FATHER CARL'S CORNER

As we begin a new year and celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany, many individuals and families do so carrying uncertainty rather than clarity. Loss, financial strain, rising food costs, and fears around immigration, deportation, and national stability remain very real. The turning of the calendar does not magically remove

these burdens. Yet the Epiphany reminds us that God does not wait for life to become easier before revealing Himself. Just as the Magi set out into the darkness, unsure of the road ahead, we too are invited to begin this new year trusting that God's light is already present, even when the path forward feels uncertain.

The Magi followed a star - not a detailed map. Their journey was marked by questions, risk, and perseverance. In the same way, hope for the new year is not found in having all the answers, but in continuing to move toward God. Prayer becomes our guiding star; a place where we bring our fears honestly before the Lord and allow His presence to steady our hearts. Through prayer we learn to look for God's light in small but real ways - in moments of kindness, resilience, and unexpected grace.

At the heart of that light is the Eucharist. In every Mass, Christ reveals Himself to us just as truly as He did to the Magi, offering not explanations but His very presence. Gathered as a parish community, we discover we do not walk into the new year alone. Together, strengthened by the Eucharist and by one another, we become bearers of Christ's light for our families and our world. As the Epiphany teaches us, hope is born when we recognize that God is already with us, leading us forward - one faithful step at a time.

On behalf of Father Rex, Father Bob, Father Vittorio, Father Tom, Father Larry, Father Ed and Father David, Happy Epiphany and Happy New Year to all. Thank you to everyone who helped plan our beautiful liturgies and the church environment during this sacred season. To our liturgy planners, choir members, directors and musicians, lectors, ushers, greeters, ministers, and altar servers - your time, preparations and service help our parishioners and visitors encounter the presence of God. I hope you know how deeply your service is appreciated.

GOSPEL MEDITATION THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

When I was 22, I went on a pilgrimage to Rome for the Jubilee Year of 2000. I was traveling light with just a backpack, one blue shirt and black pants, little money, and no Italian. I had a few close friends and one goal: to reach the Eternal City. Despite the challenges and deprivations, I felt alive in a way I had never known before.

When do you feel most alive? I'd wager it's not when you're most comfortable or surrounded by stuff. Rather, it's when your life is aimed at something great; when you're on a meaningful and challenging journey with good friends.

That's the image the Magi give us in today's Gospel. They set out from the East not with certainty, but with hope. They study the signs, discipline their attention, and journey together, offering the best they have when they find the newborn King.

The Church gives us their story at the start of the year to reawaken something in us. We are not meant to drift. We're meant to journey as pilgrims. The Jubilee Year of 2025 may have ended, but our pilgrimage has not. Like the magi, the closer we get to Christ, the more alive we become.

New Year's Resolution Ideas: More Efficiency, Less Pollution and Waste

Studies indicate that a large portion of a household's pollution emissions are linked to their home energy usage. Improving home energy efficiency helps care for Creation and contributes to climate stability. Consider creating a plan to upgrade your appliances to Energy Star when they reach the end of their service life. This could include water heaters, stoves, furnaces, air conditioners, clothes dryers, washing machines, microwaves, and dishwashers. Consider replacing appliances at the end of their service life but before they break down (avoiding the mad rush to replace). Switching away from fossil fuels is an added plus but may require some advance planning (i.e.- like where to place 240-volt outlets). Adding weatherstripping, insulation and low-flow showerheads to the home will further contribute to energy efficiency. Check out tax credits and utility rebates. 

MAGI, THREE KINGS, THREE WISE MEN...WHO WERE THEY?

We sing songs, give gifts, and move three mysterious men into our manger scenes. There's a rich heritage in the Catholic Church of celebrating the magi, but their origins are steeped in mystery. The original Greek calls these men magoi. The word is translated elsewhere in Scripture to mean "magician," but a similar word was used in ancient history to describe an entirely different set of people altogether. In what is now modern-day Iran, the ruling empire had a wealthy priestly caste known as the Magi. At the time of Christ, the Magi formed one of the ruling councils of the Parthian Empire. These priests interpreted dreams and read the stars to anticipate major events that could affect the fortunes of the empire.

We're not exactly sure where the magi of the Gospels traveled from. Matthew simply says "the east." History tells us that the ancient regions of Persia, Assyria, and Babylon all had a magi priesthood at the time of Christ. Whichever region they hailed from, they likely traveled over one thousand miles over the course of several months to arrive at the Holy Family. Unfortunately for the classic song, there is no concrete evidence these men were themselves kings, though they did bear gifts "from afar" at the prompting of their astronomical calculations.

MIGRANT MINISTRY UPDATE: NEW YEAR!!! NEW LOCATION!!!



Indeed the Holy Spirit works in amazing ways!

When we learned back in June that we would have to leave Saint Edmund, our first thought was on the availability of the former Saint Bernardine

School in Forest Park which had been closed for a number of years. We were told that it was not available, as the rooms were being used for Archdiocesan offices and storage. Almost six months later, at the brink of signing a lease to rent space at Boulevard Presbyterian Church, we received notice that Saint Bernardine School was now available, as a number of formerly-occupied rooms were no longer being used.

Wow! Six large classrooms, a parking lot, and close to the Blue Line el. A side entrance off the parking lot offers access less noticeable to federal agents. And, the blessings of Father Carl who graduated from Saint Bernardine!

After moving our shelves, tables, and supplies, our plan is to start receiving donations and organizing the rooms ("free stores") on Monday, January 12 and Monday, January 19. We will open once again to migrants and immigrants on Tuesday, January 20.

This ecumenical prayer service will be grounded in the WPCU theme "There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling" (Ephesians 4:4).
