The Second Sunday of Lent

The common theme of today's readings is metamorphosis or transformation. The readings invite us to work with the Holy Spirit to transform our lives by renewing them during Lent so that they radiate the glory and grace of the transfigured Lord to all around us by our Spirit-filled lives.

The first reading describes the transformation of Abram, a pagan patriarch, into a believer in the one God (Who would later "transform" Abram's name to Abraham), and the first covenant of God with Abraham's family as a reward for Abraham's Faith and obedience to God.

In the second reading, St. Paul argues that it is not observance of the Mosaic Law and circumcision that transforms people into Christians, and hence, that Gentiles need not become Jews to become Christians. St. Paul urges us to stand firm in our Faith and to live a life of discipleship with Jesus now, so that we may share in a glorious future later.

In the Transfiguration account in today's Gospel, Jesus is revealed as a glorious figure, superior to Moses and Elijah. The primary purpose of Jesus' Transfiguration was to allow Him to consult his Heavenly Father in order to ascertain His plan for His Son's suffering, death, and Resurrection. The secondary aim was to make Jesus' chosen disciples aware of his Divine glory, so that they might discard their worldly ambitions and dreams of a conquering political Messiah, and might be strengthened in their time of trial. On the mountain, Jesus is identified by the Heavenly Voice as the Son of God. Thus, the Transfiguration experience is a Christophany, that is, a manifestation or revelation of Who Jesus really IS. Describing Jesus' Transfiguration, the Gospel gives us a glimpse of the Heavenly glory awaiting those who do God's will by putting their trusting Faith in Him.

Life messages: 1) The "transfiguration" in the Holy Mass is the source of our strength: In each Holy Mass, the bread and wine we offer on the altar become "transfigured" or transformed (transubstantiated) into the living Body and Blood soul and Divinity of the crucified, risen, and glorified Jesus. Just as Jesus' Transfiguration was meant to strengthen the apostles in their time of trial, each Holy Mass should be our source of Heavenly strength against temptations, and for our Lenten renewal.

- 2) Each time we receive one of the Sacraments, we are transformed: For example, Baptism transforms us into sons and daughters of God and heirs of heaven. Confirmation makes us temples of the Holy Spirit and warriors of God. By the Sacrament of Reconciliation, God brings back the sinner to the path of holiness.
- 3) The Transfiguration of Jesus offers us a message of encouragement and hope: In moments of doubt and during our dark moments of despair and hopelessness, the thought of our own transfiguration in Heaven will help us to reach out to God and to listen to His consoling words to Jesus: "This is my beloved Son in Whom I am well pleased listen to Him!" and so share the glory of His transfiguration
- 4) We need "mountain-top experiences" in our lives: We share the mountain-top experience of Peter, James, and John when we spend extra time in prayer during Lent. Fasting for one day can help the body to store up spiritual energy. This spiritual energy can help us have thoughts that are far higher and nobler than our usual mundane thinking. (Fr. 
RICE BOWLS

On March 9, Kristina Tsao participated in the Rite of Election, led by Bishop Arturo Cepeda, at the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament as part of her preparation to receive the sacraments and join the Catholic Church on the Easter Vigil.

There is a Live Session of Protecting God's Children happening on March 22nd at 9am at St. Patrick's Parish. Please encourage your fellow parishioners and school volunteers to sign up and attend this session. Register through the Virtus website, or reach out to me, Tony Kreucher - re@olorcc.org, and I can help you. Anyone involved in parish ministries - including parish staff - or volunteer work must have attended an in-person or live video session before beginning their activity, even if the role does not involve direct interaction with children. The initial certification lasts for three years, after which a shorter recorded session is required.



OLR parish member Dan Whalen will be ordained a transitional deacon on the morning of April 12. There will be a reception for him in the OLR Social hall after the regular 5pm vigil Mass, which will be the first where he is assisting. He is the first member of our parish to be ordained.

Students in the 5th grade and older are invited to volunteer to participate in a living portrayal of the Stations of the Cross on Good Friday in the afternoon. Several roles are needed for boys and for girls. Costumes will be provided. Similar to the younger students' living nativity, there

will be no lines to learn, only poses. Rehearsals will be on Palm Sunday and Good Friday morning.

In April our Knights of Columbus council will be hosting a display in the social hall of Blessed Carlo Acutis and his work cataloging Eucharistic Miracles. Come and learn more about this contemporary young man who will soon be the first "Millennial" saint.

This summer's Vacation Bible School will run from July 14-17, 9am to 12pm. Students 4 years old through those who will have finished 5th grade are invited to attend. Teen assistants will be hand-picked this year.

Let There Be Light!

Dear Parishioners,

As many of you have noticed, the lighting in our worship space has been less than ideal—some lights are too bright, some are not working at all, and others flicker, causing discomfort. We are aware of these



issues and have consulted with a lighting company to find a solution that won't break the bank.

The good news is we've received a proposal for new light fixtures that will fit into our existing fixtures, provide better fitted lights, and eliminate the harsh glare. We have 92 fixtures that need to be updated. The total cost for materials is \$1,259, with labor at \$5,520, bringing the entire project to \$6,779 – that's \$74 per light, including labor.

We're grateful to share that a generous parishioner has already donated \$1,200 toward this project (thank you, anonymous benefactor!). Now, we're reaching out to see if you'd be willing to help us improve our sanctuary by "buying a light." Donations can be mailed to the parish office or placed in the Offertory basket with a memo that reads: "Buy a Light."

We're so thankful for your ongoing support and generosity. May God bless you for your kindness!
