

Advent II [C] Sunday

The Second Sunday of Advent challenges us to prepare a royal highway in our hearts so that we may receive Jesus as our saving God on Christmas. We should also be prepared for Christ's daily coming into our lives in the Holy Eucharist, in the Holy Bible, in everyone we encounter, and in the praying community. Finally, we are asked to be ready to meet Jesus as our Judge on His Second Coming, at the end of our lives and at the end of the world.

In the first reading, the prophet Baruch introduces Yahweh, the God of Israel, preparing the way for, and leading the Babylonian exiles to, Jerusalem. Hence, the prophet invites the weeping Jerusalem to rejoice and go to high places to watch the return of the exiles. Baruch's prophecy announces the return of the whole human race to God. During this Advent season, we, too, are asked to return to the Lord from our slavery to sin.

In the second reading, Paul advises the Philippians to prepare themselves for Christ's Second Coming by practicing Christian love and by leading pure and blameless lives.

John the Baptist, in today's Gospel, challenges the Jews to prepare their lives for receiving their long-awaited Messiah. They are to prepare a highway in their hearts for their Messiah by levelling the mountains of pride and the valleys of impurity, injustice, and neglect and straightening their crooked ways. They are to get ready by repenting of their sins, changing their lives, and expressing their repentance by receiving the baptism of repentance in River Jordan and living out the reformations they have promised.

Life messages: #1: We need to prepare our hearts and lives for Jesus our Savior to be reborn in us during this Christmas time. We have to fill in the "valleys" of our souls, formed from our shallow prayer life and a minimalist living out of our Faith. We have to straighten whatever crooked paths we've been walking, like involvement in some secret or habitual sins or in a sinful relationship. If we have been involved in some dishonest practices at work or at home, we are called to straighten them out and make restitution. If we have been harboring grudges or hatred, or failing to be reconciled with others, now is the time to clear away all the debris. As individuals, we might have to overcome deep-seated resentment, persistent fault-finding, unwillingness to forgive, dishonesty in our dealings with others, or a bullying attitude. And we all have to level the "mountains" of our pride and egocentrism by practicing the true humility of rendering humble service to others.

#2: We need to repent and seek forgiveness from God and those we have injured: John's message calls us to confront and confess our sins. We need to turn away from them in sincere repentance and receive God's forgiveness. Next, we need to forgive others who have offended us and ask forgiveness for our offenses. Jesus explicitly declares (Mt 6:14-15): "For if you forgive men their transgressions, your Heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive men, then your Father will not forgive your transgressions. (Fr. Tony's Homilies)



I will be retiring effective January 1, 2025. It has been an honor to be able to come back to my childhood parish where I started fifty years ago way back in 1974 as the overflow Mass organist. Those Masses took place in the basement of the performing arts building – now the school lunchroom. I was 14 years-old and I knew four tunes that played over and over for the first couple months until I could learn some more church songs.

We were the first house on the left on Arrowvale and our house shared a property line with Refuge. Us neighborhood kids inhabited the church grounds year-round. We played pickup baseball and football games and knew every inch of those sidewalks with our bikes. We did a lot of work as altar servers at Refuge daily and Sunday Masses, as well as at funerals and weddings... and we also made our fair share of mischief.



When they built the new church and put the pipe organ in, I was there every day hanging around the installers. Across the street I used to sneak into St. Mary's Chapel and play the organ in the middle of the night. That chapel was always unlocked.

Then I went to music school and worked in music ministry for all those years. Coming back to Our Lady of Refuge completed a circle for me. I am and have always been a son of Our Lady of Refuge. Thank you for allowing me to be back with you for these past couple years.

We have hired a wonderful new Music Director, Joanne Gorney, who will be starting on Jan 1. Actually, she's kind of already on the job because we are collaborating on the music direction for the Christmas Concert featuring the Adult Choir, Contemporary Ensemble, and three talented young ladies from OLR school: alumnus Sarina Sitto, and current OLR students Shiloh Brikho and Anabelle Shina. There will be a good mix of both congregational Christmas Carols and pieces that these dedicated musicians have prepared. Come meet Joanne and join us for the concert next Sunday Dec 15 at 4:00 PM in the church. There will be an afterglow in the Social Hall.

This year, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, December 8, falls on a Sunday and so the Solemnity was transferred in the Church's calendar to Monday, December 9. The Apostolic See recently clarified that, despite the longstanding practice in the United States of removing the obligation when December 8 is a Monday or a Saturday, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception remains a day of obligation. However, while December 9 is a Holy Day of Obligation this year, Archbishop Vigneron has dispensed the faithful of the Archdiocese of Detroit from the obligation. Other bishops in Michigan may have done the same.

Monday, December 9, remains a great solemnity to celebrate the Blessed Mother, the patroness of our country. The faithful are still encouraged to attend Mass on that day. The school students will be at Mass on December 9, not on December 11.
