32nd Sunday of Ordinary Time

In the first reading today and in the Gospel reading we meet two widows who are similar. Both are every day, hard working women. Both are poor. Both put their trust in God. Both are rewarded for their faith.

The first widow is from Zarephath, a coastal city on the Mediterranean, northwest of the Kingdom of Israel. Elijah traveled through this land during a famine. As in all famines, the rich complain, and the poor starve. The woman was poor. When Elijah met up with her, she was putting her last scraps together before she and her son would die. Now a stranger goes up to this woman and asks for food in the name of the Lord. Elijah also must have been near starvation. Hospitality to strangers was a law of God. The woman put her total trust in God, and she received enough for her and her son to eat for a full year.

The second widow was the one of the Gospel reading who put two small coins into the Temple treasury. Jesus was people watching, sitting across from the treasury. There were big shows as some of the wealthy came forward letting everyone know about their great generosity. After all, the money from the wealthy had paid for most of the rebuilding of the Temple. What value did the widow's small coins have next to their thousands? But Jesus knew how much she was really giving. It was far more than two small coins. He said that her donation, although it seemed insignificant, was tremendous because she gave all that she had. Her donation was an act of putting her faith in God to care for her.

Thus the Gospel reminds us that we should give, in Cardinal Mercier's words, not only what we have but also what we are. Remember this epitaph on an English gravestone. "What I kept I lost. What I spent I had. What I gave I have."

Someone has enumerated four different types of giving.

The first is called grudge giving. I hate to part with this twenty dollars but I will. The second is shame giving. I must match whatever the Jones family is giving. The third is calculated giving. We part with our money with what, someone deliciously called, a "lively sense of favors to come." Bingos, Las Vegas nights, and raffle tickets fit in very nicely in this category. The final category is thanksgiving. I part with my funds precisely because God has been so wonderfully generous to me. The widow of today's Gospel fits comfortably into this area.

When we feel disappointed we need to put our trust in God. No where in scripture did He say that His followers would be in the majority. But He did say that He would be with us. Like the two widows, we need to give Him our all. We need to put our faith and our trust in Him, and we need to be assured that He sees us; He knows us, and He cares for us.

Jesus, however, wants us to take a step. He wants us to move from being consumers to being disciples. A disciple gives not so he can get something in return. He gives because Jesus has given everything.

God has given us everything. In Jesus he gives us more than we can ask for or imagine. When we acknowledge that, when we place our lives - and possessions - in God's hand, he does take care of us. He wants for us - Faith, communion and abundance. Nothing ever goes unnoticed in the sight of Jesus. He observes our sacrifices. Our God is a God of surprises: "The fatherless and widow he sustains, but the way of the wicked he thwarts. The Lord shall reign forever." Amen.





A brief note for the parish faithful: The Order (Rite) of Christian Initiation of Adults states, "The People of God...should always realize and show that the Initiation of adults is its own concern and a matter for all the baptized.... [They; i.e. all the baptized] must therefore help others throughout the course of their Initiation" (OCIA 9). Seekers learn to live the Christian life by observing the parish community, following their examples, and imitating their behavior. Catechumenate teams should integrate seekers into the fabric of parish life to give them a hands-on apprenticeship in Christian living.

You may see new people at Mass or other events; this should be a normal and anticipated part of their journey into the Catholic faith. We should always strive to welcome them and to encourage them to continue seeking answers to their deepest questions.



- 6th Grade thru 8th Grade


The artwork will be judged in 3-areas:
