Mission Statement

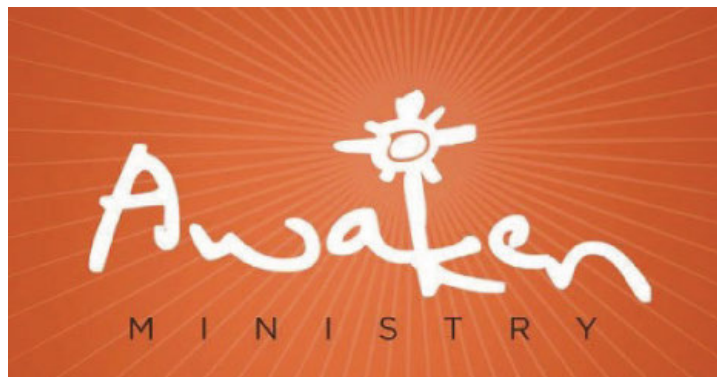

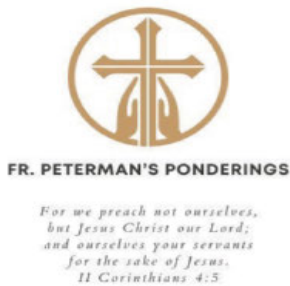

Believe it or not, we are already approaching the holy season of Lent: Ash Wednesday is this week! The famous abbot Dom Prosper Guéranger wrote this about Lent:

“The Forty Days’ Fast, which we call Lent, is the Church’s preparation for Easter, and was instituted at the very commencement of Christianity. Our Blessed Lord himself sanctioned it by his fasting forty days and forty nights in the desert; and though he would not impose it on the world by an express commandment, (which, then, could not have been open to the power of dispensation,) yet he showed plainly enough by his own example, that fasting, which God had so frequently ordered in the Old Law, was to be also practiced by the Children of the New.” Following in our Master’s footsteps, we too practice penance in this season so that we can be more spiritually prepared for Easter.

A note about fasting and abstinence. The Church asks that all Catholics, excluding those who are children, elderly, or pregnant, to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means that you are allowed one normal meal and two snacks. I would encourage you, however, to challenge yourself by eating less than that on these two days. On the Fridays of Lent, and indeed on all Fridays of the year, we are called to practice abstinence. This means that you are to avoid eating meat. It is also customary to give up something else during Lent. Fasting and abstinence are great practices to help us overcome our sins and refocus our lives on Christ.

A note about the liturgies in our Family of Parishes this Ash Wednesday. On Ash Wednesday, here at Refuge we will have Mass at 8:15am (with the school) and 7:00pm. Also, at 12:30pm we will have a Liturgy of the Word service. Ashes will be distributed at all three of these liturgies, and **ONLY** at these liturgies. The use of blessed ashes is a liturgical act and therefore the Church requires that people receive ashes as a sign of their inner conversion during a Mass or a celebration of the Word of God.

The nearby parishes will also have opportunities to receive blessed ashes and prayerfully begin this beautiful season. Below is a schedule for Ash Wednesday for our Family of Parishes:

Our Lady of Refuge: 8:15am Mass (school Mass), 12:30 Word Service, 7:00pm Mass

Our Lady of Sorrows: 7:30am Mass, 12noon Word Service, 5:30pm Word Service, 7:00pm Mass

Prince of Peace: 8:30am Mass, 7:00pm Mass

St. Fabian: 8:30am Mass, 12:15pm Mass, 7:00pm Mass

St. Andrew Kim: 7:30pm Mass (Korean)

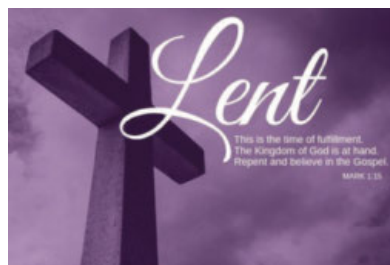

Hello everyone! I have a lot I want to share and my page is a little crowded, so bear with me!

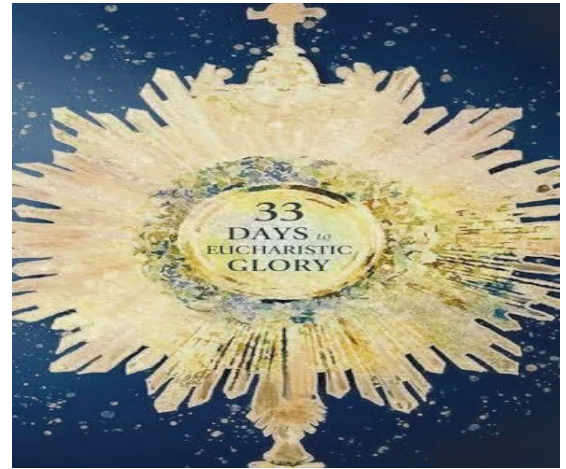

Music and life are both dynamic. There are loud (forte) and soft (piano) passages. Sometimes music is busy with a lot of counterpoint and sometimes it is sparse with a lot of space. As we finish this brief stint of Ordinary Time we stand on the cusp of Lent, which begins this week with Ash Wednesday.

The liturgical music of Lent has more space and quiet - more moments of silence. After the final song, the organ will not be opening up a blast of jubilation. The Gloria is omitted. This parallels our Lenten journey. Lent is a reflective, penitential, period of looking inward and asking for God's mercy and healing. It also sets up a contrast for the glad shouts of Easter alleluias. Easter and Lent balance each other and set a point of contrast in our spiritual lives.

This week's Psalm is a foreshadow to Lent: I turn to you, Lord, in time of trouble, and you fill me with the joy of salvation. (Psalm 32:1-2, 5, 11). Verse two could almost summarize a Lenten journey.

**Then I acknowledged my sin to you,
my guilt I covered not.
I said, "I confess my faults to the LORD,"
and you took away the guilt of my sin.**

How can we enter into the silence, meditation, contemplation and spiritual renewal of Lent?

Order of Christian Initiation for Adults - Rite of Election

Thank you for your prayers and please continue as our Catechumen and Candidates journey forward toward their reception into the Catholic faith. The Rite of Election is a solemn rite where our entire diocese sends their Catechumens, the unbaptized and Candidates, those who are being presented to the Bishop to receive the sacraments of the Eucharist and Confirmation, to the Blessed Sacrament Cathedral in Detroit.

Here they will gather before a Bishop and then begin the Period of Purification and Enlightenment. The Catechumen's names will be announced by their parish representative, for us Tony Kreucher, before all those assembled. They will then step forward to write their names on the pages of the Book of the Elect. This book is then placed by the Tabernacle throughout the Lenten Season to remind us all to pray for them.

The Bishop will then bestow a blessing on them. The Candidates will also be announced by their parish representative. At this time, they stand where they are seated in the pews and receive their blessing.

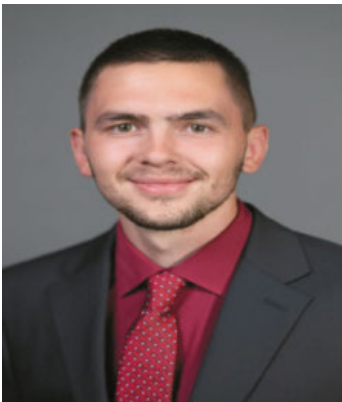

This is part 3 of an ongoing series on the Eucharist, based on the guidelines from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. These guidelines can be found on USCCB.org under Prayer and Worship - The Mass.

8. Christ is "truly, really, and substantially contained" in Holy Communion. His presence is not momentary nor simply signified, but wholly and permanently real under each of the consecrated species of bread and wine.

9. The Council of Trent teaches that "the true body and blood of our Lord, together with his soul and divinity, exist under the species of bread and wine. His body exists under the species of bread and his blood under the species of wine, according to the import of his words."

10. The Church also teaches and believes that "immediately after the consecration the true body of our Lord and his true blood exist along with his soul and divinity under the form of bread and wine. The body is present under the form of bread and the blood under the form of wine, by virtue of the words [of Christ]. The same body, however, is under the form of wine and the blood under the form of bread, and the soul under either form..."

This is perhaps the most difficult part of the Church's teaching on the Eucharist to understand and accept, which is likely why it is the part with the fullest explanation, detail, and repetition. Once the priest at the altar speaks the words of Christ at the Last Supper, the bread and wine no longer exist - they are completely transformed into the most holy body and blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ in every real way besides appearance. Even though the elements of Communion still look and taste like bread and wine, they are not bread and wine any longer. You may have heard the word *transubstantiation*, which means "the substance is changed"; this is the Church's official term for what happens on the altar. In a certain way, we witness a miracle every time we attend Mass: the miracle of transubstantiation. You may also be aware of some of the many Eucharistic miracles which have changed both the substance and the appearance of bread and wine into flesh and blood.

Since it is truly Jesus on the altar and in the tabernacle, we ought to act in a proper way in response. We genuflect toward the tabernacle, we bow before receiving Communion and at the elevations, we say "Amen" - which means "I believe" - in response to the minister saying, "the body of Christ", etc. It is why ministers are trained on what to do if a host falls on the floor or if a person does not promptly consume the host. It is also why Communion was received on the tongue in the past: not because our hands are dirty, but out of reverence for what the host has become. Similarly, because Jesus is fully present in every part or crumb, it is prudent to inspect our hands after receiving Communion, just as the priest carefully cleans the sacred containers which have held what used to be bread and wine.

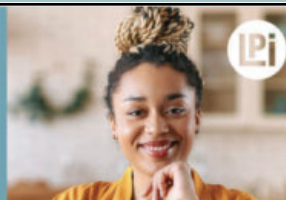
