
Why Be Registered?



A number of our parishioners have had to withdraw from liturgical ministries because of their inability to handle the steps. Churches built today would be required to have ramps and railings. Their presence is really a matter of safety for some. Thank you.

School Spotlight

On Tuesday Nov. 7th, Our Lady of Refuge students and staff celebrated vocations week with a "vocations day" of our own. Brother Brenton and Brother Igor came from St. Bonaventure Monastery in Detroit to share their vocation stories and tell us about life as Capuchin (Cap-Uh-Shin) Franciscan Brothers. Students learned that as Franciscans, everyone is known as "Brother", even if you are a priest like Brother Brenton. Our Capuchin Brothers taught us about discerning our own vocation in life and answered many questions posed by students and teachers. We discovered that the name of their religious order, Friars Minor, means "little brothers" in Italian and that humility and being among the people they serve is very important to them; they even look at animals and the world around us as their brothers and sisters - just like their founder St. Francis of Assisi did! Students were particularly interested to learn that in addition to praying and serving the poor, the Brothers love sports (baseball & football), have pet dogs named after St. Francis and St. Clare, and live in a house with twenty-four other brothers who range in age from their twenties to their eighties. Brother Brenton and Brother Igor promised to pray for the Our Lady of Refuge family; many Refuge family members will be praying for them, too.

I wanted use this week's article to remind and invite you to some events happening next summer, so you can pray about attending, plan, and prepare. The National Eucharistic Congress will be held from July 17-21 in Indianapolis, Indiana at the Lucas Oil Stadium. This event is the first Eucharistic Congress to be held in 83 years.

"The whole Congress will be an experience of prayer: a liturgical act offering the Catholic Church—those in attendance in Indianapolis as well as across the country—to the Father, through the Son, and in the Holy Spirit. This reconsecration will result in a massive outpouring of grace and renewed missionary sending as participants are moved to share the Eucharistic love of the Lord "for the life of the world" (John 6:51). This event will include approximately 80,000 Catholic faithful, nationally and globally renowned speakers such as Fr. Mike Schmitz, Chris Stefanick, and Sr. Miriam James Heidland. During the course of this event we will worship, celebrate mass, attend break-out sessions, and experience the beauty of Adoration on a level not seen since 1940. Another conference available next summer is the Power and Purpose Conference at Franciscan University of Steubenville. Being held the weekend of June 14-16, this conference includes praise and worship sessions and nationally respected speakers all while enjoying the beauty of the Ohio Valley near the West Virginia border (https://steubenvilleconferences.com/adult/)

Also, in June, Encounter Ministries will be hosting the Encounter Conference at the Glass City Center in Toledo, Oh. from June 26-28. What Remains

When my grandfather died, my parents, siblings, and I were left with the question: what's to become of the house?

Anyone who has inherited property knows that it's not simply a matter of assuming ownership of a plot of land upon which sits four walls and a roof. Those four walls and a roof usually contain memories and objects — an enormous volume of both, in the case of my grandfather. When they're left to you, you have to sift through them, the memories and the objects, and with each one you have to think: Is it worth it? Do I keep it? Will I need it?


And slowly, painfully, you disassemble the physical existence of the person who lived here. You accept, with a pang, that most of it must be given away or discarded. You cry when you bag up the clothes to take to Goodwill. You can't even bear to look when they break the piano into a hundred pieces and throw it in a dumpster, realizing that no one wants or has a use for something that was once so precious.

But when you come upon a rosary that was used so many times it has begun to fall apart, you don't even think twice before keeping it, and not because you need the rosary. You need what it means. You need what it reminds you of.

When all is said and done, each of us will be called before our master to settle accounts, just as my grandfather was.

"Where are the gifts I gave you? What remains of the fortune to which I entrusted you?" he will ask us. "What have you done with the peace? What have you done with the love? What have you done with the mercy?"
