Reflection by Alison Raleigh

So whoever is in Christ is a new creation: the old things have passed away; behold, new things have come. - 2 Corinthians: 5:17

My awakening to God was a miracle, an astonishing grace that transformed my life. I can't explain why God opened my eyes and my heart. All I can do is thank Him.

Almost by mistake, I went to a silent retreat at El Retiro in February 2024, expecting a quiet weekend of rest. I wasn't Christian, I wasn't religious, I wasn't searching for anything; I was just tired. God gave me one night of sleep before he turned me inside out. Before dawn on the day the retreat began, a single bird called from the darkness outside my window. That mournful call pierced my heart. It seemed to express all the suffering in the world. I started crying and got down on the floor. My heart felt like it was breaking in half. I thought about the 18 years of my little sister's suffering, and how nothing I did to try to help her could stop her pain or prevent her death. I understood that I was no different. I was just like her, like every human being. We all suffered, we all died. A sense of total helplessness flooded through me and finally, after a lifetime of prideful self-reliance, I admitted my defeat. I got up, looked at the crucifix, and I cried for Jesus, hanging in agony on His terrible cross. I read St. Ignatius's prayer:

"Take Lord, and receive all my liberty, my memory, my understanding, and my entire will, all that I have and possess. Thou hast given all to me. To Thee, O lord, I return it. All is Thine, dispose of it wholly according to Thy will. Give me Thy love and thy grace, for this is sufficient for me."

I thought, yes, God, yes; I give everything to you. But, it's wrong to ask you for anything. Immediately, I felt a warmth in my chest, like the heat of a fire. I closed my eyes, and my tears stopped. I saw an image of the halves of my heart being melded together by the heat of Christ's heart. I felt the love of God envelop me, as if my whole being was lifted up into His arms.

Lord have mercy, Christ have mercy, Lord have mercy. My hope, O Lord, is in your mercy.

By the end of that retreat, I knew Christ was calling me into his Holy Catholic Church. I was deeply disappointed to learn I'd have to wait for more than a year to become Catholic. I wasn't questioning, I was begging to be baptized. I wanted to get as close as humanly possible to Christ, to receive the precious gift of His Body and Blood. But, waiting taught me patience and obedience. It gave me time to immerse myself in an all-you-can-eat Catholic education through books and journals and podcasts and films and retreats and discussions and prayers and the Rosary and Adoration and hundreds of Masses, soaking up the Liturgy and loving the Eucharist and living the Liturgical year. It gave me time to make friendships, to begin settling into a Christian way of life, to start serving in ministries, to talk about faith, to receive the generous gifts of mentorship, support, and spiritual sharing from so many devout fellow parishioners.

I was blessed by the best possible sponsors/godparents. They walked with me through all the Rites of OCIA and into the glorious night of Easter Vigil when our beloved priests Baptized me into Christ, sealed me with the Holy Spirit in Confirmation, and offered me First Communion. I am so grateful to our devoted clergy, our parish staff, to everyone who serves in OCIA, to the generous souls who volunteered to be dismissed with me every Sunday, to everyone who welcomed me into the parish. The gift of faith is the gift of the Church. Thank you, thank you!

Before Christ called me into this beautiful Catholic faith, I was lost in the wilderness. God turned the compass of my soul 180 degrees and showed me the way and the truth and the life. I love my life in Christ. It is my joyous duty and unmerited salvation, to give God praise, always and everywhere.

Thanks be to God!




When Emperor Constantine granted full liberty to Christians in 313, they did not spare in their efforts to construct places for the Lord; numerous churches were erected at that time. Constantine himself also built churches, one of which was a magnificent basilica on the Caelian Hill in Rome, over the ancient Lateran Palace, which Pope Sylvester I dedicated to Christ the Savior (318 or 324). A chapel dedicated to Saint John the Baptist was built within it, serving as the baptistry. This moved Pope Sergius III to dedicate it to Saint John the Baptist as well. Lastly, Pope Lucius II also dedicated it to Saint John the Evangelist in the 12th century. Thus, the name of this Papal Basilica is the Basilica of the Most Holy Savior and of Saints John the Baptist and John the Evangelist in the Lateran. Christians consider the Basilica to be the mother church of all churches in the world.
