



Visita Iglesia is also known as the Seven Churches Visitation. People visit churches and reflect on the sufferings of Jesus Christ on his way to Calvary. This Lenten or holy week tradition dates to the 16th century and was made known by Saint Philip Neri in Rome, Italy. Originally, the practice involved the visitation of seven basilicas in Rome to signify the seven stations of the cross from the arrest of Jesus to his crucifixion.

Pope Francis in his apostolic exhortation Evangelii Gaudium (The Joy of the Gospel) urges us to "go out" to the fringes, to the margins, to the frontiers of our society. From being identified with the "smell of the sheep" to going out to the peripheries living with the poor," he beautifully stated:

"I prefer a Church which is bruised, hurting and dirty because it has been out on the streets, rather than a Church which is unhealthy from being confined and from clinging to its own security. I do not want a Church concerned with being at the center and which then ends by being caught up in a web of obsessions and procedures.

If something should rightly disturb us and trouble our consciences, it is the fact that so many of our brothers and sisters are living without the strength, light, and consolation born of friendship with Jesus Christ, without a community of faith to support them, without meaning and a goal in life.

More than by fear of going astray, my hope is that we will be moved by the fear of remaining shut up within structures which give us a false sense of security, within rules which make us harsh judges, within habits which make us feel safe, while at our door people are starving and Jesus does not tire of saying to us: 'Give them something to eat' (Mk 6:37)."

If you plan to do a Visita Iglesia during this season of Lent or during the Holy Week and pray the Stations of the Cross, let us consider a "Visita Iglesia en las Periferias" Stations of the Cross intentions.

- I. We pray for the poor around the world WHO ARE CONDEMNED to live and die in poverty because of corruption that they may find abundance in God's love.
- II. We pray for the victims of violence and war WHO ARE MADE TO CARRY their burdens because of the absence of justice and peace that they may be strengthened with hope in their sufferings.
- III. We pray for the vulnerable women and children WHO FALL PREY easily to those who use and abuse them that they may find liberation and healing.
- IV. We pray for orphaned children WHO ARE LONGING FOR MOTHERS, surrogate as they maybe, to care for them that they may be loved.
- V. We pray for the volunteers and supporters of civic organizations WHO ARE READY TO HELP BEAR THE CROSS of the lost, last, least, and left-out that they may persevere in their work of solidarity.
- VI. We pray for advocates WHO WIPE THE TEARS of laborers and employees in promoting their interests and causes towards better social policies on labor and employment.
- VII. We pray for the sick and the dying WHO FELL ILL because of deprivation from medicines or medical attention that their health be secured and well-being guaranteed.
- VIII. We pray for those WHO WEEP because of their sufferings brought about by unemployment, economic downfall, environmental destruction, and climate change that they may rejoice in divine providence.
- IX. We pray for prisoners and recidivists WHO FALL REPEATEDLY in crimes and sins of commission or omission that they may profit from reformation and rehabilitation.
- X. We pray for victims of human rights abuses WHO ARE STRIPPED OF THEIR DIGNITY as human beings that they may see themselves as children of God.
- XI. We pray for those who are NAILED TO THE CROSS due to discrimination and prejudice in many forms, including race, religion, sex and sexual orientation, age, and disability that they may be accorded respect and tolerance.
- XII. We pray for our young people WHO DIE ON THE CROSS of misinformation, fake news, and historical revision that they may be led towards truth, goodness, and beauty.
- XIII. We pray for migrant workers and refugees WHO NEED TO BE TAKEN DOWN FROM THE CROSS of being illegally separated from their family and love ones and find their way home.
- XIV. We pray for our beloved dead WHO WERE LAID ON A SEPULCHRE that may receive the gift of the resurrection and eternal life.

From the peripheries, we shall be able to take the opportunity to bring all those who are hurting and their hurts, in one way or another, into the center of our Church, into the core of our community, into the beating heart of our faith in the spirit of synodality.

Scrutinies with the Elect

On the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent at the 8:00 am Mass, we will celebrate the rites of penance and purification with our Alison Raleigh, preparing to receive the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. The purpose of these rites is to uncover all that would lead her away from Christ, so that she might be able to come to a full Christian life. The support of a parish community is vital to this process. At the same time, these brief rites call us, the baptized, to uproot the sin in our lives to be more faithful to our baptism. We will be using Cycle A Readings.



We are all familiar with the three traditional actions of Lent – prayer, alms, and fasting. One action that combines all three is the Catholic Relief Society (CRS) Rice Bowl. We invite each household to pay attention to what we eat and eat less, and combine this with prayers of thanks before meals,

and prayers for the hungry. Consider taking home a Rice Bowl kit prepared by Catholic Relief Services. Learning how our simple actions make a big difference for many others worldwide. 75% of the Rice Bowl collection goes to help our overseas programs that provide relief and build sustainable programs for many underresourced people. 25% of the Rice Bowl collection supports grants for parish programs in our diocese that feed the hungry. We will collect your Rice Bowls starting on Palm Sunday.



No Baptism during Lent

In keeping with our parish tradition, the Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated through the 40 days of Lent. Baptismal catechesis continues for parents and godparents of those children who will be baptized in the spring and summer.



Chalice Program for Promoting Vocations


The Chalice Program is to encourage families to pray and promote vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life.

Each day for a week, during prayer time, the family includes in their prayer the increase and perseverance of vocations. A prayer guide will be provided. 

Stewardship of Treasure Report – January (2025)

Thank you for your ongoing support of the mission and ministries of our parish. For the month of JANUAY, our average weekly collection was \$17,855. You also generously donated to various essential causes in our second/special collections at \$11,000 (\$2,750/week). This brings our weekly JANUARY average to \$20,605. We budgeted our Sunday Offertory income (minus special collections) for JUL-JAN (30 weeks x \$24,000) to \$720,000 and received \$702,000 (-\$18,000).

We use the extra income to maintain and improve our parish campus buildings and grounds. As you know, we depend on your good stewardship practice to fulfill our parish mission. The love these gifts represents will enable us to continue the work we must undertake here at Saint Nicholas and Saint William Parish. Your generosity helps us more than you can imagine.
