



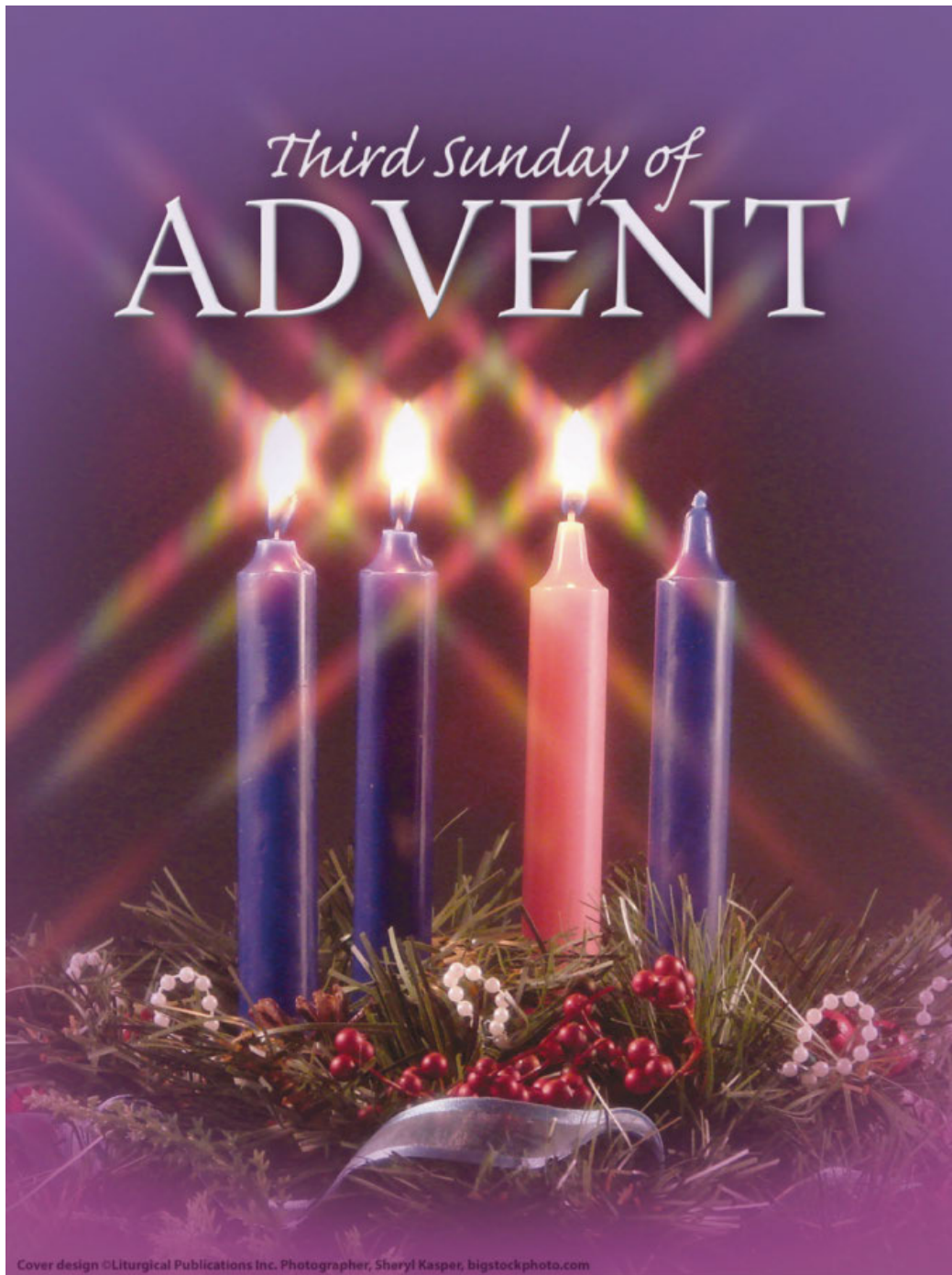

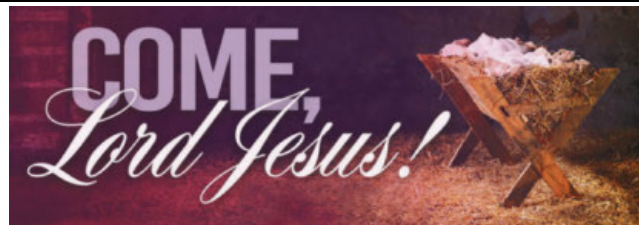

This is a quick note of thanks to everyone who helped with the First Reconciliation on December 4th. We had over 60 young people make their first confession with the help of the second grade teachers, Lydia Maroki and Marna Yelda, and the after-school catechist, Janet Boyk. Priests from St. Mary's, Prince of Peace, St. Benedict, and St. Thomas were present to confer the sacrament.

Happy Gaudete Sunday

As many of you know I enjoy having fun with my clothes and dressing liturgically regarding color and symbols. This weekend you will see me wear pink as this is “Gaudete Sunday” meaning rejoice and we light the pink, third candle, in our advent wreath.

There are a few other symbols that I wanted to share with you too. Many of you know that the dove is a symbol for the Holy Spirit. It was the dove that signaled to Noah that the flood was over and land was now visible. We also hear about the Holy Spirit descending on Jesus during his baptism in the form of a dove.

Another symbol that I was wearing on the First Sunday of Advent is the peacock. We actually have two peacocks on the door of our tabernacle. It was believed that the flesh of the peacock was incorruptible, even after it has died. This is of course true of our Lord Jesus Christ. His Bread from Heaven is incorruptible and His victory over death has brought all who believe eternal life. The feathers of the peacock are covered with what looks like eyes. These can represent for us the “Eyes of God” that are all knowing and can see all.

Another symbol that is in many of our churches is the Pelican. The pelican has been known to feed it’s young from her own breast. In the artwork work you will see the mother’s beak plucking it’s own flesh to feed her babies. Jesus provides us with His Body and Blood at every Mass.

God provides us so many ways for us to see Him in creation. May we “watch” and see the beauty and joy throughout this Advent and Christmas Seasons!

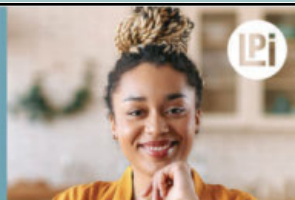

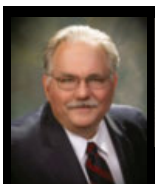

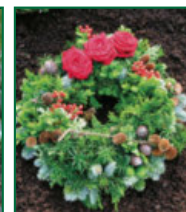
