



Footnotes:

- (1) Donations (for Weekly, Holy Days, Christmas, and Easter) decreased by 6.4% FY24 over FY23.
- (2) Lease income was from The Children's School who moved out in Nov. '23.
- (3) A fundraising goal of \$75,000 was included in the FY 24 budget. Fundraising income was \$99,793, exceeding the budgeted amount.
- (4) The Close the Gap/Deficit Reduction initiative (reflected in other income) raised \$65,253.
- (5) Parish expenses decreased by 5.4% FY 24 over FY 23, although we still had a deficit of \$158,223
- (6) Any surpluses generated by Ascension School will remain with the school.

Footnotes:

- (1) Total insurance recoveries of \$682,370 were received for the St. Edmund campus storm damage. Costs of \$427,529 were incurred through 6/30/2024.
- (2) Additional repairs not related to storm damage were identified during the work on St. Edmund Church. The cost of these repairs would be significantly less if done while the scaffolding was up. We authorized a loan of up to \$212,300 from the Archdiocese to cover these repairs. Through June 30, 2024, the amount drawn on the loan was \$95,580.
