Evangelical Charities Report July 1 2025- June 30, 2026

Christian Service Commission

The following activities were supported by the Christian Services Commission:

Blood Drive: Liz Oras helped up hold three Blood Drives and collect 50 pints of blood for the Red Cross.

Harvest Wagon: Parishioners generously donated \$2,837.00. for our Harvest Wagon collection to provide Thanksgiving and Christmas meals to our pantry families.

58 Thanksgiving meals and 70 Christmas meals were provided by our pantry volunteers to our shoppers.

30 Turkeys and 30 hams donated by the Hesano family and 72 pies donated by the Christ family. Our Lady of Refuge School contributed to the holiday meals.

Adopt a Family: 19 Families in need were adopted for Christmas with many gifts provided. The Knights of Columbus distributed the gifts to families after they received their Christmas meals from the Food Pantry.

Toy Collection: Cindy Ciura spearheaded the collection of 710 toys and \$350 in gift cards for Crossroads of Michigan with help from the Giving Tree Committee. The toys were collected from OLR parish and school, Prince of Peace and Our Lady of Sorrows. Gifts were delivered to Crossroads by Cindy and Oscar Mittelstaedt.

Giving Tree Donations: Our parishioners provided generous gifts to the following ministries:

Abigayle Ministries \$600.00 plus clothing and supplies.

Mary's Children Family Center \$970.00.

Open Door Outreach \$505.00 plus gloves, hats, socks

Grace Centers of Hope \$890.00 plus bedding and clothing.

Matchan Nutrition Center \$545.00 plus 20 boxes of diapers, 7 boxes of wipes

Kids Empowered on the Move \$1,300.00 plus 40 blankets

Capuchin Soup Kitchen \$1,440.00

OLR Christian Service \$1,285.00

OLR St. Vincent DePaul \$1345.00.

Bunk Bed Building: We participated in a fun morning of bunk bed building with Prince of Peace parishioners at the Livonia DPW to make beds for the nonprofit Sleep in Heavenly Peace. The activity included sanding the wood and assembling parts of the bed. We contributed \$1,250 toward the cost of the bed materials.

Lent Giving Tree: Our parish donated a large collection of baby items including clothing, baby formula and food, crib sheets and blankets, diapers, wipes, high chairs, swings, bathtubs, potty seats, pacifiers and rattles. These items were given to Another Way Pregnancy Center and Compassion Pregnancy. Gift were organized by Leanne Whalen, Jennifer Najor, Debbie Neff, and delivered by Stephanie & Pat Riney, Cheryl & Eric Biallis.

Food Panty: For the period of July 1, 2025-May 31, 2026 we served 1,278 shoppers in the pantry with 86 new to the pantry and 2,537 total family members. We received 30,963 pounds of food. 44% of our donations come from our parish, 37% from other parishes, 7% from OLR school and 6% from Einstein's Bagels, Tim Hortons and others. Volunteers provided 1,146 hours of work in the pantry providing friendly service to our shoppers. For Easter we provided 70 Easter meals thanks to our pantry volunteers and generous donations from the Hesano and Christ families, OLR School and Prince of Peace.

Military: We provided handmade Christmas cards with gift cards to 12 military members who have family in our parish and continued to pray for their safety.

Life Activities: In addition to the Advent Giving Tree collection, we sold Christmas cards to provide funds to Right to Life-Lifespan.

Rice Bowls: As part of our Lenten almsgiving, we collected \$3,385.88, with half of the funds given to Catholic Relief Services and half to our food panty to aid families in need of food assistance. (Continued. on pg. 6)

Back Pack Collection: We collected 18 back packs full of school supplies for Oakland County Jail Outreach Ministry and provided backpacks and school supplies to 6 children who shop in the Food Panty.

Evangelization Committee

Faith growth programs hosted by the committee:

Foundations of Faith: A yearlong Catechism study program.

The Rescue Project (Acts XXIX): A video discussion series which was run in the Fall of 2025.

Writing your Personal Testimony: A workshop on how to cultivate and share your personal testimony as one technique of sharing the good news of the Gospel with others.

Waiting Well: An Ascension Advent program.

No Greater Love: An Ascension Lenten Bible study which gathered in the evening.

Confirmation and First Communion: Prayer teams prayed for and with Religious Education students as they prepared for the reception of these sacraments.

Awaken Evenings: Hosted on Sept 9, Oct, 21, Nov 18, Dec 9, 2025 and Jan 13, Feb 10, March 10, April 14, May 12, June 9, 2026 with numbers of participants ranging from about 55 to 75 per event.

OLR Email News: Sent to parishioners periodically throughout the year.

Evangelization Committee Outreach: The Committee continued its efforts to promote parish activities and engage both parishioners and the broader community through a variety of initiatives. Members created and distributed event cards following Christmas Masses, advertised the Catholic Biblical School of Michigan at Our Lady of Refuge and neighboring parishes, and invited the public to attend the parish picnic, where packets containing religious articles, including rosaries, were distributed. The committee also fostered fellowship through monthly Euchre card nights, and a dinner dance event held in January. In collaboration with the Knights of Columbus, the committee hosted presentations after Masses featuring parishioners who shared their experiences from a pilgrimage to Medjugorje.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Celebrating America 250 with the saints!

CatholicsforCatholics (CforC) has been producing, "Patriotic Minutes," short podcasts highlighting the inspiring lives of Catholics in American history. Scan to visit the website and learn about these incredible people in our Catholic American history!



Here is a quick synopsis of 6 of our 11 canonized American saints!

1. St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, 1774–1821 (Feast: January 4)

- The first American-born saint (born in New York City!) Canonized in 1975.
- Married the love of her life at age 19 and welcomed five children.
- Suffered greatly through dire financial trouble and the death of her husband, William.
- Two years later, she converted to Catholicism and went on to found the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph — the first order of religious women in the U.S.
- Founded several schools, including the first free U.S. Catholic school.



2. St. Kateri Tekakwitha, 1656–1680 (Feast: July 14)

- Known as the "Lily of the Mohawks"
- The first Native American saint in, canonized in 2012.
- Raised in Auriesville, New York, by her uncle, a Mohawk chief, after her parents died from a smallpox epidemic.
- Converted to Catholicism at age 19 after encountering Jesuit priests in her village.
- Her relatives and the village



attempted to punish her for her beliefs so she ran away to Montreal, to live out her life as a consecrated virgin.

3. St. Katharine Drexel, 1858–1955 (Feast: March 3)

- A Philadelphia heiress raised by devout parents who opened their home to the poor
- Dedicated her wealth and life to serving Native Americans and African Americans.
- Founded the "Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament for Indians and Colored People"
- Started schools in 13 states for African Americans as well as 40 mission centers and 23 rural schools.
- Established 50 missions for Native Americans.
- Together with her order, she founded New Orleans' Xavier University, the only historically Black U.S. Catholic college. She was canonized a saint in 2000.



4. St. Isaac Jogues, 1607–1646 (Feast: October 19)

- A Jesuit priest from France, Jogues who served as a missionary to the Native peoples in "New France"
- Was tortured and imprisoned by the Mohawks while traveling to Iroquois country in 1641
- He survived and even baptized some of the Native Americans before he escaped back to France.
- He felt called to return, even though he knew he might not survive a second time.
- Became one of the North American martyrs after he was killed with a tomahawk in Auriesville, New York.
- Canonized a saint in 1930.



5. St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, 1850–1917 (Feast: November 13)

- Missionary from Italy, who founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.
 - When she first traveled to New York City, she discovered that the house she had planned to turn into an orphanage was unavailable. When the archbishop advised her to return to Italy, she refused.
 - Instead, she founded orphanages, hospitals, convents, and schools, many of which served Italian immigrants.
 - She became the first U.S. citizen to be canonized a saint in 1946.



6. St. Damien de Veuster of Molokai, 1840–1889 (Feast: May 10)

- Dedicated his life as a missionary to those with leprosy in Molokai, Hawaii.
- Born in Belgium and joined the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary at age 19. Volunteered to serve those with leprosy who were quarantined on the island of Molokai.
- He spent his time building schools, churches, and hospitals.
- After contracting and dying from leprosy himself, he was declared a saint in 2009.

Parish Picnic

Liz Oras put on a wonderful parish picnic with help from Christian Services, Evangelization, Knights of Columbus and many volunteers.

St. Vincent DePaul

Each month, SVdP receives multiple requests for assistance. When a request is received, SVdP sends two members (Vincentians) to the neighbor-in-need's home to pray, review their needs in-depth, and provide information about available agency resources. After further prayer and verification of their needs and circumstances, the Vincentians making the home visit prepare a recommendation for a conference vote. During this period SVdP has assisted 14 families and over 41 individuals who were hungry, homeless, or in need of essential services such as heat, water, electricity, and necessities like food, clothing, beds, mattresses, and linens over the past year. Many families require rent assistance, which is our most significant expense. Frequently, we are asked for help when there is a job loss, a serious accident, or an illness.

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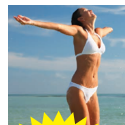
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
