignment as vice provincial for the Redemptorists, he placed them in the forefront of the parochial movement.

Well-known for his holiness and learning, spiritual writing and preaching, on October 13, 1963, Saint John Neumann became the first American bishop to be beatified. Canonized in 1977, he is buried in St. Peter the Apostle Church in Philadelphia.


