#### Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

The biblical readings which we just heard presented us with the image of two families on pilgrimage to the house of God. Elkanah and Hannah bring their son Samuel to the Temple of Shiloh and consecrate him to the Lord (cf. 1 Sam 1:20-22, 24-28). In the same way, Joseph and Mary, in the company of Jesus, go as pilgrims to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover (cf. Lk 2:41-52).

We often see pilgrims journeying to shrines and places dear to popular piety. These days, many of them are making their way to the Holy Door opened in all the cathedrals of the world and in many shrines. But the most beautiful thing which emerges from the word of God today is that the whole family goes on pilgrimage. Fathers, mothers and children together go to the house of the Lord, in order to sanctify the holy day with prayer. It is an important teaching, which is meant for our own families as well. Indeed, we could say that family life is a series of pilgrimages, both small and big.

For example, how comforting it is for us to reflect on Mary and Joseph teaching Jesus how to pray! This is a sort of pilgrimage, the pilgrimage of education in prayer. And it is comforting also to know that throughout the day they would pray together, and then go each Sabbath to the synagogue to listen to readings from the Law and the Prophets, and to praise the Lord with the assembly. Certainly, during their pilgrimage to Jerusalem, they prayed by singing the Psalm: "I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord!' Our feet are standing within your gates, O Jerusalem (122:1-2).

How important it is for our families to journey together towards a single goal! We know that we have a road to travel together; a road along which we encounter difficulties but also enjoy moments of joy and consolation. And on this pilgrimage of life we also share in moments of prayer. What can be more beautiful than for a father and mother to bless their children at the beginning and end of each day, to trace on their forehead the sign of the cross, as they did on the day of their baptism? Is this not the simplest prayer which parents can offer for their children? To bless them, that is, to entrust them to the Lord, just like Elkanah and Anna, Joseph and Mary, so that he can be their protection and support throughout the day. In the same way, it is important for families to join in a brief prayer before meals, in order to thank the Lord for these gifts and to learn how to share what we have received with those in greater need. These are all little gestures, yet they point to the great formative role played by the family in the pilgrimage of every day life.

At the end of that pilgrimage, Jesus returned to Nazareth and was obedient to his parents (cf. Lk 2:51). This image also contains a beautiful teaching about our families. A pilgrimage does not end when we arrive at our destination, but when we return home and resume our everyday lives, putting into practice the spiritual fruits of our experience. We know what Jesus did on that occasion. Instead of returning home with his family, he stayed in Jerusalem, in the Temple, causing great distress to Mary and Joseph who were unable to find him. For this little "escapade", Jesus probably had to beg forgiveness of his parents. The Gospel doesn't say this, but I believe that we can presume it. Mary's question, moreover, contains a certain reproach, revealing the concern and anguish which she and Joseph felt. Returning home, Jesus surely remained close to them, as a sign of his complete affection and obedience. Moments like these become part of the pilgrimage of each family; the Lord transforms the moments into opportunities to grow, to ask for and to receive forgiveness, to show love and obedience.

Let us not lose confidence in the family! It is beautiful when we can always open our hearts to one another, and hide nothing. Where there is love, there is also understanding and forgiveness. To all of you, dear families, I entrust this most important mission - the domestic pilgrimage of daily family life - which the world and the Church need, now more than ever. (Pope Francis)

## LITURGICAL MUSIC

As I write my last article before departing for retirement, I am thinking of some of the former Our Lady of Refuge music directors who have had a profound impact upon the parish and upon my own development.

Somewhere around 1970 Joe Blattert was the music director. He played organ, piano, guitar, accordion and trumpet. He would play a tune on the organ in the back balcony and then come up to the front and play guitar. He was like a rock star to me. My brother Ray was one of his star guitar students. When Ray learned Classical Gas, I was sure he was going to be famous.

Shortly after Joe left, Rory Dewey came to Refuge. He had similar organ, piano, guitar skills as Joe with a side order of extra cool. Rory could slip seamlessly from organ to piano to guitar and from classical to contemporary. I kept in touch with both Joe and Rory over the years. They were generous with their time and are both accomplished musicians.

Then came Tom Sherer who gave me my first organ hymnal when I started playing in the overflow basement mass in 1974. Tom helped me sort out playing four-part hymns and was a good support in guiding me through my first masses in the church basement.

Sometime after Tom left, Sister Rose Irene came to Refuge and she stayed for almost ten years. She was a jewel of a mentor and music director. She was the first one to really build an adult choir that sang every Sunday. She always included me in AOD workshops downtown. She taught me to be mindful that our music is not an end in itself, but rather a means to a greater end of fostering prayerful worship. During my college summers she would take off for the mother house and I would play the summer masses at Refuge.

In the mid 80's Connie Skoski came and continued to build the Refuge music ministry – particularly the adult choir and cantors. She was beloved by the parish and music ministry. By this time I was music director at St. Mary of the Hills in Rochester. In 1991 she took a road trip with Fr. Strain and I to a National Pastoral Musicians (NPM) conference in Pittsburgh.

Next came Christopher Borowicz. Of all the music directors, Chris is the king of seniority. He put his mark on Refuge with almost 30 years of service. In addition to being a fine organist, he has total command of Bach's Well Tempered Clavier – two volumes of serious piano preludes and fugues for piano. Chris is a great accordionist and can play a slamming version of Maple Leaf Rag.

Anchoring the 11 Am "Folk Mass" for many decades was Michael Tokarz, Michael and Karen Brody, along with many other dedicated musicians. My wife Kim used to play this mass back in the mid 70's with Joe and Noreen Fisher while she was in high school.

David Hansen was music director at our cousin parish Prince of Peace from the 70's to the 20's. Dave is a dear friend and he taught me how to stay cool in tight situations. Dave has a mastery of both classical and contemporary idioms. I also want to give a shout to James Clark who has been a super sub over the past several years. (Continued on pg. 7)

Every one of these fine people has influenced my own development as a music minister. All these years later, on the cusp of 2025, I leave Our Lady of Refuge in the capable hands of Joanne Gorney who will carry on the fine tradition of Liturgical Music at Refuge.

At that NPM conference with Connie and Fr. Strain I learned that the primary music minister of the mass is not the director, the cantor, or the choir – it's the worshipping assembly. All this talk about music directors – we're just driving the bus.

This would be a great time to strike a blow for the Kingdom and join the choir. It's a like new semester and this time of transition offers an opportunity to establish a new path forward. It's a path that will find new routes but is also built upon the shoulders of all the music ministers - the congregation of Our Lady of Refuge - who have come before.

Thank you for all your support and encouragement. And a special thank you to my wonderful wife Kim. Being married to a church musician is a vocation of its own and Kim has been my rock.


