FATHER CARL'S CORNER

Last week I attended two events that highlighted the gifts and

strength of our Oak Park Catholic communities and neighbors working together. With Migrant Ministry moving out of the Saint Edmund School building and pivoting their ministry to what are the more immediate needs for migrants today, a luncheon was held to thank the volunteers. Over 90 volunteers attended. These were people from our various religious congregations in Oak Park and beyond as well as those affiliated with other churches. I offered a special prayer of thanksgiving for the building that served us so well in a desperate time of need.

Then I attended the ribbon cutting ceremony for our repurposed Saint Catherine of Siena-Saint Lucy rectory now the Bridge Center. Through Migrant Ministry, we extended welcome and compassion to those seeking safety, dignity, and a place to belong. Now at the Bridge Center, we officially join with our partners, Housing Forward and Faith and Fellowship, to create a ministry for the emotionally challenged. This will offer a new shared space of healing, connection, and renewal for our most vulnerable neighbors.

As Pastor, I am so proud and pleased of the work so many have done to share these visions and help to make them a reality. This is possible through prayer support, volunteer efforts, and monetary contributions. THANK YOU!

In my comments at both events, I spoke of what these ministries and the effort behind them have meant to me, and what they

remind each of us; Christian hope is not passive - it moves us to act, to serve, and to build bridges of mercy where others see walls. Together, we live the Gospel call to be signs of God's love in our world today.

In a world where so many struggle with fear, uncertainty and isolation, the Bridge Center, as well as our Migrant Ministry, stand as signs of LIVING HOPE in ACTION. Here all will find welcome, understanding, and hands and hearts that care and can help direct them to needed resources. God's love is not confined to a church building but moving into the world, crossing boundaries, healing divisions, and building bridges between people.

What our world needs more of is what we are already doing: living hope through action!

Saturday, November 1, is All Saints Day, usually a holy day of obligation. Since it falls on Saturday this year, it is not a holy day of obligation, so special Masses will not be added. There is always one Mass on Saturday morning at Saint Giles at 8:00 AM, and all are welcome to attend.

On Saturday, November 1, the evening vigil Masses at Saint Giles at 4:30 PM, and Ascension at 5:00 PM will remember all souls, especially those who died this past year. Their names will be read, and candles lit in their memory.




ALL SOULS' DAY, MASS OF REMEMBRANCE

On Saturday, November 1, our parish will celebrate All Souls' Day at the 4:30 PM Mass at Saint Giles Church. At Mass, we will remember all of our parishioners who

We will read the list of names of the departed and light candles in their memory.



Have you ever wondered what it would be like if Saint Francis of Assisi lived today? What would he think about today's large cities, the sight of poor and homeless people, the unimaginable riches of the wealthy, and the tech gadgets that fill our lives? Myles Connolly envisioned a modern-day Saint Francis when he wrote *Mr. Blue*, a novel about a young man who decides to take Christianity seriously.

In the novel, the mysterious Mr. Blue lives in a packing box on a New York City rooftop, embraces the poor as his wisest companions, and distrusts modern technology's promise. He foregoes money and power and serves the poor. The novel explores how self-giving is possible and still inspires readers today, almost a century after it was first published in 1928.

- The race will take place on November 27 starting at 9:30 AM in front of the Saint Giles gym, 1034 Linden, Oak Park.
- Entry fee is \$25 plus a small processing fee. Race day registration increases to \$30.
- The event is limited to about 450 participants.
- Race packet pick-up is on Wednesday, November 26 at SGC Gym from 5:00 PM to 7:00 PM, and 8:00 AM to 9:00 AM on Race Day.
- Long-sleeve commemorative tee shirts are available in adult sizes for \$15.
- Age groups are: 0-9, 10-19, 20-29, 30-39, 40-49, 50-59, 60-69, 70+. The 0-9 age group will be charged a reduced entry fee of \$10.
- Finish medals will be awarded to the top three male and female finishers, and ribbons to the top three finishers in each age group.
- A timing system has been secured that will give runners instant finish times. We are looking for a few major donors to offset the cost.

Leading catechists, caring for the special classrooms with their materials, and introducing children between the ages of 1 and 12 to the love of the Good Shepherd all strengthen my commitment to our Lord. Additionally, the work I do with the Moms' Faith Sharing Group, H+0+M+E Team, Lifelong Learning Committee, and Children's Liturgy of the Word, makes me excited to see how our Catholic Communities of Oak Park and neighbors collaborate to build the Kingdom near and far!

Mary Ellen Lesniak — Saint Giles Family Mass Community Liaison I spent over thirty years as an educator, teaching fourth through eighth

grades for 12 years (eight at Saint Giles School) and serving as an Adult and Family Literacy instructor and coordinator for 18 years. I led a nationally recognized Family Literacy Program and consistently focused on empowering parents as primary educators.

My volunteering in Church Life and my professional experience share a core belief: parents play a crucial role in shaping their child's faith and education. Since moving to Oak Park in 1976, Saint Giles Family Mass Community has supported that belief, involving the entire family in church life. Over the past 40 years, I've served on the Pastoral Team, Coordinating Board, and the Liturgy Team. My most valued role is as a catechist, volunteering from my children's grade school years through teen confirmation groups. I became Baptism Coordinator for Family Mass, and eight years ago began coordinating all Sacraments and serving as Liaison to the parish's Catechesis of Good Shepherd Program.

MIGRANT MINISTRY UPDATE: MIL GRACIAS, CENTRO SAN EDMUNDO!



Recently volunteers, parish staff members, and pastors of local churches gathered in the beautiful, woodenarched, second floor gymnasium of the Saint Edmund School building to share memories, bid farewell to Centro San Edmundo, and bless

the beloved community of volunteers that had formed there through the Migrant Ministry. Yes, we can talk about number of migrant visits (over 20,000), immediate needs met (distribution of clothing, shoes, bedding, and toiletries), and services provided (immigration support, ESL, and social services), but that won't capture the magic and the LOVE experienced over the past 22 months since the center opened in January 2024.

Volunteers shared memories of little girls twirling in pretty dresses, boys clutching new soccer balls, women selecting warm puffy coats, and men standing straighter and prouder in their new clothes. The center embodied donations with dignity. We celebrated holidays with homemade Easter decorations, a Halloween parade of happy children in costumes, and a Christmas toy "free store." Centro San Edmundo was a place of joy.

Among the volunteers, a tight community was formed. Brought together from different faith centers with a desire to serve migrants, volunteers developed close friendships. They supported each other through different life events, including the birth of a child and the tragic death of another volunteer.

Although Centro San Edmundo is closed to migrants, store rooms are available and volunteers will be filling special orders for coats and clothing until we are able to move to our new location at Boulevard Presbyterian. Meanwhile, immigration support services, ESL, and social services continue in Murphy Hall. We are pausing all but financial donations now, and will alert you when we can accept donations again.
