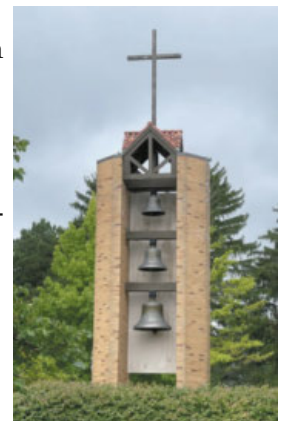

Bell towers, a common feature of Christian churches, are designed to house bells and their ringing mechanisms. Typically situated atop a church roof, these towers are often tall enough for their sounds to be heard from afar.

As many of you know, Catholic churches traditionally ring their bells three times daily, at 6 AM, noon, and 6 PM, to signal the Angelus prayer. Bells can also mark the hour or quarter-hour to denote time for work, prayer, and community events. Additionally, they are used to celebrate special occasions, liturgical feast days, civic events and more.

We are fortunate to have one of these beautiful bell towers on our church campus. However, as some of you may have noticed, the bells have been silent for about the past two years.



We want to update you that efforts are underway to restore the bells and resume the practice of ringing them.

*Experience is often the best teacher. The more we can experience God's love for us, the more we can return his love by acting in obedience to his will and his plan for our lives which is both better than our own plans and more powerful than we have the ability to alter. This is a good thing, that we are not strong enough to ruin God's plan for our life.*

The numbering and division of the commandments can differ. This is widely known as the eighth commandment, but is ninth in this list.

***You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.***

As children, we learn this commandment as "Do not lie", but as adults, there are interesting and sometimes difficult considerations to understand and interpret "false witness" in particular situations. The phrase "bear false witness" brings to mind courtrooms and trials, which may also remind us of another phrase: "tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth". Leaving out important or necessary factual information can cause more harm than purposefully speaking false information. However, there can be times when, morally speaking, it may be necessary to tell a lie. Philosophically, there are a few circumstances in which this can occur. Primarily, there are cases when the person asking the question does not have the right to know. In these cases, a person may use something called mental reservation - which means completing a sentence in your mind while only saying part of it out loud.

A common thought experiment, one I heard while at the seminary, to explain this idea involves World War II Germany. If a German Army soldier knocks on your door and asks if there are any Jews living in your house, he does not have a right to know that information because of what he will do with that information. So, if there are Jews in your house, you can still answer aloud, "There are no Jews here." and mentally finish with, "for you to take away and murder." Is this a lie? No, because of mental reservation. If you say both parts out loud, you would be in trouble along with any Jews you were protecting, but both you and the soldier know that is what the soldier would do; your statement is true. You are not bearing false witness in this case because the "trial" itself is false. Simply being Jewish is not a crime, let alone one worthy of capital punishment.

This is not a case of the ends justifying the means; that is never allowed in Catholic moral theology. It is not choosing the lesser of two evils. It does involve understanding the intended consequences of your actions and the expected actions of the soldier at the door. Turning over your Jewish neighbors to the German authorities would be cooperating with something that is morally wrong.

There is much more to the idea of bearing false witness or not than simply lying or telling the truth. Like many of the commandments, as adults, we need to take a closer look and, using our conscience, determine how to act in a specific situation.

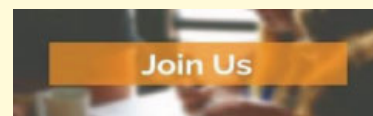
