FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

OUR RESPONSE

Next week's Responsorial Psalm (Psalm 27) proclaims "The Lord is my Light and my Salvation". It begins with our trials and ends with the "bounty of the Lord" and "the land of the living." Getting from the one to the other depends on our response. It always has. God has always offered. God has always worked with us. God has always awaited our response. This is not a beginning. Jesus' ministry continues the work of John, the work of Isaiah, the work of all the prophets before Him. He uses John's theme of repentance in His preaching and includes two of John's disciples among His apostles. We are connected to all those who have gone before us, and yet there is still something very precious in the moment. Like all the prophets before Him, Jesus speaks with the word of God. Unlike any of the prophets, He is the Word of which He speaks. It is both the same and critically new! Jesus' ministry continues through His disciples. It is with His voice that His followers speak. It is the same call. It is a call to all people, and yet it is new, a special moment. Today, He calls us. It is not a beginning. He has called us many times before. Yet, it is also a critical moment. There is something very precious in the moment. He calls you. He calls me. He calls us. It is one more opportunity, and yet one specifically for us to hear His word and become more fully His disciples.

Heavenly Father, continue to bless all of those being confirmed next Sunday. Strengthen them in their faith and their dedication to the family of the Church. Lord Jesus, bless them, together with all of us. As we remember the day of our own Confirmation, renew us in the commitment and promises we have made. SACRAMENTAL EMERGENCY PROTOCOL

As part of the Mary, Queen of Heaven Parish Family, we have established the following protocol for Sacramental Emergencies.

WHAT IS A SACRAMENTAL EMERGENCY?

Sacramental Emergencies are if someone is in imminent danger of dying and wishes to receive the sacraments before passing. This also may include those who are under someone's care and are unable to request the sacraments themselves—including but not limited to, emergency infant Baptism or last rites of someone with dementia. If someone either has a chronic illness or is not in imminent danger, please schedule an anointing. It is suggested that the sick person receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at the beginning of any serious condition—not at the end. **If you are in need of a priest or have a Sacramental Emergency after hours, please call 513-369-9820.**



STEWARSHIP OF TALENT

Were you aware that the term "Lamb of God" only appears in the Gospel of John? John was the youngest of the Twelve Apostles. His Gospel was the last of the four Gospels written (estimated around 90 AD). His Gospel is also unique among the four Gospels in its approach and in its style. John lets us know why he wrote it: "...that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name." (John 20:31)

For more than 1,300 years, the Lamb of God (Agnus Dei) has been a standard part of our Catholic Mass. That term reminds us at every liturgy that Jesus allowed Himself to be sacrificed on our behalf. It was the ultimate act of love. In a small way, we are asked to respond to that sacrifice by living lives of stewardship — by giving of ourselves in many ways. Father Henri J. M. Nouwen, a prolific writer on what it means to be Catholic, said "Our humanity comes to its fullest bloom in giving. We become beautiful people when we give whatever we can give: a smile, a handshake, a kiss, an embrace, a word of love, a present, a part of our life...all of our life."

We would like to remind all parish/school employees and volunteers of the requirements of the Decree on Child Protection. All employees and volunteers are required to have completed **The Archdiocese of Cincinnati: Protecting Children From Sexual Abuse – Archdiocese of Cincinnati Edition**. In addition, employees are required to complete an online background check, manual fingerprinting, and B4 form once prior to beginning employment. Ohio Department of Education licensees may

have additional requirements, and school offices or athletic departments should be consulted if there are any questions. Volunteers are required to complete an online background check prior to volunteering with youth. Employees and volunteers are required to stay current in completing SafeParish™ quarterly bulletins.

Please make sure you are up to date on completing the quarterly bulletins or you will not be able to work/volunteer with youth until your SafeParish™ account is approved. Who should come? Parents with children under 12 years old, new parents, struggling parents, or any parent who wants to learn practical, effective parenting skills. The classes cover normal child development, realistic expectations, physical discipline alternatives, communication skills, problem-solving skills, coping skills, and stress management. The six-week sessions take place on Monday evenings from 4:30-6:30 p.m. and cost \$80.00. SAINT FRANCIS DE SALES

Saint of the Day: January 24

Patron Saint of Authors, Deafness, Journalists and Writers

Saint Francis de Sales was destined by his father to be a lawyer. For this reason, Francis was sent to Padua to study law. After receiving his doctorate, he returned home and, in due time, told his parents he wished to enter the priesthood.

His father strongly opposed Francis in this, and only after much patient persuasiveness on the part of the gentle Francis, did his father finally consent. Francis was ordained and elected provost of the Diocese of Geneva, then a center for the Calvinists. Saint Francis de Sales set out to convert them, especially in the district of Chablais. By preaching and distributing the little pamphlets he wrote to explain true Catholic doctrine, he had remarkable success.

At 35, he became bishop of Geneva. While administering his diocese he continued to preach, hear Confessions, and catechize the children. His gentle character was a great asset in winning souls. He practiced his own axiom, "A spoonful of honey attracts more flies than a barrelful of vinegar."

Besides his two well-known books, *Introduction to the Devout Life* and *Treatise on the Love of God*, he wrote many pamphlets and carried on a vast correspondence. For his writings, he has been named patron of the Catholic Press. His writings, filled with his characteristic gentle spirit, are addressed to lay people. He wants to make them understand that they too are called to be saints.

In spite of his busy and comparatively short life, he had time to collaborate with another saint, Jane Frances de Chantal, in the work of establishing the Sisters of the Visitation. These women were to practice the virtues exemplified in Mary's visit to Elizabeth: humility, piety, and mutual charity. They at first engaged to a limited degree in works of mercy for the poor and the sick. Today, while some communities conduct schools, others live a strictly contemplative life.


