

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introduction: The common theme of today's readings is the futility of the greedy acquisition of wealth and power because everything and everyone is "here today and gone tomorrow." For the meaning of life cannot be found in selfishly hoarding wealth and possessions, but only in sharing these with the needy.

Scripture lessons: The first reading, taken from Ecclesiastes, reminds us that the greedy acquisition and hoarding of material wealth is useless because when the hoarder dies, he goes to eternity empty-handed, and his heir gains, and perhaps squanders, his riches. In the Responsorial Psalm (Ps 90), the Psalmist challenges us to listen to God and allow Him to soften our hearts that we may share our blessings with others.

In the second reading, Paul directs our attention to lasting, Heavenly treasures and warns that greed (pleonexia) for wealth and influence is idolatry. He advises, "Put to death, your parts that are earthly: immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and the greed that is idolatry" (Col 3:5).

In today's Gospel, Jesus, telling the parable of the foolish rich man, warns us against all types of greed, because greed takes our life's focus away from God and away from serving and loving Him in Himself and in other people. Jesus says that God calls the greedy rich man a fool because the man thought he would not die soon and that he was not accountable for the way he used his riches. Besides, the rich man forgot the fact that his wealth had been lent to him by God for sharing with the needy. Jesus also warns us that our eternal life does not consist of earthly possessions (Lk 12:15), which we should share to gain eternal life.

Life messages: 1) We are invited to share our blessings with others. The parable of the rich fool gives us a warning as well as an invitation. It reminds us that our possessions are merely lent to us by God, and that we are accountable for their use. We must be generous in sharing our time, our treasure, and our talents in Christian stewardship. Even if we are poor financially, we may be blessed with intelligence, good will, a sense of humor, or the ability to console, encourage, inspire, support, and help others. God expects us to live out our spoken thanks to Him for all these blessings by sharing them with others for His glory. The Old Testament Scriptures are clear about tithing – giving 10% of our income for God's cause and for helping the needy. Not limiting the gift to a tenth, Paul, writing to the Corinthians in regard to a Church-wide collection for the poor in Jerusalem, declares, "Each one must do as he has made up his mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Cor 9:7). In any case, experience has shown us that God can never be outdone in generosity!

2) Let us control our greed. Our greed takes different shapes and forms. For some, it may be the desire for the approval and praise of others. For others, it is the uncontrolled desire for power, control, or fame. For still others, greed takes the form of excessive and sinful indulgence in eating, drinking, gambling, drugs, or sexual activities. Greed also turns our life away from God and away from loving and serving Him in Himself and in other people. As greed directs all our energy and attention to fulfilling the self, its objects become our false gods, and they will consume us, unless we curb them, pay attention to those in need around us and, thus, become rich in the sight of God. Transfiguration of the Lord - August 6th

We are truly blessed to have such rich access to sacred artwork that brings to life the miracles of Jesus we read about and celebrate in our Catholic faith. These visual representations allow us to more deeply experience and reflect on the mysteries of Christ's life. On Wednesday, August 6th, we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord, a moment when three of Jesus' disciples were given the extraordinary gift of witnessing Him in His divine glory. Can you imagine yourself in that moment—standing on the mountaintop, beholding Christ radiant with light, along-side Moses and Elijah?

This feast also connects us to the wisdom of the Church in recognizing how moments of spiritual transfiguration shape both our personal lives and human history. The observance of the Transfiguration on August 6th was established by Pope Calixtus III in 1457 as an offering of thanks for the Christian victory over the Turks at the Battle of Belgrade in 1456. Yet, this same date in 1945 marks the tragic dropping of the first atomic bomb on Hiroshima, a day that forever changed the course of history.

Just days later, on August 9th, the second atomic bomb devastated Nagasaki. On that very same day, the Church honors the life and martyrdom of Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, formerly Edith Stein—a Jewish-born philosopher turned Carmelite nun. She was arrested by the Nazis in Holland and killed in Auschwitz in 1942, offering her life in spiritual solidarity with her people and the suffering of the world.

The word "transfiguration" means "a complete change of form or appearance into a more beautiful or spiritual state." As Christians, we believe that only God can take the darkest horrors of human history and draw forth light, redemption, and transformation. These layered moments in time call us to a deeper responsibility: to be people of prayer, healing, and peace. May we always seek to be instruments of God's peace in a world so deeply in need of transfiguration. "Lord, make us an instrument of Your peace."

Psalm 90

R: If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.

Psalm 90 is a sobering and beautiful meditation on the fragility of human life and the eternal nature of God. Attributed to Moses, it reminds us that our days are fleeting—like grass that springs up in the morning and fades by evening. Yet in this brevity, we are invited to seek wisdom, mercy, and purpose.

The refrain urges us to listen: "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts." It's a call to spiritual attentiveness. God speaks, through Scripture, through others, through the quiet moments of our day, and we are challenged not to turn away, but to respond with open hearts.

The psalm also asks for God's kindness at daybreak, an image of renewal and hope. It's a prayer that our work, our lives, and our efforts be blessed and made fruitful by God's gracious care.

This week, may we reflect on the gift of time, the importance of listening, and the invitation to live each day with intention and humility. Let us not harden our hearts, but welcome the voice of God with trust and joy.
