

When Bread Is Not Enough

It is hard to believe that the First Sunday of Lent is already here. Another year, another Lent, and if you are anything like me, it can feel like it sneaks up on you. We blink, and suddenly we are being marked with ashes and asked what we are giving up. Maybe you had a plan. Maybe you did not. The good news is this: it is not too late.

The Church, in her wisdom, gives us three simple pillars for these forty days: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. They are not random spiritual tasks. They are invitations, invitations to enter the desert with Christ.

In today's Gospel, Jesus is led by the Spirit into the desert. Notice that: led by the Spirit. The desert is not an accident. It is not punishment. It is intentional. It is a place of stripping away distractions, comforts, and illusions so that what remains is what truly matters.

After forty days of fasting, Jesus is hungry. The tempter approaches Him in that place of weakness. "If you are the Son of God, command that these stones become loaves of bread." It is a subtle temptation. Not just about bread, but about identity. "If you are the Son of God..." Prove it. Secure yourself. Satisfy yourself.

Jesus responds, "One does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God."

Lent reminds us that we, too, do not live on bread alone. We do not live on productivity, affirmation, social media, comfort, success, or control. We live on the Word of God. We live from our identity as beloved sons and daughters.

Prayer is how we return to that identity. Maybe this Lent your prayer looks like waking up and offering the first moments of your day to God in gratitude. Maybe it is ten minutes of silence before the Blessed Sacrament. Maybe it is praying a Rosary on your commute or attending daily Mass once a week. Prayer does not have to be complicated. It is simply creating intentional space to listen, to remember who you are and whose you are.

Fasting is not only about chocolate. It can be traditional fasting on Wednesdays and Fridays. It can also be fasting from complaining. Fasting from constant noise. Fasting from scrolling. Fasting from a negative mindset. Fasting creates hunger, and hunger reminds us that we are made for more than immediate satisfaction. It reorders our desires. It helps us ask a simple question: Is this bringing me closer to God or further away?

Almsgiving turns us outward. It can be financial generosity, yes. But it can also be the gift of your time, calling the lonely family member, having coffee with someone who needs encouragement, volunteering in the parish, or simply doing the dishes at home without expecting praise. Almsgiving loosens our grip on ourselves and teaches us to love concretely.

"You can do anything for forty days." That is what we tell ourselves. But Lent is not about proving spiritual strength. It is about rediscovering simplicity.

Our God is incredibly simple and good. By simple, I do not mean boring or shallow. I mean clear. Direct. True. He does not want us confused, frustrated, or constantly striving to prove ourselves. The enemy tempts Jesus to question His identity. God the Father had already declared it at His baptism: "You are my beloved Son."

The same is true for you.

Lent invites us into our own desert, to strip away excess "bread," excess noise, excess self-reliance, and to stand in the quiet truth that we are children of God. When we are rooted there, everything else becomes clearer. Decisions simplify. Priorities sharpen. Joy becomes less dependent on circumstances.

The devil eventually leaves Jesus, and angels minister to Him. The desert is not the end of the story. Faithfulness leads to freedom.

As we begin these forty days, do not be discouraged if you feel unprepared. Enter anyway. Choose something. Start today. Go into the desert with Christ. Ask yourself often: Is this drawing me closer to God or further away?

And remember, you do not live on bread alone. You live on the love of the Father, who delights in you, sustains you, and calls you His own.

MESSAGE FOR LENT FROM POPE LEO XIV

*Below is a summarized version.

Dear brothers and sisters,

Lent is a time when the Church invites us to place God once more at the center of our lives. In the midst of daily anxieties and distractions, this season offers renewal by calling us back to what truly matters. Every path of conversion begins by allowing the word of God to touch our hearts and transform us. For this reason, Lent is a privileged opportunity to listen to the Lord and renew our commitment to follow Christ on the road to Jerusalem.

Listening

Listening is the first step in any relationship. God reveals himself as one who hears the cry of his people, and he invites us to learn to listen as he does. Sacred Scripture, proclaimed in the liturgy, teaches us to recognize the cry of the poor and the suffering. Lent is a school of attentiveness – to God's word, to the truth of reality, and to those whose anguish challenges our lives and communities. To listen well, we must cultivate interior openness and allow the Lord to shape our hearts.

Fasting

Fasting prepares us to receive the word of God. By abstaining from food and other comforts, we discover what we truly hunger for and learn to order our desires. In this way, fasting frees us from complacency and keeps alive our thirst for justice. As Saint Augustine teaches, in this life we hunger and thirst for righteousness, stretching our souls toward the fulfillment that God alone can give.

Fasting must be lived in humility and communion with the Lord. Without nourishment from God's word, it loses its meaning. It should also take practical forms – including refraining from words that wound. Let us disarm our language, avoid harsh judgments and slander, and instead cultivate kindness, respect, and hope in every sphere of life.

Together

Lent also has a communal dimension. Conversion touches not only individual consciences but our relationships and dialogue. Our parishes, families, and communities are called to journey together – listening to the word of God, to the cry of the poor, and to the cry of the earth. In this way, we renew our covenant with the Lord and open paths toward justice and reconciliation.

May this Lent make us more attentive to God and to one another, so that our listening and our fasting help build a civilization of love.

Rites in Preparation for the Easter Sacraments

Next Sunday at the 5:00 pm at St. William we will celebrate (with those who are preparing to complete the Christian Initiation or enter into Full Communion in the Catholic Church) a Penitential Rite, A Calling to Conversion to mark the Lenten purification for those candidates approaching the maturity of faith and understanding requisite for a fuller life in the Catholic Community.

THE LAWS OF FAST & ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent are days of abstinence from all meat (beast or fowl). Except for a serious reason, all those fourteen years old and above are bound by this law.

Ash Wednesday is also a day of fasting. This law binds on all people between the ages of eighteen and the beginning of their sixtieth year. On these two days, one full meatless meal may be eaten. Two other meatless meals may also be taken sufficiently to maintain strength; however, together they should not equal a full meal. Liquids, including milk and fruit juices, may be taken between meals.

No Baptisms during Lent


