

FR. PETERMAN'S PONDERINGS

One of the more beautiful, but often hidden, aspects of the priesthood is ministering to people who are sick and dying. My job is to help get people to heaven. And I get to be there when someone is about to meet the Lord to offer them the grace of the sacraments. Since this part of our faith is not usually seen or talked about, I want to share just a few points about what are usually called the **Last Rites**.

The Last Rites is an umbrella term that includes all those sacraments and prayers that can be offered for those who are seriously ill. These rites include: Confession, Holy Communion or Viaticum, Anointing of the Sick, the Apostolic Pardon, and the Commendation of the Soul.

Viaticum is a word that means "food for the journey," and is used to describe the last time a person receives Holy Communion. There are some beautiful prayers that go along with this rite in which we pray that the Body of Christ would guide the person into eternal life.

The Anointing of the Sick is also called the Sacrament of the Sick or Extreme Unction. In Mark chapter 6 we have a record of Jesus giving the apostles this sacrament; and in James chapter 5 the apostle describes its effects. It gives sanctifying grace, comfort and strength in suffering, forgives sins, and can even heal the body if God wills it. Although usually meant to aid the soul of a person preparing to die, the Church also teaches that "the faithful whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age receive this sacrament" (Pastoral Care of the Sick). In addition, "a sick person may be anointed before surgery whenever a serious illness is the reason" (PCS). A person cannot be anointed twice, unless the illness gets seriously worse or they recover and get sick again. It is important to not wait too long before having your loved one anointed, because it is better for them if they can pray along with the rites.

The Apostolic Pardon is a blessing given only once when a person is soon going to meet the Lord. This indulgence promises that the person who receives it with faith is freed from all punishment due to sins. Though not a replacement for confession, it is a powerful prayer!

The Commendation of the Soul are various prayers said by the priest and family to offer a person's soul to God. They are comforting prayers of trust in the goodness of our loving Father and in the prayers of the saints.

On another note, I apologize that Our Lady of Refuge was not able to offer a live-streamed Mass on Sunday, April 7. There were some issues with our sound system. It looks like those problems have been addressed and we are back in business! Thank you for your understanding. God bless you!

Project Rachel

Project Rachel is the Church's ministry which operates as a network of professional clergy, licensed counselors and volunteers trained to provide one-on-one spiritual and psychological support for individuals suffering from the trauma of abortion.

"It's normal to grieve a pregnancy loss, including the loss of a child by abortion. It can form a hole in one's heart, a hole so deep that sometimes it seems nothing can fill the emptiness. You are not alone..." — US Bishops' Project Rachel Ministry

"For many people, abortion is the most traumatic experience in their lives. Dealing with the aftermath of an abortion can be one of the most difficult journeys a person will make. You do not have to walk this journey alone.

"Both before and after an abortion, feelings of panic, fear, anxiety, guilt, remorse and pressure are common not only for the woman who underwent the abortion, but also for the father of the unborn child, the grandparents, close friends, and even medical personnel.

"The pain and loss of abortion are often intensified by a sense of alienation from God and the Church.

"If you find yourself in such a place, we want you to know that the Catholic Church cares deeply and wants to be there for you. We extend to you the loving embrace, mercy and compassion of the Good Shepherd Jesus Christ. The Church welcomes you home with unconditional love and the forgiveness of God who loves you with an everlasting love. "Welcome Home!" — Archbishop Allen H. Vigneron

Happy Easter! Christ is risen, alleluia! He is risen indeed. Alleluia!

Although Easter Sunday was March 31st, we are still celebrating the Easter season until May 19th, the Feast of Pentecost. Is there still Easter candy in your house? Are the baskets still out? Keep greeting each other with Easter joy.

This is also a gentle reminder that Catholics are required to receive communion once a year during the Easter season. Please go to confession before you receive communion. Receiving communion is a different experience when you've recently been to confession.

Our parish Confirmation candidates will receive the sacrament from Bishop Monforton at 4pm on April 20 at Prince of Peace Catholic Church, along with candidates from Prince of Peace and St. Benedict, our original Family of Parishes. First Communion masses will be celebrated on May 4 at 10am for the OLR school children and at 1pm for the parish children who do not attend the school.

Our own Archbishop Vigneron recently published a pastoral letter, The Good News About God's Plan, offering guidance for schools and parishes and still more recently, Pope Francis through the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith issued a declaration, Dignitas Infinita, on human dignity. Both documents are directed towards current issues in our world, but which are perhaps more apparent in the culture of Western or "developed" countries. Perhaps inconveniently, between these two documents, the White House also offered an announcement that coincided with Easter Sunday.

The dialogue surrounding the issues of these three occurrences seems to change daily, with new studies being published and new occurrences of injustice sparking debate and even leading to legislation or judicial review. There is a worthwhile goodness in the Church being slow to react to the changes in culture when compared to the speed of the secular world and certainly to the news cycle. Still, some issues require a response, even if only to reaffirm the Church's teaching on the dignity of all human people.

The Church should not become merely reactive, giving response to every day's new outrage; the Church is not so short-sighted. It must keep its focus on the truth of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection more than 2000 years ago and at the same time look toward his future return, which we cannot know when this will happen. As a high school teacher, I would joke with my students when talking about the Second Coming, "If you really don't want it to happen tomorrow, predict that it will; since the Bible says, no one knows the day or the hour". As Catholics, we live in the tension between the past and the future, the already and the not yet. Fr. John Riccardo describes this as being in World War 2, between D -Day and V-E Day. We can see the way the war is going - perhaps inevitably going - but we also know it is not over. The Church, especially its officials, need to live in this tension and balance the past and the future against the desire for instant gratification and the attention seeking behavior of modern culture.
