Hello everyone! This week I have a few calendar-related notes to share with you.

The month of May is dedicated the Blessed Virgin Mary. It used to be that the feast of the Queenship of Mary was celebrated in May. When Pope Pius XII established this feast, he wrote, "Let all Christians, therefore, glory in being subjects of the Virgin Mother of God, who, while wielding royal power, is on fire with a mother's love." (*Ad Caeli Reginam*, 43) *Although this feast was later moved to August, we still honor Mary as our queen in the month of May by crowning statues of her. The children in our school celebrated a May Crowning on May 1st, crowning the statue outside the school nearby Commerce Road. We will also have a statue crowned in the sanctuary of the church throughout this month. Let us all continue to subject ourselves to Mary's powerful intercession by praying the rosary every day, especially during the month of May!*

On Sunday, May 19, our parish will be hosting a volunteer fair in the social hall. Please consider sharing your gifts with our parish by helping in some area of ministry. After the Sunday Masses on the 19th, come by to check out what opportunities we have to get involved!

On the weekend of June 1st and 2nd, the Church celebrates the great Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, or Corpus Christi. To celebrate this feast, we will be doing a Eucharistic procession. I am PUMPED for this! The 9:30 am Mass on Sunday, June 2 will be concluded with a procession with our Eucharistic Lord.

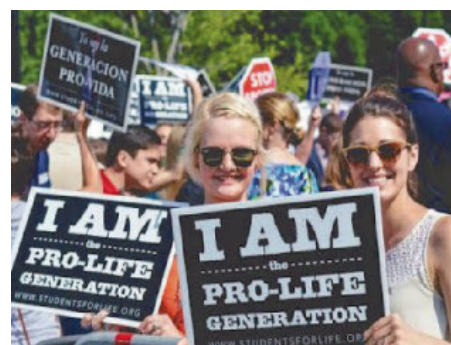
Join us for a monthly gathering the first Tuesday of each month in the parish office @ 6:30 p.m.

This weekend we sing Psalm 98, which is best known for the phrase, ***Sing a new song to the Lord.*** *Forty years ago, as a young composer I remember thinking, “Yes, let’s sing a **new** song instead of these old songs.” Now that many of my songs are forty years old, I have reconsidered the definition of **new** song. Maybe it’s singer of the song that is renewed and not the song itself. The breath of the Lord gives us life and we are renewed with each breath we take. So each time we sing a song to the Lord, we are renewed by using the Holy Spirit’s life-giving breath to sing praise to God. Forty years later, that’s my **new story** and I’m sticking to it.*

This is also a foreshadowing of the approaching Pentecost Psalm (*Lord send out your spirit and renew the face of the earth*), which also references the life-giving breath of the Holy Spirit.

Another favorite line of this Psalm that hits home for me these days:
*He has remembered his kindness and his faithfulness
 toward the house of Israel.*

It is not any less important than the first time, every time we receive Communion; even once we get old enough that we've lost count. I'm reminded of another story I heard, in a slightly different context, about a little boy who asked about Jesus coming to live in him. Yes, let it be our hope that we would have Jesus sticking out all over.
