The Making of an American Saint

Holiness is not a distant dream—it's God's call for each of us. As we celebrate the canonization of Blessed Carlo Acutis, we are reminded that America, too, needs saints whose lives reveal faith in our everyday world.

One such figure is Servant of God Cora Evans (1904–1957), a wife, mother, and convert from nearby Boulder Creek. Through her mystical visions, later shared in her book *Refugee from Heaven*, Cora walked with Christ through His joys, His sorrows, and His redeeming love. In those moments, Christ entrusted her with a mission: to spread devotion to His Mystical Humanity—the mystery of His life dwelling in every soul. This devotion calls us to welcome Christ into our daily lives, to unite ordinary moments with His presence, and know that holiness is possible for everyone.

I have been blessed to work on her cause for canonization, now under review at the Vatican. Advancement requires a verified miracle through her intercession.

Might that miracle be yours?

Join me in praying for Cora's intercession. Silently offer your intentions and trust that God continues His work through her.

“Servant of God Cora Evans, pray for us. Obtain healing for our families, peace for our nation, and courage to live as faithful witnesses of Christ. I also place before you this special intention: [pause]. Amen.”



The Advent Wreath

Next Sunday, November 30, the Church enters a new season. Advent is a winter feast celebrated for the four darkest weeks of the year. The sun rises later and later and sets long before the day is complete. Christmas comes during the darkest of this dark time. It is the Feast of Light, the celebration of Him who is the Light of the World. Therefore, throughout these four Advent weeks, we light a candle for each of the weeks. As the advent of Christ overcame the darkness of the world so, also, does Christ overcome the darkness within our lives.

The wreath (a circle) is the symbol for eternity; the evergreen symbolizes life; the purple candles, hope. The rose (pink) candle, a sign of joy for the Third Sunday and third week of Advent; and the number of candles (four) is symbolic of the four weeks of Advent and the of the traditional legends that the world waited four-thousand years for the advent of the Redeemer.

Many families keep alive the tradition of the Advent Wreath in their homes. If the Advent Wreath is not yet a familiar sight in your home, perhaps this year might be the time to begin. The wreath can be placed on the dinner table or in another prominent place in your home where all can see and use it as a part of the grace before each evening meal throughout the Advent Season.



In today's Gospel, we hear of the rulers who sneered at Jesus, the soldiers who jeered at him, the criminal who reviled him, and the people who just stood by. At our own parish church, the cross stands high. Yet, every Sunday, some sit in front of it and remain unmoved by it. Some people walk right by the cross, unmoved by it. Perhaps they've walked by it so many times they no longer give it a second thought. Could it be they are unmoved because the heart of this unbelieving thief is in them? Good stewards walk by the cross, notice it, and ask themselves: "All this you did for me, what have I done for you?"





Get your 2025 Little Blue Books!


Prepare your heart this Advent and Christmas season with the Little Blue Book — a beloved companion offering daily gospel reflections that are simple, inspiring, and deeply meaningful. Each short reflection helps you take a few quiet moments with God each day, opening your heart to peace and renewal during this sacred season. Advent begins Sunday, November 30, and the Christmas season continues through Sunday, January 11.

Little Blue Books will be available in the vestibule (back of the church), beginning November 23.

Holy Communion

In the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) #240, the Church teaches, “One of the most beautiful and intimate ways we participate in the Mass is through the reception of Holy Communion, the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.”

Bishop Cantú has given each parish permission to offer the chalice of our Lord’s Precious Blood to the faithful during Holy Communion. As in the past, there will be two extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion with Precious Blood. They will offer you the chalice, accompanied by the words, “The Blood of Christ.” Your response, “Amen.” You then take, drink, and return the chalice. The minister will then wipe the chalice with a purificator. We must remember that “the whole and entire Christ and the true sacrament are received under either species.” (GIRM #240) If one receives either the Precious Blood, the Sacred Host, or both, one receives the fullness of the grace of the sacrament.

Handi-capables Mass - November 8, 2025

Saint John Paul II once said:

“The dignity of every person is not a question of the degree of intelligence, beauty, or physical strength, but lies in the fact that each person has been created in the image and likeness of God.”

(John Paul II, Address to the Disabled, 1984)

Our worth, therefore, is not something we earn — it is something we are. We don’t have to pass an exam, run a race, or prove ourselves useful to be loved by God. We are loved simply because we exist.

That means the person who cannot walk, or see, or speak clearly, has exactly the same dignity as the person who leads a country or runs a company. In God’s kingdom, there are no “less important” lives — there are only beloved children.

Saint Paul said in his letter to the Corinthians:

“My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.” (2 Corinthians 12:9)

The world often sees weakness as something to hide or fix. But in God’s eyes, weakness is a doorway for grace.

Our handi-capable brothers and sisters teach us this truth better than any sermon could. Through their patience, their perseverance, their smiles that radiate joy even amid struggle — they show us that strength is not in muscles or in speed, but in heart.

They are not “less than.” In fact, many of them are more — more compassionate, more forgiving, more open to love. They remind us that heaven’s standards are not the world’s standards. Every person — regardless of physical or mental ability — is capable of the most important thing in life: to love and be loved.

My dear friends, when we look upon someone with disabilities, let’s not see limitation. Let’s see God’s masterpiece. Let’s see courage, beauty, and grace.

Because one day, when we stand before God, He will not ask, “How fast did you run?” or “How high did you climb?”

He will ask, “How well did you love?”
