#### ADVENT MESSAGE

Dear Our Lady of Refuge Families

Once again, we are in in a preparation mode while journeying during this beautiful liturgical season of Advent, preparing not just for the many beautiful facets of the Christmas celebration but preparing for the Lord, Himself, in our hearts and in our homes. I pray that our valleys be filled, and our mountains and hills be leveled, our winding roads be made straight, and the rough ways of our lives be made smooth, so that the Messiah may rush into our lives unimpeded. And may we see the salvation of our God, for, indeed, the very name Jesus means "God Saves".



We prepare ourselves by rooting out the darkness in our lives. That is why we go to confession during Advent. We want to clean our spiritual house for company, Special Company, the Presence of the Lord as we await the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ at Christmas and the Second Coming of Christ.

Many families offer special prayers during Advent. One special family tradition is the Advent Wreath which symbolizes the four weeks of Advent. Its circular shape represents eternity for it has no beginning or end. The four candles represent Hope, Peace, Love and Joy and one candle is lit each week with special prayers and reflections. We also prepare our children by teaching them the Christmas story, the real story of the birth of a Child in utter poverty, in a smelly stable. We tell them about the proclamation of the angels, the joy of the shepherds and the determination of the wise men. We prepare the world for its Savior by emphasizing the reason for the celebration.

As one of the two great Solemnities that we celebrate every year, this is a wonderful opportunity to invite family, relatives, and friends to join you in celebrating the Christmas Mass. It's also a wonderful occasion to see many friends and familiar faces whom you do not normally see at Mass. Welcome them warmly. Let them know that we are eagerly awaiting their return for there are many people who come back to a renewed practice of the faith after being welcomed at Christmas. Christmas indeed has a way of bringing back to Church many individuals and families who, for various reasons, have not been to Mass or the Sacraments for months or years. What a wonderful and grace-filled opportunity to put aside past differences and old habits and begin anew that prayerful relationship with the Lord and His Church community.

And so here is a One challenge: I ask you to invite One-person home to church before Christmas! Invite them to come for Mass, Confession, or one of our many programs for men, women, seniors, or children. Just ONE! Our hearts are created for communion with God, and sometimes it only takes a small invitation. Just ONE! And I would love to hear about the results, so please share those stories with me as they can inspire others.

Although everyone is struggling at this time of the year and season, I kindly ask you to prayerfully consider generously supporting Our Lady of Refuge with your Christmas (cont. on page 4)




Mark your calendars! We will be having an Advent-Christmas Concert on Sunday December 15 at 4 PM in the church. Reception in the Social Hall will follow.

We begin the new liturgical year with the First Sunday of Advent. The season of Advent is anticipation on two levels. In the short run, Advent is a time of preparation for the Christmas season as we remember the birth of our Savior born of the virgin Mary. How do we prepare our hearts and our minds for the angels cry for peace on earth? In the longer view we turn our eyes to the final return of Christ as today's Gospel says, "...coming in a cloud with power and great glory."

Today's Psalm 25 fits both visions of Advent with a fundamental prayer, "To you, O Lord, I lift my soul." It is a spiritual exercise for me to turn my gaze away from my screens, my worries and my calendar and fix my eyes on the Lord – even if it's a few minutes at a time, "...As we wait with joyful hope for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ."

Psalm 25:4-5, 8-9, 10, 14 R. To you, O Lord, I lift my soul. Your ways, O LORD, make known to me; teach me your paths,

Guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my savior, and for you I wait all the day.

#### R. To you, O Lord, I lift my soul.

Good and upright is the LORD; thus he shows sinners the way. He guides the humble to justice, and teaches the humble his way.

#### R. To you, O Lord, I lift my soul.

All the paths of the LORD are kindness and constancy toward those who keep his covenant and his decrees. The friendship of the LORD is with those who fear him, and his covenant, for their instruction.

#### CSA Update: Help Us Reach Our Goal!

Capuchin Soup Kitchen (Stable) is a Franciscan ministry in Detroit that feeds the hungry by inspiring minds and nourishing spirits.

Christian Service Our Lady of Refuge (Gift Box) supports our charitable outreach programs including our food pantry, funeral luncheons, bereavement support, military outreach and collaboration with St. Vincent DePaul for financial assistance to individuals and families.




