Mission Statement

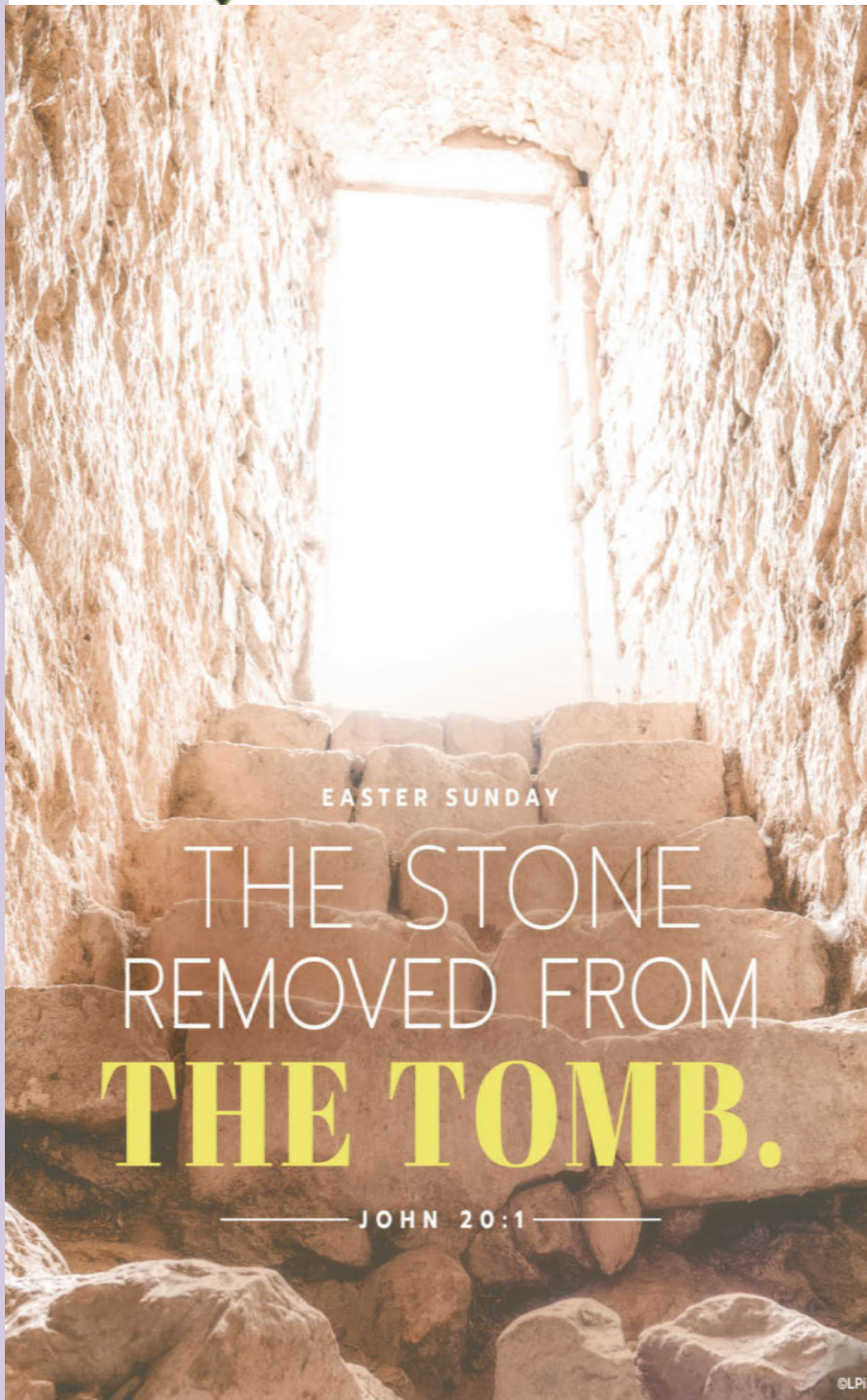

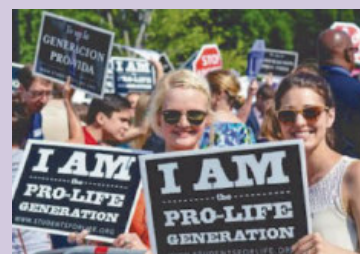

For the past few weeks of Lent, and as I write this, I have found myself thinking about St. Peter. What was it like for him to look into the eyes of Jesus and hear “And I also say to you that you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build My church; and the gates of Hades will not overpower it”? (Matthew 16:18)

What was it like to experience the Wedding at Cana? To see his nets overfilled and on the verge of breaking, to see first hand lepers made clean, the paralyzed told to get up and walk, to witness the withered hand be healed on the Sabbath, to see the storm calmed on the sea, and not only see Jesus walk on water, but momentarily join him on the waves! What was it like to see the multitudes fed from scraps or to hear Jesus say “Lazarus, come out!” and then see Lazarus walk from his grave? Truly hard to imagine.

After all he had seen, heard, and witnessed, what was it like to deny Jesus three times? Once the rooster crowed, I can’t imagine the surge of pain and emotion that filled St. Peter as he looked across the courtyard only to meet the loving gaze of Jesus? Yes, the *loving* gaze of Jesus. In Luke’s Gospel (22:16), the Greek word that was used for “looked upon” was *Emblepō*, which means “to look with love; to look to someone’s heart”. As He was willingly led to His Passion, our Savior looked with loving compassion to His friend who had just abandoned Him. That’s our Savior.

We know the story ends with Glory! Unlike Judas, Peter seeks and trusts Christ’s mercy for his failings and in John Chapter 21 affirms three times his love for Jesus. Imagine a scenario where Judas had the same trust in Christ’s love and mercy and repented to Jesus, there may have been a St. Judas the Repentant Catholic Church somewhere. So today, let’s look to St. Peter’s example. When we “deny” Jesus in our lives, when we sin and struggle, let us move toward our Savior Jesus, not away! Seek the freedom that is available in the confessional and accept Christ’s loving gaze. Happy Easter and God Bless!

FRIDAY, JULY 5 10:30 AM – 10:30 PM**

Be part of the Eucharistic Revival by joining us for a Eucharistic Pilgrimage. The Eucharist is traveling from all 4 directions of the United States where 80,000+ Catholics will be gathering from July 17-24. The route closest to us is called the Marian Route traveling from Wisconsin to Indianapolis. This route takes the Eucharist through Notre Dame on July 5th. We will take a bus from St. Fabian to St. Therese of the Little Flower in South Bend. We are making a day trip to South Bend, Indiana where we will:

- 3:00 PM Hear Testimony by Mia Tiwana with Praise and Worship music at St. Therese of the Little Flower while waiting for the Eucharistic Jesus to arrive with the Marian Route Team
- 3:30 PM Experience Adoration then join in the procession to the Basilica of the Sacred Heart, Notre Dame University (approximately a 1.7-mile walk) If you cannot walk, the bus will be available to take you to the Basilica.
- 5:15 PM Mass
- 6:00 PM heading home with a stop for dinner on the way.

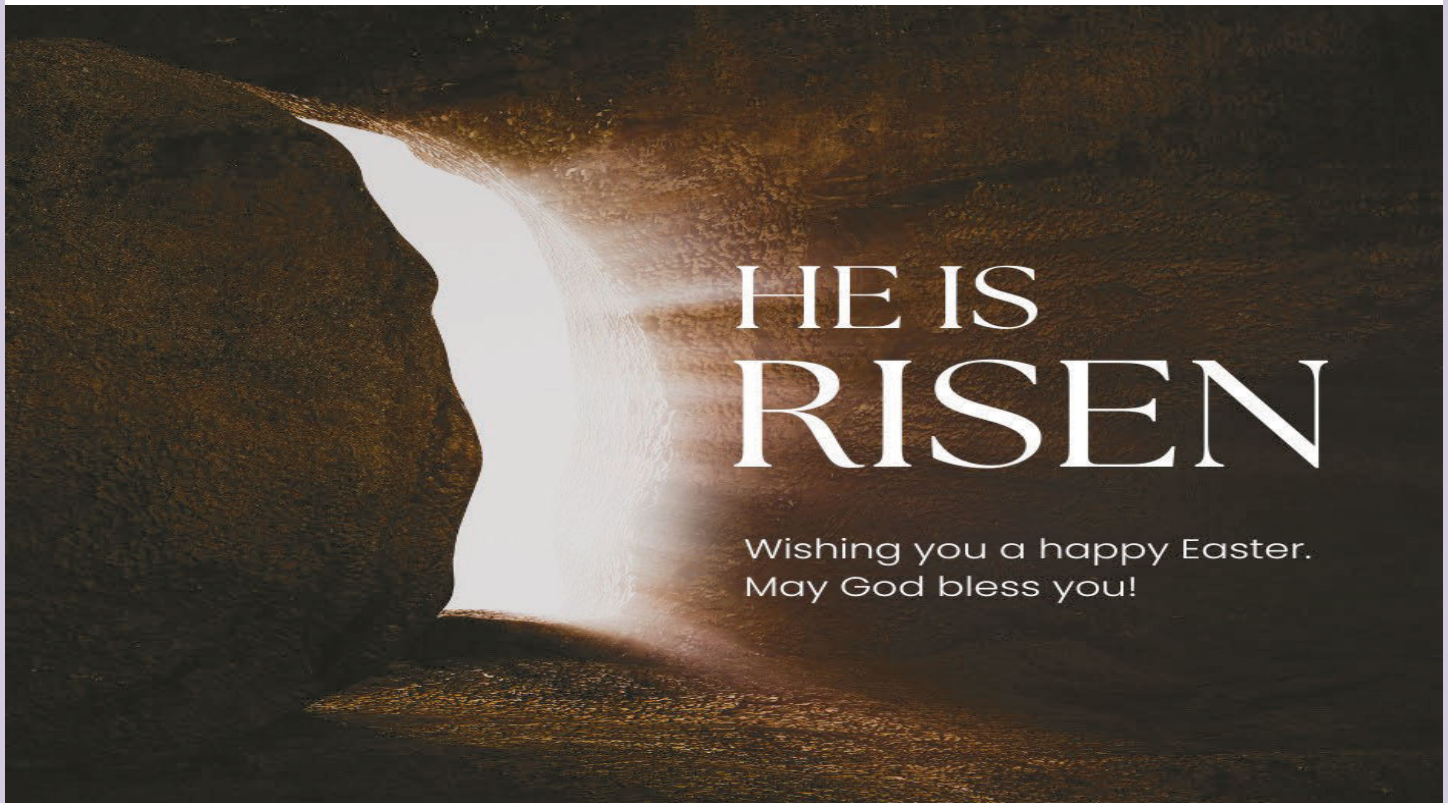

Christus surrexit! – Surrexit vere, alleluia!
Christ is risen! He is risen indeed. Alleluia!

We can, of course, wish each other a Happy Easter but this ancient Christian greeting explains why our fast is over and what is the cause of our joy; why we can say, "Alleluia!" again. There's something extraordinary about the Easter Vigil mass starting in the dark and seeing the lights come on when the alleluia is sung for the first time since before Ash Wednesday.

It's a dramatic, yet simple, way to make plain for us the resurrection of Christ. We are with him in the tomb, in darkness, and when he exits the tomb, risen from the dead, light enters the world again. We rejoice and sing alleluia. One of the most famous alleluia songs, the Alleluia (or Hallelujah) Chorus from Handel's Messiah, is often heard now at Christmas, but it is from the Passion/Easter section of the oratorio. It is the finale of the second part, yet it does not refer to Jesus' resurrection but serves to connect the spreading of the Gospel by the Apostles to the resurrection of all believers at Jesus' second coming. Do not forget that his resurrection means that eventually we will all be resurrected with him.

We are an Easter People and Alleluia is our song!

Easter itself is a whole week on the Church calendar. This kind of celebration is called an octave, eight days from Easter Sunday until the following Sunday, now called Divine Mercy Sunday. The Easter Season continues after this octave of Easter until Pentecost. Similarly, Christmas is celebrated with an octave and an extended season. This shows the great nature of these two feasts in the Church and their importance to our belief is reflected in our worship. Another change to note during the Easter Season is that the Angelus prayer, which tells of the Annunciation to the Virgin Mary, is replaced by the Regina Caeli, or Queen of Heaven, which tells of Jesus' resurrection.

One final change in our liturgical calendar this year is that the Feast of the Annunciation is celebrated on April 8. Normally celebrated on March 25, nine months before Christmas (think about it and you'll get there), the Monday of Holy Week actually takes precedence over the Annunciation and so our commemoration of the message of the angel Gabriel to Mary and her affirmative response must be moved until after the octave of Easter has ended.

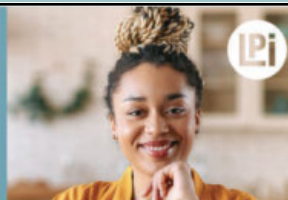

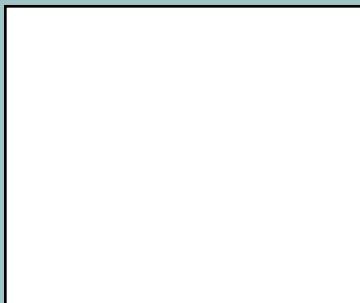
