The Baptism of the Lord - Reflection by Clare Lee

I was talking to my middle daughter this week, and I mentioned I needed to write a reflection on the Baptism of the Lord. Being as well-versed in Scripture as she is, she started telling me about the view when Jesus was being baptized, how the heavens opened up and the voice of God came down to speak to those who were present. The idea of the voice of God struck with me; for in the same way that God's voice sang down upon the witnesses of Christ's baptism, do we not open ourselves up to the heavens when we celebrate through music and song?



Psalm 100 states, "Make a joyful noise unto the Lord, all ye lands. Serve the Lord with gladness: come before his presence with singing." Church music plays an important role in music history, as many great composers worked in churches and composed great works inspired by Scripture. Their music is still widely played in the concert. I have sung Requiem by different composers—Elijah by Mendelsohn, Handel's Messiah, and many more masterpieces. Those pieces

are powerful, and can strike straight to your heart.

I love singing in church just as much as I love performing various classical pieces, as it strengthens my spirit and connects me with those in the congregation. My last thought on the sacred music is that, on the last few days of my late father, he was in hospice and ready to leave the physical world. He played Ave Maria over and over again. He even played it for Fr. Olivera after he did my father's final rites. My father was hard of hearing. My brothers and I were wondering if he could even hear anything. Now I think back, he probably played the music for us so we weren't scared and hoping to bring us peace or perhaps it was his prayer. Everyone interprets music differently. May you all have a song to sing in your heart!





Stewardship of Treasure Report – November (2024)

Thank you for your ongoing support of the mission and ministries of our parish. For the month of **NOVEMBER**, our average weekly collection was \$22.572. You also generously donated to various essential causes in our NOVEMBER second/special collections at \$5,392 (\$1,348/week). This brings our NOVEMBER weekly

average to \$23,920. We budgeted our Sunday Offertory income (minus special collections) for JUL-NOV (21 weeks x \$24,000) at \$504,000 and received \$474,000 (-\$30,000).

We use the extra income to maintain and improve our parish campus buildings and grounds. As you know, we depend on your good stewardship practice to fulfill our parish mission. The love these gifts represent will enable us to continue the work we must undertake here at Saint Nicholas and Saint William Parish. Your generosity helps us more than you can imagine
