Unsettling Words in an Unsettling World.

In today's Gospel, Jesus warns His disciples that the magnificent temple, so admired for its beauty, would one day be torn down. For the Jewish people of the time, this was unthinkable. The temple was not just a building; it was the heart of their faith, their history, and their identity as God's chosen people. Yet Jesus uses this moment to remind them, and us, that no earthly structure, no matter how glorious, is everlasting. Only God's Kingdom endures.

When the disciples asked Jesus when these things would happen, He immediately cautioned them: "See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time has come.' Do not follow them!" This warning is as important today as it was two thousand years ago. Throughout history, there have been countless individuals and groups predicting the "end of the world" or claiming to know the date of the "rapture." But Jesus Himself tells us elsewhere in the Gospels: "Of that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven nor the Son, but only the Father" (Matthew 24:36).

This is a powerful reminder for us as Catholics: if even the Son of God, in His humility, does not declare the day of the end, how can any man or woman claim to know? The Church warns us against false prophets who prey on fear, twisting Scripture for attention, power, or influence. Rather than filling us with peace, they stir up anxiety. Rather than drawing us closer to Christ, they distract us with false promises.

It is easy to become unsettled when we hear of wars, earthquakes, plagues, or other tragedies. Our world is full of turmoil, and every generation has seen such things. Yet Jesus assures us: these events are not the final word. They are not signs that God has abandoned us, but opportunities to strengthen our faith. The Lord calls us not to live in fear of the end, but to live faithfully in the present.

Notice what Jesus says will happen before the end: "It will lead to your giving testimony." As Christians, our greatest responsibility is not to decipher secret signs, but to bear witness to Christ in our daily lives. Even in suffering, persecution, and rejection, even from those closest to us, He promises to be with us. He assures us that the Holy Spirit will give us the wisdom to speak, and that by perseverance we will secure our lives.

This perseverance is not passive waiting. It is active faithfulness: clinging to the sacraments, living out the Beatitudes, loving God and all of our neighbors, and trusting in His providence. Our hope is not in escaping trials through some dramatic "rapture," but in remaining steadfast with Christ through all trials, knowing that resurrection and eternal life await those who endure.

As Catholics, we do not anxiously calculate the end times; we prepare our souls at all times. The Eucharist strengthens us for the journey, Confession restores us when we stumble, and prayer keeps us rooted in God's peace. Rather than obsessing over "when," we focus on "how," how we live each day as disciples of Jesus Christ.

So let us not be deceived by voices that claim to know the unknowable. Let us not give in to fear when the world shakes. Instead, let us anchor ourselves in Christ, who promises: "Not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives." Our security is not in predicting the future but in trusting the One who holds the future.

Stewardship Thought for the Week



In today's Gospel Jesus suggests that his disciples must be prepared to suffer ridicule, persecution and perhaps even death if they are to follow him. Sometimes we may wonder if enduring ridicule and scorn are what we really signed up for when we received the sacraments of initiation. Would we not rather sneak through life as painlessly as possible? Good stewards take their faith seriously and find comfort in the closing words of today's Gospel: "You will be hated by all because of my name but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives." Let us make it part of our daily prayer routine to ask the Holy Spirit for the courage to act in Jesus' name no matter the consequences.



Stewardship of Treasure Report – October 2025

We have begun the second quarter of the fiscal year (July 25-June 26). Thank you for your support of the mission and ministries of our parish. During the month of October, our average weekly collection was \$24,127. You also generously donated to various important causes in our October/special collections at \$6,728 (\$1,570 weekly). This brings our weekly October total \$25,697. We budgeted our Sunday Offertory income (less special collections) for JUL-OCT (17 weeks x \$25,000) at \$425,000 and received \$403,000 (-\$22,000). We count on every parish family and household to faithfully participate in the mission of St. Nicholas and St. William Parish by your prayers, your presence, your gifts and your service. We can accomplish by our sacrificial giving of time, talent and treasure. We encourage everyone to consider using the Sunday Offertory Envelopes or Online Giving as a way of giving to the Lord the “first fruits” of the “treasure” we have received.

Dear Fr. Matthew,

It is that time to update you on the year just passed at the St. Athanasius Conference of the St. Vincent de Paul Society. Please see the financial summary attached to the email with this letter.

Once again, St. Nicholas & St. William Church has made a great impact in funding our operation. Donations of \$24,037, nearly half of our income for this year, helped us provide financial assistance to people in need living in Mountain View. We assisted 52 families who were experiencing difficulty paying rent, utility bills, and transportation costs, and 35 more who came to our rectory or our office looking for help with buying food for the day. In August, we held our annual Back-to-School event for our neediest parish families where we gave 212 school-age children a gift card for the purchase of school supplies or clothing. It was a great success, made possible by several volunteers including 10 high school students from the parish youth group. We were also able to provide modest travel subsidies to the 12 students from St. Athanasius who attended the Steubenville Catholic Youth Conference in San Diego this year, many from families who have received our help in the past or volunteered at our events. The extent of all this would not have been possible without your parishioners' backing, and so we are extremely grateful. Meanwhile, we pray for a few more volunteers, especially bilingual, who can help us with the work of meeting people in need.

On behalf of St. Vincent de Paul at St. Athanasius, thank you to the parishioners of St. Nicholas & St. William for their tremendous support. We feel blessed to be able to continue in this mission of charity.
