

Solemnity of SS Peter & Paul

St. Peter and St. Paul are the principal pillars of the Church. That is why this Sunday (June 29th), we celebrate the feast of their martyrdom, replacing the normal readings for the Thirteenth Sunday [C] in Ordinary Time.

Peter was son of Jona and brother of Andrew. He was a professional fisherman from Bethsaida, a fishing town on the Lake of Galilee (Gennesaret). He might have been a follower of John the Baptist. It was his brother Andrew who introduced him to Jesus, and Jesus who changed his name from Simon to Cephas or Peter. Jesus made him the leader of his apostles. At Caesarea Philippi Jesus promised to make him the head of his Church, and the risen Jesus confirmed Peter's precedence. It was the Holy Spirit Who inspired Peter's Proclamation of the Good News to all in Jerusalem on the day of the Pentecost bringing the Church into living action. Peter made missionary journeys to Lydda, Joppa and Caesarea and convened the first Council in Jerusalem. Peter wrote two epistles addressed to the whole Church. He was martyred by crucifixion under the emperor Nero.

Paul the "Apostle to the Gentiles" and the greatest missionary was a Roman citizen by birth as he was born in Tarsus of Cilicia, a Province of Rome. His original name was Saul. He was trained as a tent-maker and practiced that trade. As a Pharisee he was sent to Jerusalem by his parents to study the Mosaic Law under the great Rabbi Gamaliel. Well-versed in the Scriptures, he became a religious fanatic and was ready to destroy the Christian faith. When Stephen was stoned to death by Jewish fanatics, Saul was there to support them. But he was miraculously converted on his way to Damascus to arrest the Christians. He made several missionary journeys, converted hundreds of Jews and Gentiles and established Church communities. He wrote 14 epistles. He was arrested and kept in prison for two years in Caesarea and two more years in Rome. Finally, he was martyred by beheading at Tre Fontane in Rome. Let us pray for the apos-

tolic zeal and missionary spirit of Saints Peter & Paul. (Fr. Tony's Homilies)

As we bid farewell to Tony Kreucher, we would like to express our gratitude for his dedication and professionalism which he has shared with us over the last two years. We appreciate his hard work with the after school religious education program, OCIA and VBS. Although his time here was relatively short, we appreciate all of his contributions to our community.

We are excited for what lies ahead in his journey and wish him much success and fulfillment in his next endeavor. We're confident he'll continue to make a positive impact wherever he goes. Thank you Tony!

Evangelical Charities Report July 1 2024- June 30, 2025

Christian Service Commission: The following activities were supported by the Christian Service Commission:

Harvest Wagon: Parishioners generously donated \$4,402 for our Harvest Wagon collection to provide Thanksgiving and Christmas meals to our pantry families. A total of 44 Thanksgiving meals and 50 Christmas meals were provided by our pantry volunteers. Thirty turkeys and thirty hams were donated by the Hesano family, and pies were donated by the Christ family. Our Lady of Refuge School also contributed to the holiday meals.

Adopt-a-Family: Ten families in need were adopted for Christmas, with many gifts provided. The Knights of Columbus coordinated much of the gift-giving and personally adopted three families.

Toy Collection: Cindy Ciura spearheaded the collection of 600 toys for Crossroads of Michigan. The toys were collected from Our Lady of Refuge Parish and School, Prince of Peace, and Our Lady of Sorrows. All gifts were delivered to Crossroads and wrapped with care.

Giving Tree Donations: Our parishioners provided generous support to numerous ministries through our Giving Tree effort. Abigayle Ministries received \$575.00; the Capuchin Soup Kitchen received \$1,275.00; Grace Centers of Hope received \$1,195.00; Matchan Nutrition Center received \$675.00; and Kids Empowered on the Move received \$1,300.00 in addition to children's clothing and blankets. Mary's Children Family Center received \$1,575.00; OLR Christian Service received \$1,720.00; OLR St. Vincent de Paul received \$995.00; and Open Door Outreach received \$725.00.

Bunk Bed Building: We participated in a fun and fulfilling morning of bunk bed building with Prince of Peace parishioners at the Livonia Department of Public Works. The event supported the nonprofit Sleep in Heavenly Peace and involved sanding wood and assembling the bed frames. Our parish contributed \$1,700 toward the cost of bed materials.

Advent Giving Tree: Our parish donated a large number of baby items, including clothing, baby formula and food, crib sheets, blankets, diapers, wipes, high chairs, swings, bathtubs, potty seats, pacifiers, and rattles. These were delivered to Another Way Pregnancy Center and Right to Life – Lifespan Wee Care.

Food Pantry: From July 1, 2024, through May 31, 2025, our pantry served 635 shoppers, many of whom were new to our services. We received 17,416 pounds of food during this time. Of these donations, 56% came from our parish, 28% from other parishes, 8% from Our Lady of Refuge School, and 8% from businesses including Einstein's Bagels and Tim Hortons. From January through May 2025, 31 volunteers contributed 89 hours of friendly service to pantry operations. For Easter, we provided 50 meals, thanks to our committed volunteers and generous contributions from the Hesano and Christ families, Our Lady of Refuge School, and Prince of Peace Parish.

Military Outreach: We sent handmade Christmas cards along with gift cards to 10 military members who have family in our parish community. We continue to pray for their safety.

Life Activities: In addition to collecting baby items through the Advent Giving Tree, we sold Christmas cards and carnations to raise funds for Right to Life – Lifespan. We also hold monthly prayer gatherings on the first Saturday of each month at 10:00 a.m. outside the abortion center in West Bloomfield. (cont. on pg. 8)

Two Solemnities

The Catholic Church celebrated two profound solemnities in this past week: The Nativity of John the Baptist (June 24) and the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus (Friday after Corpus Christi). Though distinct in focus, both feasts illuminate the mystery of God's love and His plan for salvation.

The Nativity of John the Baptist

Unlike most saints, whose feast days commemorate their death, John the Baptist is honored on his birthday. This reflects his unique role as the forerunner of Christ. His miraculous birth to elderly parents, Zechariah and Elizabeth, was foretold by the angel Gabriel and marked the beginning of a divine mission: to prepare the way for the Messiah. As Scripture recounts, John leapt in his mother's womb at the presence of Jesus in Mary's womb, signaling his prophetic calling even before birth (Luke 1:41).

John's birth is celebrated six months before Christmas, symbolizing his role as the "voice crying out in the wilderness" who must decrease so that Christ may increase (John 3:30). His life of humility, repentance, and bold proclamation challenges believers to prepare their hearts for Christ's coming.

The Sacred Heart of Jesus

The Solemnity of the Sacred Heart centers on the boundless love of Christ, symbolized by His heart—pierced, aflame, and crowned with thorns. Rooted in Scripture and deepened through the mystical visions of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in the 17th century, this devotion emphasizes Jesus' desire for intimacy with humanity and reparation for sin.

Celebrated on the Friday following Corpus Christi, the feast reminds the faithful that the Eucharist is the living heart of Jesus, offered in love. The image of the Sacred Heart invites reflection on Christ's mercy, especially for the weary and burdened: "Come to me... and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28).

Together, these solemnities call us to conversion and communion. John the Baptist points the way; the Sacred Heart opens the door.

Rice Bowls: As part of our Lenten almsgiving, we collected \$1,551. Half of the total was donated to Catholic Relief Services, while the other half went to our food pantry to help families in need of food assistance.

Evangelization Committee: The Evangelization Committee:

Metanioa: Hosted Metanioa videos discussion series of 11 sessions plus a bonus session, which were well attended.

Awaken Evenings: Hosted on January 14, February 11, March 11, April 8 and May 6, with numbers of participants ranging from about 55 to 75 per event.

Monthly OLR Email News: Sent to parishioners each month in 2025.

Outreach: Ongoing community outreach and promotion of Our Lady of Refuge activities.

Knights of Columbus: Activities conducted by K of C Msgr A.X.M. Sharpe included:

5 Pancake Breakfasts / Coffee n Donuts: supporting American Heritage Girls, Catholic Charities and Parish fellowship

Winter Coat Collection: Donated 4 cases of winter coats to needy children at St. Damien of Molokai.

Keep Christ in Christmas: Program for OLR School and OLR Religious Education.

Baby Bottle Drive: Collection donated to Mary's Mantle home for homeless expectant mothers.

OLR Food Pantry: Financial and volunteer support for the OLR Food Pantry.

Tootsie Roll Drive: Conducted at the Commerce Kroger collecting over \$4,000 for the intellectually challenged.

Right to Life-Lifespan: Setting up and taking down the Right for Life Crosses in front of church and school.

Carlo Acutis Eucharistic Miracles Display: Sponsored and set up the exhibition in the Social Hall with help from the Evangelization Committee. The display was viewed by many people, including several school classrooms of students.

Reception for Deacon Whalen: Lead reception for OLR graduate Deacon Dan Whalen

St. Vincent de Paul (SVdP)

Each month, SVdP receives multiple requests for assistance. When a request is received, SVdP sends two members (Vincentians) to the neighbor-in-need's home to pray, review their needs in-depth, and provide information about available agency resources. After further prayer and verification of their needs and circumstances, the Vincentians making the home visit prepare a recommendation for a conference vote. During this period SVdP has assisted 39 families and over 96 individuals who were hungry, homeless, or in need of essential services such as heat, water, electricity, and necessities like food, clothing, beds, mattresses, and linens over the past year. Many families require rent assistance, which is our most significant expense. Frequently, we are asked for help when there is a job loss, a serious accident, or an illness.
