Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

The Church celebrates this sixth Sunday of Lent as both Palm Sunday and Passion Sunday. This is the point in the Liturgical year when the Church stops us so that we can remember and relive the events which brought about our redemption and salvation. What we commemorate and relive during this week is not just Jesus' dying and rising, but our own dying to sin and selfishness and rising in Jesus, which will result in our healing, reconciliation, and redemption. Attentive participation in the Holy Week liturgy will deepen our relationship with God, increase our Faith, and strengthen our lives as disciples of Jesus. Today's liturgy combines contrasting moments one of glory, the other of suffering: the royal welcome of Jesus entering Jerusalem, and the rigged trial, culminating in the crucifixion, death, and burial of the Christ.

Today's first reading, the third of Isaiah's four Servant Songs, like the other three, foreshadows Jesus' own life and mission. The Refrain for today's Responsorial Psalm (Ps 22), "**My God, My God, why have You abandoned Me?**" plunges us into the heart of Christ's Passion. The Second Reading, taken from Paul's letter to the Philippians, is an ancient Christian hymn representing a very early Christian understanding of who Jesus IS, and of how his mission saves us from sin and death. The first part of today's Gospel describes the royal reception Jesus received from his admirers, who paraded with him for a distance of the two miles between the Mount of Olives and the city of Jerusalem. In the second part of today's Gospel, we listen to/participate in a reading of the Passion of Christ according to Matthew. We are challenged to examine our own lives in the light of some of the characters in the Passion story – like Peter who denied Jesus, Judas who betrayed Jesus, Herod who ridiculed Jesus, Pilate who acted against his conscience as he condemned Jesus to death on the cross, and the leaders of the people who thought to preserve their position by getting rid of Jesus.

Life Messages: 1) Let us not cause Jesus to weep over us. Instead, let us repent and weep over our sins remembering the Jewish saying, "*Heaven rejoices over a repentant sinner and sheds tears over a non-repentant, hardhearted one.*" We need to imitate the prodigal son and return to God, our loving Father through the Sacrament of Reconciliation during this last week of Lent and participate fully in the joy of Christ's Resurrection. 2) We need to be fruit-producing, not barren, fig trees. God expects us to produce fruits of holiness, purity, justice, humility, obedience, charity, and forgiveness, instead of leading barren spiritual lives. 3) Let us not desecrate our hearts, thus prompting Jesus to cleanse them with His whip. Jesus cannot tolerate the desecration of our souls, each a temple of the Holy Spirit, by our addiction to uncharitable, unjust and impure thoughts, words, and deeds. 4) We need to welcome Jesus into our hearts in a special way during the Holy Week, as Jesus' supporters did on Palm Sunday, by welcoming Jesus into all areas of our life as our Lord and Savior, singing "Hosanna!" and surrendering our lives to Jesus during this Holy Week. 5) We need to be ready to become like the humble donkey that carried Jesus. As we "carry Jesus" to the world, we may receive the same welcome that Jesus received on Palm Sunday, but we may also meet the same opposition, crosses, and trials later. Like the donkey, we are called upon to carry Christ to a world that does not know Him. Hence, let us become transparent Christians during this Holy Week, enabling others to see in us Jesus' universal love, unconditional forgiveness, and sacrificial service. (Fr. Tony's Homilies)

A Reminder from Archbishop from
Archbishop Weisenburger

The following excerpt comes from guidance issued by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops on how the Passion narratives should be proclaimed during Good Friday liturgy.

It is taken from the USCCB's pastoral statement *God's Mercy Endures Forever: Guidelines on the Presentation of Jews and Judaism in Catholic Preaching* (1988), which builds on the teachings of *Nostra Aetate*, a document of the Second Vatican Council.

“The message of the liturgy in proclaiming the passion narratives in full is to enable the assembly to see vividly the love of Christ for each person, despite their sins, a love that even death could not vanquish. The crimes during the Passion of Christ cannot be attributed indiscriminately to all Jews of that time, nor to Jews today. The Jewish people should not be referred to as though rejected or cursed, as if this view followed from Scripture. The Church ever keeps in mind that Jesus, his mother Mary, and the apostles all were Jewish. As the Church has always held, Christ freely suffered his passion and death because of the sins of all, that all might be saved.”

PALM SUNDAY

FROM HOSANNA TO THE CROSS

Palm Sunday is a liturgy of deep contrasts. We begin in the courtyard with palm branches and joyful shouts of "Hosanna!" only to enter the church and listen to the somber account of the Passion. We move quickly from the crowd that welcomes Jesus as King to the crowd that calls for His crucifixion. Today, your voice is a crucial part of the storytelling. We join the residents of Jerusalem in their praise, and we stand in silence during the moments of His suffering. We continue to use the Chants from the Roman Missal, keeping our hearts focused on the gravity of this week.

Entrance: Hosanna to the Son of David & All Glory, Laud, and Honor (#535)

We begin with the traditional Hosanna, acknowledging Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah. This is followed by our processional hymn, which has been sung by Christians for over a thousand years to celebrate Christ's triumphal entry into the Holy City.

Offertory: When I Survey the Wondrous Cross

As we prepare the altar, we shift our focus from the palm branches to the wood of the Cross. This hymn invites us to look at the "wondrous" sacrifice of Jesus and realize that our only appropriate response is to offer our "soul, our life, our all."

Communion: My Song is Love Unknown & O Sacred Head Surrounded (#549)

During Communion, we meditate on the immense love of God. "My Song is Love Unknown" tracks the tragedy of the Passion—how "love to the loveless shown" was met with rejection. We follow this with "O Sacred Head Surrounded," a hauntingly beautiful reflection on the suffering of Jesus as He takes on the sins of the world.

Recessional: Silence

Why the silence? You will notice there is no closing hymn today. We depart in silence because the liturgy of Palm Sunday does not actually "end"—it marks the beginning of Holy Week. The silence invites us to carry the weight of the Passion in our hearts as we prepare for the Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil). We leave the church in contemplation, following Jesus into the shadows of Gethsemane.

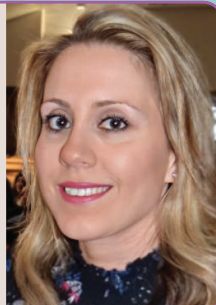
