

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The central theme of today's readings is the necessity for trusting Faith in God's promises and vigilant preparedness among Christ's followers to meet their God as their Judge and Rewarder, at the time of their death. Fidelity in doing God's will is the best preparation for our death.

The first reading cites the Faith-filled preparedness of the ancient Hebrew slaves in Egypt before their mass exodus to the Promised Land. Their trusting Faith in their God's promises gave them hope. We are told how their Faith and Hope resulted in their liberation. With expectant Hope, the Hebrews sacrificed the first Passover lamb and ate the first ritual meal, as prescribed by their God through Moses. They awaited their imminent release and were prepared for it.

In the Second Reading, taken from the last chapter of the letter to the Hebrews, the author defines Faith as "the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen" (Heb 11:1). He tries to bolster the Faith of the Jewish Christians (the Hebrews), by appealing to the example of their ancestors, starting with Abraham, and reviewing the things they accomplished by Faith.

In the Gospel, Jesus challenges his disciples to trust the Father's promise to give them eternal happiness in His kingdom. But they are to be prepared at all times, because the Son of Man will come at an unexpected hour, either at the moment of their death or at the end of the world, whichever is comes first. Using the master-thief parable, Jesus warns us to be on our guard so that the thief (the devil), may not steal our treasure of Divine grace or our relationship with God by his temptations. Using the master-servant parable, Jesus reminds us always to do the will of God by obeying Jesus' commandment of love and offering humble and sacrificial service to others.

Life message: We always need to be prepared to meet Our Lord as our judge. Let us always remember the words of the Book of Revelation: "Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will enter his house and dine with him and he with me" (3:20). Since no one is sure about the time and circumstances of one's death, we must be ever prepared to face Jesus our Lord and Savior as our Judge at the moment of our death to give an account of our lives. Jesus wants to see that we have kept our personal relationship with him by growing in holiness. Such a growth is assisted by daily talking to him and listening to him in Bible reading; by asking for the guidance of the Holy Spirit every day; by recharging our spiritual batteries through offering our lives on the altar and getting spiritual nourishment in Holy Communion during the Holy Mass; by getting reconciled with God every day, asking for His pardon and forgiveness with a repentant heart, and seeking His forgiveness through the Sacrament of Reconciliation for serious sins; and by obeying Jesus' commandment of love by serving all the people around us, sacrificially sharing our blessings with them, and seeing the face of Jesus in everyone. Holy Day of Obligation - The Assumption of Mary - August 15th

The Assumption is not simply a celebration of Mary's holiness, but also a profound recognition of her unique role in salvation history. The Assumption is a sign of what awaits the faithful and is often called a "first fruit" of what all faithful hope to experience at the resurrection of the body. It serves as a powerful sign of the destiny God intends for each of us: life in His presence, not only in spirit, but also in glorified body. Mary's Assumption reminds us that death is not the end, but a doorway to divine fulfillment.

In a world often filled with uncertainty, the Assumption offers a message of hope. Mary's life — marked by humility, obedience, and unwavering trust in God — culminates in her entrance into eternal glory. She becomes a model of trust and surrender for all believers who seek to live in harmony with God's will.

As the Queen of Heaven, Mary continues to intercede for us. Her Assumption is not a departure from our lives, but a closer bond with humanity. Food Pantry Update: Our Food Pantry is in urgent need of donations. Supplies are running low after a very busy July. Over the past four weeks, we served 54 shoppers — including 7 new families — and provided food for a total of 117 individuals. This is a significant increase from last year, when we averaged 42 shoppers per month.

At the same time, food donations have declined sharply. In March, April, and May, we received just over 2,000 pounds of food each month. That dropped to 1,152 pounds in June and only 815 pounds in July.

We are especially concerned about two pantry families with children who are at risk of eviction. By providing them with food, we hope to ease their burden and help them stay in their homes.

We are deeply grateful to everyone who has contributed. Your generosity makes a real difference — and right now, your help is more needed than ever.

School Supplies Collection: One of our pantry families have let me know they would appreciate help with getting backpacks and school supplies for their 5 children. Please contact me if you are interested in helping with their supply needs.

We also have an opportunity to help the Jail Outreach Ministry with their back to school supply collection. This non-profit organization supports the Oakland County Jail Ministry, which has served victims, offenders, and their families for the past thirty years. They are requesting backpacks filled with school supplies listed below and labeled with the appropriate grade level. Psalm 33

R: Blessed the people the Lord has chosen to be his own.

Psalm 33 is a joyful proclamation of God's faithfulness, protection, and love for those who place their trust in Him. It begins with a call to praise—"Exult, you just, in the Lord"—reminding us that worship is the natural response of a heart aligned with God.

The psalm celebrates the blessing of being chosen by God—not as a privilege to boast about, but as a call to live in reverence and hope. "The eyes of the Lord are upon those who fear him," speaks to God's intimate care for those who seek Him sincerely. Even in times of danger or scarcity, His kindness preserves and sustains.

It ends with a prayer of trust: "Our soul waits for the Lord... our help and our shield." This is not passive waiting—it's a confident hope rooted in God's goodness. When we place our hope in Him, we are not forgotten; we are held, guided, and blessed.

This week, may we reflect on what it means to be chosen—not for status, but for service. Let our praise be genuine, our hope steadfast, and our hearts open to the One who calls us His own.
