BAPTISM OF CHILDREN

The Sacrament of Baptism for Children age seven and younger is celebrated each month at St. James (4th Sunday, 11:30 a.m.); St. Bernard (2nd Sunday, 10:30 a.m.); and as scheduled at St. Ann & St. Margaret Mary. Parents are required to attend a Parent Information Session prior to scheduling a Baptism. These sessions on Baptism are held the Second Thursday of each month at St. James or by appointment at St. Bernard & St. Margaret Mary. St. Ann has Baptism preparation classes during Mass+ on the Third Sunday of the month.



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

THE SEASON OF LENT: Lent begins this Wednesday with Ash Wednesday. With the reception of ashes, we recognize the death and sin within us, and we recommit ourselves to life. Lent is the season for doing something different. We hear God calling us back. God longs to pull us out of our sins and away from death. Lent is God's promise of life, a promise that is fulfilled at Easter. Lent is our response to God's call. We all need to walk more closely with God. We pray. We reflect. We do. We seek God in order to more closely model our lives upon His. We open ourselves to change, so that God may form and reform us more closely in His image.

A BASIC CATECHISM: We celebrate God as Our Father, but it would make no sense for us to speak of God the Father, unless there be a child. This, of course is God the Son, but we can also extend the meaning to all of creation. God is Our Father. Making this statement defines God, from the very beginning as being in relationship. The Son is His child. We are His children. We often speak of the Holy Spirit as being the love shared by Father and Son. Just as human fatherhood should be more than simply having children, providing them with material resources, or even giving them a good example and upbringing, at the heart of God the Father is Love. Being a father does not imply just any relationship, but rather a profoundly loving relationship. God the Father is far more than simply God the Creator. The Father's Love is the most pure love that unites God as One in the Trinity. This is the most pure love that promises to unite all of us with our God. This Love that we celebrate in God the Father is one of choice and selfless giving. He chooses to love us, not just in that he has brought us into being, but that he is Being with us now, and continues to nourish us through the gift of his Being. This is the Father that all fathers are called to emulate.

PRAYER: Like You, Jesus, we face temptation every day. Sometimes it is a losing struggle. Be with us when we fall. Help us to return to the Spirit within. May Your love always be the center of our lives.

SACRAMENTAL EMERGENCY PROTOCOL

As part of the Mary, Queen of Heaven Parish Family, we have established the following protocol for Sacramental Emergencies.

WHAT IS A SACRAMENTAL EMERGENCY?

Sacramental Emergencies are if someone is in imminent danger of dying and wishes to receive the sacraments before passing. This also may include those who are under someone's care and are unable to request the sacraments themselves—including but not limited to, emergency infant Baptism or last rites of someone with dementia. If someone either has a chronic illness or is not in imminent danger, please schedule an anointing. It is suggested that the sick person receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at the beginning of any serious condition—not at the end. **If you are in need of a priest or have a Sacramental Emergency after hours, please call 513-369-9820.**

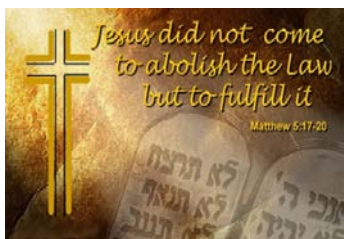

STEWARDSHIP AND THE TEN COMMANDMENTS



Stewardship and The Ten Commandments are deeply linked, as the commandments provide the **ethical framework** for managing God's creation and resources. They call for stewardship over **time, talent, and treasure**, highlighting that God owns all things, while humans are caretakers responsible for using them to glorify Him and serve others.

Key connections between stewardship and The Ten Commandments include:

Recognition of Ownership (First 4 Commandments): The first four commandments (e.g., no other gods, honoring the Sabbath) emphasize that God is the Creator and owner of all things, establishing the foundational principle of stewardship that we are managers of His resources.

Responsible Management (The 5th-10th Commandments): The remaining commandments, particularly the Eighth ("You shall not steal"), are directly related to stewardship. They require respecting others' property, being honest with resources, and not misusing or wasting what God has entrusted to us.

Stewardship as Obedience: Disobeying God's commands, such as coveting or stealing, is considered thievery of God's resources, whereas obedience is the practice of faithful stewardship.

A FEW QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION:

Do I live as if I own my possessions, or as a steward of God's property?

How am I using my limited time to serve God and others?

Am I using my unique skills to contribute to the community?

Am I generous with my finances, or am I hoarding?

Do I treat my body and health as a gift from God?

FROM THE SAFE ENVIRONMENT OFFICE

We would like to remind all parish/school employees and volunteers of the requirements of the *Decree on Child Protection*. All employees and volunteers are required to have completed **The Archdiocese of Cincinnati: Protecting Children From Sexual Abuse – Archdiocese of Cincinnati Edition**. In addition, employees are required to complete an online background check, manual fingerprinting, and B4 form once prior to beginning employment. Ohio Department of Education licensees may have additional requirements, and school offices or athletic departments should be consulted if there are any questions. Volunteers are required to complete an online background check prior to volunteering with youth. Employees and volunteers are required to stay current in completing SafeParish™ quarterly bulletins.

Please make sure you are up to date on completing the quarterly bulletins or you will not be able to work/volunteer with youth until your SafeParish™ account is approved. 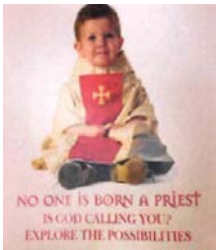

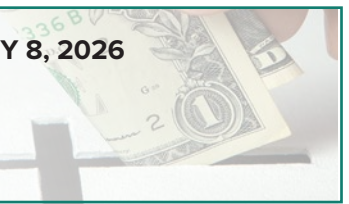

SAINT PETER DAMIAN

Saint of the Day: February 21

Patron Saint of insomnia and sleep difficulties

Saint Peter escaped poverty and the neglect of his own brother when his other brother, who was archpriest of Ravenna, took him under his wing. His brother sent him to good schools and Peter became a professor.

Soon, he decided to leave his teaching and give himself completely to prayer with the Benedictines of the reform of Saint Romuald at Fonte Avellana. They lived two monks to a hermitage. Peter was so eager to pray and slept so little that he soon suffered from severe insomnia. He found he had to use some prudence in taking care of himself. When he was not praying, he studied the Bible.

The abbot commanded that when he died Saint Peter Damian should succeed him. Abbot Saint Peter founded five other hermitages. He encouraged his brothers in a life of prayer and solitude and wanted nothing more for himself.

Pope Stephen IX made Saint Peter Damian the cardinal-bishop of Ostia. He worked hard to wipe out simony – the buying of church offices – and encouraged his priests to observe celibacy and urged even the diocesan clergy to live together and maintain scheduled prayer and religious observance. He wished to restore primitive discipline among religious and priests, warning against needless travel, violations of poverty, and too comfortable living.

He asked often to be allowed to retire as cardinal-bishop of Ostia, and finally Pope Alexander II consented. Saint Peter Damian was happy to become once again just a monk, but he was still called to serve as a papal legate. When returning from such an assignment in Ravenna, he was overcome by a fever. With the monks gathered around him saying the Divine Office, he died on February 22, 1072. In 1828, he was declared a Doctor of the Church.
