
<u>Adoration</u> – Staff will work with new parish leadership to present more opportunities for Eucharistic Adoration at OLR.

Happy New Year!

I know it's already been nearly a whole week of 2024, but it's the first Sunday of the year so this is my first chance to put it in an article and I don't mind if it feels late. I'm still celebrating Christmas at least until January 8th, but down my street, I saw trees on the curb before New Year's Day. All that work for just a few days of lights and joy?

As we continue the Christmas season in the Church, we look forward to the Feast of Epiphany. Epiphany is a word meaning 'revelation' or 'uncovering' but in theology it is often used to mean 'manifest', 'to make known', or 'to make something happen'. It is celebrated in many different ways in the different cultures that make up the universal Church, but it always reminds us of the Three Kings, or Wise Men, or Magi, who come to the Child Jesus bringing their gifts.

This brings up two thoughts: what gifts do we bring to Jesus and how do we make him known? We can make a gift of our entire lives for Jesus, but this is not easy. We can, like so many athletes, give thanks to God for our abilities and make the things we are best at a gift for him. To steal an idea from a movie, winning is in our nature; we win for ourselves and use it as a sign of our love for God. We want to win anyway, whether we love God or not. It would be a very different sign of our love for God if we lose and make that our gift to God because we are doing something for him that we do not want to do. This is not a suggestion for anyone to lose on purpose, but simply to reconsider what we have and how we offer it. Players on the losing team rarely get interviewed, especially on the field right after the game, but would they still thank God for their talents and abilities if they were? None of us may be interviewed live on national TV anytime soon, but there are other, more simple, ways for us to make God known to those around us.

Finally, if you can, get some blessed chalk and mark the main door of your home. There is a text to use for the blessing on the USCCB.org website; search for "epiphany blessing". The letters and the year above the door help are a visible reminder that Jesus came to earth and lived among us. If we invite him into our lives by the way we live, we can symbolize this by inviting him into our houses.
