

Happy Easter, again, and a blessed Divine Mercy Sunday to you!

I am so thankful for all of the help with the liturgies for Holy Week. And it was great to see so many of you all there in attendance. As my first Holy Week being the only priest presiding at all of the liturgies, it was great to have so many from our parish community to pray these holy days with.

The school was off this past week, so it was a good time for me and many other priests to catch up on things we put off during Holy Week. Slowly but surely, I will get back in the rhythm of things. But that does make me think how good it was to slow down during Holy Week. Sure, doing so meant I now have more to catch up on. However, taking the time to slow down, think, pray, reflect on the Lord, or even just not use one's favorite distraction is always worth it. That was one of the many graces of the Triduum for me. Emails waited, worry about the parish was put off, and I was forced to just be—and to be with the Lord. How often do you take the time to do that? This quote may be an exaggeration, but I don't think it is too far off. Perhaps it will be an encouragement for you. It is by the brilliant Blaise Pascal: "All of humanity's problems stem from man's inability to sit quietly in a room alone."

On Saturday, April 13, the Archdiocese of Detroit will be ordaining two men as deacons. This is a big deal since at diaconate ordination, a man first makes his promises. These men will then, God willing, be ordained priests within the next year. Please keep Ben Schoder and Pat Bruen in your prayers, especially as they prepare to profess their lives to the Church as deacons this Saturday.

We are now through the season of Lent, which means it is time to turn our focus to more joyful things. As the final blessing for this Easter season reminds us: "Now that the days of the Lord's Passion have drawn to a close, may you who celebrate the gladness of the Paschal Feast come with Christ's help, and exulting in spirit, to those feats that are celebrated in eternal joy." Reflect

Each year, on the Second Sunday of Easter, the Church celebrates the Sunday of Divine Mercy. In the 1930s, Jesus appeared to a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska. As Jesus continued to appear to St. Faustina, she recorded His messages in her Diary. On one such occasion, Jesus said to St. Faustina, "My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners" (Diary, no. 699).

When recalling our sins, we may feel discouraged or fearful of approaching God; however, we can cling to the truth that Christ's Passion on the Cross did not end in death, but in the joy of the Resurrection. The miracle of Easter gives us the courage to face our sins, confess our mistakes, and then humbly receive God's forgiveness and accept the joy that comes with new life in Christ. In his infinite love for us, God desires nothing more than to wash away our sins and offer us his mercy. He has a prepared place in his merciful heart for each of us, and no sin is bigger than his power to forgive.

No matter how we have fallen, the Resurrection of Christ is an assurance of hope. Christ's mercy is constantly available to us, if only we reach out to him in faith and confidence through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The words Christ revealed to St. Faustina, he also speaks to us: "Lay your head on my shoulder, rest and regain your strength. I am always with you" (Diary, no. 498).

Act (Choose one.)

- · Pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy at 3:00 pm (the Hour of Mercy) for the intention of healing for all suffering from involvement in abortion.
- Jesus spoke to St. Faustina, "Reveal all the wounds of your heart. I will heal them" (Diary, no. 1487). Seek Christ in the Sacrament of Reconciliation and allow His healing mercy to reach every hurt and hidden pain.
- · Offer some other sacrifice or prayer that you feel called to do for this month's

It was our annual tootsie roll fund raiser held at the Kroger at Union Lake and Commerce roads. We are fortunate to have this opportunity given the volume of charitable people that shop there and thankful for the permission of Kroger's management.

Our leader, Carl Godell, organizes the event, takes on shifts, and processes all the incoming funds. Carl was slowed down this year due to a medical procedure but not by much. Our secret weapon, Tom Durkee, covered all shifts (3 days from 9 am to 5pm) and does the heavy lifting of this operation. Dan Schneble and Bob Harper are the meat and potatoes of the operation putting in time at multiple shifts.

Other multiple shift offenders were Jim Recker and Greg Harris. To round out the team were Jackson Harris and newly minted Knight Vince Barrett (not just a St. VDPer!). The founder of the Knight's of Columbus, Fr. McGivney, originally set up the organization to assist widows and children. We met a man whose family benefitted from the KofC when his father passed as a young boy.

He was very happy for our service and contributed to our drive. Over the years the scope of charitable causes has expanded greatly. We were able to raise over \$3900 over the three-day period. A special thank you to the Our Lady of Refuge parishioners who stopped by to support our drive.

I have so many things to say!

Happy Easter! Christus surréxit! – Surréxit vere, allelúia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed. Alleluia! Although Easter Sunday was March 31st, we are still celebrating the Easter season until May 19th, the Feast of Pentecost. So keep eating your jellybeans and chocolate rabbits! Keep greeting each other with Easter joy. This is also a gentle reminder that Catholics are required to receive communion once a year during the Easter season; please go to confession before you receive communion, even if you do not think your sins are so terrible. Receiving communion is a different experience when you've recently been to confession because your soul - and hopefully your will - is more closely aligned with Jesus.

Today is also Divine Mercy Sunday, a fairly recent addition to the Church's calendar. The Feast of Divine Mercy was first celebrated on April 30, 2000; the same day that St. Faustina was canonized. Born in 1905 and died in 1938, St. Faustina was the one who received the vision that is the basis for the popular image and prayers. She recorded many of her visions and conversations with Jesus in her diary, which inspired the devotion to Divine Mercy, the image, and the Chaplet of Divine Mercy.

Tomorrow is when the Church celebrates the Feast of the Annunciation this year. Normally, it is on March 25, but since that date was during Holy Week, the celebration of the Annunciation was moved. On this feast, the Church remembers the message of the angel Gabriel to Mary that she has "found favor with God. And now, [she] will conceive in [her] womb and bear a son, and [she] will name him Jesus." Perhaps more importantly, Mary agreed to what the angel told her would happen, "let it be with me according to your word." If only we could all be as willing as Mary was to follow the will of God! If you've heard people mention Mary's fiat, this response to Gabriel is what they meant. It comes from the Latin version of the bible, fiat mihi secundum verbum tuum.

Our parish Confirmation candidates will receive the sacrament from Bishop Monforton at 4pm on April 20 at Prince of Peace Catholic Church, along with candidates from Prince of Peace and St. Benedict, our original Family of Parishes.

First Communion masses will be celebrated on May 4 at 10am for the OLR school children and at 1pm for the parish children who do not attend the school.

Finally, so soon after I decided to end a series of articles on the US bishop's guidelines for reception of the Eucharist, our Archbishop republished a reflection on the precious blood of Jesus that he first wrote while serving in California. You can find it on detroitcatholic.com in the Voices section. It's called A gift of Inestimable Worth: a Reflection on the Precious Blood.


