

Hello everyone, I pray you had a great week! I wanted to share with you all the awesome way we have been spending our Wednesday evenings here at OLR! Since September 20th., five Seminarians from Sacred Heart Major Seminary (Josh, Matt, Mark, Peter, and Karl) have been coming to the campus, grabbing a list of addresses, and going out door to door to say hello to our community and extend a personal invitation to come and see Our Lady of Refuge and encounter Jesus!

"Wait just a second, Dave! We do door to door ministry here at OLR?!" We ABSOLUTELY do and it has been awesome! Over that last four weeks, the five seminarians and I have visited 52 homes, met with 27 different individuals and families, and have prayed with 15 of them right on their front porches! We have also received \$200.00 in unsolicited donations for our food pantry during this ministry.

This is exactly the type of work I hoped to do when I accepted this position, and I am grateful to Sacred Heart Major Seminary for working with OLR to make this ministry successful. Some of the comments we heard from people were "I have felt God calling me back, but needed a push. Then you guys showed up" or "I have been away for a while and felt something was missing. Thank you for the reminder and invitation to come back".

This is our calling as Catholics. The Bishop and our visiting priests proclaim at the end of Mass "Go, and announce the Gospel of the Lord"! That is not a suggestion, but a reminder that each of us are called to invite others to encounter Jesus! Invite a friend or family member to mass, or bring them to an event we are hosting. It's through this type of personal invitation that I met Jesus. So, set aside any fear, get outside your comfort zone, and make that call to your friend of family member. Go out and plant that seed and then watch what God can do in the lives of those around you. God bless you all!




Thank you all so much for answering the call to be involved with our worship ministries!!

Although our thoughts have turned to fall holidays with the change in the weather, I have a wonderful opportunity to remind everyone that summertime and warmer weather will return!

Catholic Youth Summer Camp started operations last year in Brighton, Michigan after success in Ohio and in Minnesota. It is located at Our Lady of the Fields Camp and Retreat Center and offers 4 weeks for middle school students and 4 weeks for high school students, June 9th through August 2nd. Registration opens on November 1st and I am told that it fills up very quickly. The good news is that the camp allows parishes to reserve spots for campers. Please check out Catholic Youth Summer Camp - Great Lakes; if there is enough interest from parish families, then I can reserve spots specifically for Our Lady of Refuge families. This also means that 'buddy requests' between parish families will be easier to accommodate.

From their website: these are week-long residential camps for students entering grades 6-12. A week of CYSC will energize a person's faith and lead to a deep and personal encounter with Jesus. Each day at camp includes Mass and Prayer Lab, a time for learning how to pray with Scripture, and opportunities for Reconciliation and Eucharistic Adoration.

Everyday Stewardship

Many years ago, during faith formation in my parish, one of the children wrote something that wasn't very nice on a textbook that belonged to someone else. Being the pastoral associate that oversaw the program, I began the investigation immediately. Slowly I began eliminating suspects until it became obvious who the perpetrator was. He denied he was the one, but after much pressure he broke down and confessed. Of course, I derived no satisfaction from finding out the culprit. Of course, it was my own son.


My son didn't want to come clean because he naturally feared what I would say and do when I found out. He also knew that our pastor would find out as well. He felt accountable for his actions and that made it very difficult for him. He realized he let himself, others that loved him, and God down. It was a lesson learned that wasn't much fun to go through. What I was grateful for was the fact that he felt the weight of what he had done. If he hadn't, things would have been very different.

That was a long time ago and when I reflect on it, I think about how often we all do things we regret and then have to face the consequences. But that's what being accountable is all about. We are accountable to those we love, to our neighbor, and to our God. When we begin to slide into a worldview that focuses too much on ourselves, we can easily make decisions that hurt others. We must always seek to do what is good in the eyes of God and that respects others. When we are children this is easier said than done. Alright, let's be honest--it isn't always so easy as adults either.

#### Saint Anthony Mary Claret | October 24



Saint Anthony Mary Claret is also known as the "spiritual father of Cuba." He was born in Salient in Catalonia, Spain, in 1807. He became a weaver, like his father, and was very talented. But he studied in his spare time to become a priest and was ordained in 1835. In 1849 the saint founded the Claretians, a religious institute of missionaries, and a companion order of women religious who served as teachers for girls.

From 1850 to 1857 he served as Archbishop of Santiago de Cuba, Cuba, where he worked diligently to reform both clergy and laity. He opposed concubinage and instructed black slaves, and championed family-owned farms instead of the mass farming of a sugar cash crop. These stances were vehemently opposed by many, and Saint Anthony was the target of assassins.

He was recalled to act as Oueen Isabella II's confessor, a duty he reluctantly agreed to, with the exceptions that he would reside away from the court, attending the household only to hear confessions and instruct the children. While in Spain he founded the Religious Publishing House and wrote or published 200 Catholic books and pamphlets. He went into exile to France with the Queen's household during the Spanish Revolution of 1868.

The saint returned to Rome to Participate in Vatican I where he defended the infallibility of the Pope. He died in France in 1870 and was canonized in 1950 by Pope Pius XII.


