Housing Forward continues a 15-bed shelter in the former rectory of St. Catherine-St. Lucy. A new emergency overnight shelter with 40 beds will open in September at 112 S. Humphrey Avenue in Oak Park. This means additional volunteer opportunities to not only provide meals, but serve and interact with guests, similar to the prior PADS model, but without the distraction of traveling locations!

Volunteers are a key to the success of the emergency shelter. Between the emergency overnight shelter and the Interim Housing Program, **we provide** 1,260 meals every week! Individuals and groups are welcome to be part of creating a safe and stable place for individuals and families experiencing homelessness.

Services in the Saint Edmund school building will end on October 9 and will move to another space. The last day for donations will be Monday, September 15.

Several of our resettled families are coming to the end of their 1-year lease (end of rent support from the Migrant Ministry). Many are looking for less expensive apartments. We could use your help in finding apartments. Many now have work permits and could apply for an apartment on their own. If you have any suggestions on local available apartments, please contact us at immigrantministry@gmail.com. The need for job skills, mastery of the English language and mental health services are services that are needed. And, of course, the support of the Legal Defense Fund is needed as people are going to court to defend their asylum applications. CLUB ACT NOW! CLEAN ENERGY TAX CREDITS ARE EXPIRING SOON!

- EV Credits: Federal tax credits for eligible vehicles are available **through September 30, 2025**, with up to \$7,500 for new vehicles and \$4,000 for used vehicles.
- EV Charger Credit: Looking to install a home charger? Get up to \$1,000 back on your taxes until **June 30**, **2026.**
- Residential Clean Energy Credits: Claim 30% of the total cost of solar panels, battery storage, and geothermal systems if you **buy by December 31, 2025**.
- Energy Efficient Home Upgrade Credits: Make home energy upgrades, like insulation, windows, or efficient electric appliances, by **December 31, 2025** to claim the credit.
 - Heat pump systems: up to \$2,000 in credits for energy-efficient heating and cooling.
 - o Insulation, air sealing, and weatherization: up to \$1,200.
 - Electrical panel upgrades: up to \$600 to support electric appliances and EV chargers.
- Home energy audits: up to \$150 to help identify where you can save the most on energy costs.

NATIONAL RESOURCES DEFENSE COUNCIL: EPA must honor the "Endangerment Finding"

"The EPA has announced their intentions to reverse:

A long-standing finding that carbon dioxide, methane, and other climate-changing pollutants are dangerous to our health and welfare. Called the "endangerment finding," it's the legal basis for Clean Air Act standards that cut pollution from some of the dirtiest industries.



In a recent press release, Tom Chapman, Executive Director of the Iowa Catholic Conference, wrote the following: "The four Catholic bishops of Iowa, through the Iowa Catholic Conference, have released a pastoral reflection on the Church's teaching on immigration and the dignity of the human person.

Entitled 'Pilgrims of Hope: A Pastoral Reflection on Immigration,' the letter asks the People of God to uphold the dignity of the human person, created in the image and likeness of God, 'by welcoming the stranger, defending the oppressed, and standing in solidarity with those who are displaced."

The reflection states: "The Church's response to immigration must go beyond platitudes; it must take concrete form in the way believers advocate, accompany, and serve others. The treatment of immigrants, refugees, and asylum seekers is not a marginal issue but a gauge of how seriously we take the command to love our neighbor. Every Catholic Christian has a moral responsibility to ensure that the personal dignity of migrants is upheld."
