First Sunday of Lent: Pilgrims of Hope



What is a natural death? It sounds like an easy question. For most people, a natural death is being surrounded by your loved ones as your soul passes from this life into God's glorious kingdom. But for some, a natural death means choosing another option: Medical Assistance in Dying, or

MAID, (a politically correct term for assisted suicide). Assisted suicide is when someone, typically a health care professional, provides the means for another to kill themselves. People making this choice want to wrap up their lives on their own terms, not on God's terms.

10 states and the District of Columbia have some form of MAID and there are 12 states with pending bills. 8 countries also offer some form of MAID as an option and 2 countries have assisted suicide options for those 18 and under. This is not abortion, but is for children who have a life threatening prognosis or significant birth defects.

"The acceptance of the twin evils of physician-assisted suicide and euthanasia, far from promoting or supporting our core human dignity, constitutes a broadside attack against it. Both threaten those who are sick and vulnerable with systematic abandonment, not only by denying the basic protections to which they are entitled as members of the human family, but also by taking away the dignified care and loving human accompaniment due them in the final stages of their journey." National Catholic Bioethics Center




Blest Art will visit St. Stephen on Wednesday, March 12, as part of our special Lenten Family Catechesis Night.





Chant Mass for the Season of Lent

As we enter the sacred season of Lent, we will be using the **Chant Mass** during our liturgies. This setting, provided by the **International Commission on English in the Liturgy (ICEL)**, embraces the simplicity and reverence of chant, helping us to enter more deeply into prayer and reflection.




