#### **Notes from Bishop Hurley**

Thank you for the warm welcome you have extended to me. Everyone has been most gracious and I am appreciative of that. I am grateful for the assistance of Father Brooks and Father Witek for sacramental services and for their willingness to be with us. Each have other responsibilities so their assistance here is a special blessing. With the very real shortage of priests we are fortunate to be able to have them with us to assist along with other priests we are able to come to celebrate with us. I also invite your prayers and support for priestly and religious vocations. We presently have a seminarian from the parish please keep him in your prayers as he discerns a priestly vocation.

Next week we invite your prayers and financial support for the work of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith which supports the missionary activities of the Church through out the world. "Go into the world and preach the good news, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and the Holy Spirit". Envelopes for this special collection will be in the pews for your use. The support of the Missions helps us all to help fulfill our personal responsibility to support the spread of the Gospel and the work of the missionaries who labor on our behalf and in our name.

Last weekend I made an announcement at all the masses regarding Father Richards resignation and leave. It was an important announcement and for this reason I am printing it in this week's bulletin since any number of people told me they were away for the weekend and did not hear it but were asking about it.

Sharing announcement from last weekend October 7/8:

Last weekend Fr. Richards informed you that he was leaving the parish and wrote a letter to the parish to inform you. I understand some have raised questions seeking additional information and speculation. I want to provide some brief comment.

Fr. Ron Richards resigned as the priest assigned to Our Lady of Refuge Parish, Orchard Lake and was granted a leave of absence from the active ministry in order to address personal issues relating to some inappropriate non-criminal adult behavior. We ask that you respect his privacy as he and we move forward and I ask your prayers for him and the parish.

I am Bishop Walter Hurley and I will be serving here at OLOR until such time as a new priest is assigned. There is no timeline. Some of you may remember me as Pastor of Our Lady of Sorrows in Farmington some years ago. Since my retirement 10 years ago as Bishop of Grand Rapids I have served in a number of transitions in several dioceses and parishes in the Archdiocese. I am happy to be able to be of assistance in this wonderful parish as long as I am asked to do so. My Episcopal motto is "Serve with Gladness" and I will do that here as I invite you to serve the Lord with gladness as well.




Thank you all so much for answering the call to be involved with our worship ministries!!

#### Respond with Love

Do you remember a time when you spent much time or money on a surprise or gift for someone else and they failed to appreciate it? We do open ourselves up to disappointment if our expectations do not match the response. Perhaps we reached down deep to share a part of ourselves only to encounter apathy and insensitivity. That can hurt even if the person ignoring our gesture meant no ill will toward us.

What must God feel like when we fail to respond to what He has done for us. We probably do not purposefully slight God, but perhaps we are so busy and mindless that it becomes impossible to be responsive and mindful. We can miss the gift of God which is right before our eyes.

It is very difficult to be a good steward if we do not intentionally choose to be mindful. We miss the important stuff in life, and we neglect those placed in our path as gifts to enrich our lives. If we are to live as Jesus asks, we must work on focusing our eyes of faith on the things that matter and the gifts we have been given. If we are made in the image of God, I suppose we can guess how God might feel when His gifts are not acknowledged, or His love not returned. If I reflect on the One who loves me more than anyone, how can I choose to not offer my love in return?




