



Touching the Cloak of Christ

Look to today's Gospel and you'll find one of the most arresting images in all of Scripture. Christ in a crowd, everyone clamoring for his attention, pressing against him. Several feet away, is a chronically ill woman, weak and desperate for help. She knows she doesn't have a chance of getting his attention. She has no connections. She has no strength. All she can do is lift up her hand.

So that's what she does. She reaches out.

There comes a time, or maybe several times, in each of our lives when we become this woman. We're tired and we're sick. Is it with sin? With fear? With anger? It doesn't matter. Whatever it is, it's made us weak, and we feel like we've run out of options. We've looked for help and come up empty. We've consulted friends and gotten nowhere. We're lost in the crowd of life, unable to stick our heads above the pressing throng to wave for help.

And there is Christ, always passing by us. The hem of his cloak is never far from our grasp. We have no hope of a big miracle like the synagogue leader. We don't even bother asking for that. But that cloak ... we can touch that cloak. That's something we can do.

Do we do it, though? Do we have the confidence of that sick, beaten-down woman who knew so totally that healing was there for the taking? Or do we retreat back into the crowd, stumbling back home with our pain and our sinfulness? Reach out, friends. However, whatever, whenever — reach out. Christ will not fail you.



Experience is often the best teacher. The more we can experience God's love for us, the more we can return his love by acting in obedience to his will and his plan for our lives which is both better than our own plans and more powerful than we have the ability to alter.

This is a good thing, that we are not strong enough to ruin God's plan for our life.

The numbering and division of the commandments can differ. This is widely known as the fourth commandment, but is fifth in this list.

Honor your father and your mother, so that your days may be long in the land that the LORD your God is giving you.

So far, all the commandments have been about our relationship with God. This is the first commandment about our relationship with other people and it is followed by a promise: that your days may be long in the land the LORD your God is giving you. The first commandment also contained a promise: that the LORD will show steadfast love to those who love him and keep his commandments. No other commandments contain a promise of a reward.

While the commandments are straightforward and clear in their meaning, they are not ironclad nor legalistically specific. There is no description of how to honor your parents, no list of which words or actions would fulfill this obligation and which would break it. Of course, honoring a parent looks different when the child is 5 and when the child is 15, or 50.

Additionally, this commandment can be difficult to put into practice because it is stated only in one direction. There is no commandment for parents and how they should act toward their children. What can a person do to honor their parents if their parents are distant, demanding, absent, or worse? Should parents who act in such ways even be honored or does the commandment no longer apply to them?

Many times, it is the case that parents begin to return to their faith as young adults after the baptism of their first child. Whatever the reason, children can in this sense lead their family. While it is less common as the children get older, it should still be possible. The good example of a child continuing to honor his or her parents even through their imperfections is a powerful witness. Just as any Christian may draw others to faith by causing them to ask. "Why do you do that?" a child's actions may cause the parents to stop and ask, "Why is my child acting this way?" It is a sort of inversion of the dynamic between St. Monica and St. Augustine. St. Monica prayed for years and years, that her son would have a conversion and become Catholic; eventually, he did and he was later made a bishop. So, children, through years of prayer and action honoring their parents, can bring their parents to conversion.

Our modern culture doesn't talk much about honor at all, and certainly not about 'bringing honor to the family' or 'to our name', but in other times and places, the honor of one's family was very important. The attitudes and actions of children were a reflection on the parents, who would be judged because they are the ones who raised and taught the children. To honor one's parents might be explained as: to improve someone else's opinion of them by having met you.
