## FATHER SURESH

From Fr. Suresh SAC

***"We can do everything with the help of Him who strengthens us."***

Dear Friends in Christ:

As your newly appointed Parish Priest, I would like to introduce myself to all of you. I am Fr. Suresh Rajaian, SAC, and I belong to the religious congregation of the SOCIETY OF THE CATHOLIC APOSTOLATE (also known as SAC or the Pallottine Fathers and Brothers) and a member of the Our Lady of Good Health Province, Tamil Nadu, India. I am the eldest of three children of devoted Catholic parents; my father is deceased, but my mother is well and very active in her local Church community. My two brothers are engineers and are both married with children; one is employed in the Middle East and the other manages and owns his own business in India. In my free time, I particularly enjoy playing euchre, tennis, pickleball, badminton and golf.

Last month, I started my Silver Jubilee, the 25th anniversary of my ordination to the sacred priesthood. My years as a priest have been a very rewarding and enriching experience, especially as I have had the opportunity and privilege to fulfil my priestly calling in different places and culture with people of different nationalities. Throughout my priestly life and ministry, I have held dearly to the words of St. Paul to the Philippians: "I can do everything through Christ who strengthens me." (Phil. 4:13), and the words of the founder of my religious order, St. Vincent Pallotti, "God always and in everything".

I have served in various capacities in India, the Cayman Islands and in the USA. These include as Pastor, Associate Pastor, Director and Rector of a Seminary, Local Rector, School Principal, Vicar Forane, and Moderator. Since 2009, I have been assigned to serve at several parish communities in the Archdiocese of Detroit with the concurrence of my Provincial Rectors. My first assignment was at St. John the Evangelist church until 2011, and St. Valentine Redford until 2013, after which I was appointed as Pastor and School Principal of the missio sui iuris of St. Ignatius Parish in the Cayman Islands. More recently I have served as Vicar Forane, Moderator and a member priest in solidum that form the Central Down River families of parishes with the primary responsibility at St. Pius X Parish Community in Southgate and currently as a consultor of the Archdiocese of Detroit's College of Consultors.

I now look forward to the new assignment as Moderator and a member priest in solidum that form the South Oakland Vicariate Family 7 with the primary responsibility for Our Lady of Refuge Parish Community at Orchard Lake, a faith-filled community dedicated to the propagation of the faith, rooted in the Sacraments, Sacred Scriptures, and traditions of the Catholic Church. Working together to build on the foundations laid by my predecessors, I believe that we can accomplish much towards building the Kingdom of God, not only within our parish/school but also within the community at large, all for the glory of God.

I sincerely appreciate the warm welcome I have received, and I look forward to meeting you all at one of our Masses, liturgies, or parish events.

## July 7, 2024 14<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

Recently I watched a bunch of YouTube videos on how to optimize willpower in the face of weakness. The message was: do not accept your weakness. Crush it. Dominate it. In one video, however, at the end of a rant by a willpower coach, the muscular stoic admitted, "You'll never actually get what you want, no matter how hard you try." Amazingly, he admitted that willpower alone is not sufficient for us weak-willed humans.

What does God want us to do with our weaknesses, if crushing them with willpower won't work? For example, what should I do with my tendency to arrogance and self-isolation? Or my procrastination? Or my intellectual and physical limitations? Or my selfishness?

The counter-intuitive answer is clear in this week's words from St Paul, "**I will rather boast most gladly of my weaknesses in order that the power of Christ may dwell in me** (2 Cor. 12:9)." Boast of our weaknesses? Paul isn't promoting weak-mindedness or laziness. Rather, he perceives that Jesus loves us not despite our weaknesses but because of them. Boasting of our weakness means claiming human will is not all we have. It means turning to God whenever we feel weak, which—let's face it—is almost all the time. When we do, we learn to love our weaknesses, because it's there that we meet the strength of Christ. This week, I challenge us to find ways to boast not in willpower but in weakness.

## Experienced a Miracle?

In our world today, the news is often very negative and can be untrue. It can be difficult to know who we can trust and believe.

In our Gospel this weekend Mark shares with us two very well-known miracles. We have the woman with hemorrhages and the raising of Jairus' daughter. These miracles are true and our belief and faith in Jesus allows us to see and witness the continuation of miracles today. What miracles have you experienced?

I would like to share a miracle that occurred in my life. I was available at St. Joe's Hospital as a chaplain for late night prayer emergencies. I received a call regarding a disturbance in the CCU. The husband of a patient was so afraid of losing his wife that he was not helping with her care. When I stepped through the door I recognized the patient immediately. One of our own parishioners. I stepped over to him and let him know that I knew the love of his life well and that we pray together. I then invited him to pray with me for her. In that prayer he made a promise to God that if God were to give him more time with her that he would return to the Church. God answered his prayer.

While visiting them in their home as I was going weekly with the Eucharist, they shared that she would be able to return to Mass. It was at this point that I reminded him of the promise that he had made with God. We planned to meet that Saturday afternoon for Reconciliation so he would be ready for the Sunday Mass. That Sunday they both arrived. They continued to sit in the same pew for the next four years. He continued after her passing with gratitude for those precious years with her. What he was not aware of until that Sunday was the prayer she had shared with me prior to her heart surgery the day before we met. Her prayer to God was for him to return to the Church and attend Mass with her.

I am going to place a binder on the podium by our processional cross in the gathering space. Please feel free to share your miracles there. Miracles are happening every day! Thank you, Jesus!! Yes, we believe!!
