

From the desk of Deacon Luis:

My dear friends from Queen of Martyrs Parish, allow me to share my story with you.

My name is Dcn. Luis Reyes. I grew up in Colombia in a nice Catholic family in the city of Bucaramanga. I am the youngest of four siblings, two brothers and one sister. As a seventeen-year-old young man I received the invitation to join the Diocese of Madison from Fr. Francisco Higuera. So, in God's providence, I came to the United States and joined the Diocese of Madison when I was only eighteen years old. This was one of the best decisions of my life. It has been an honor and privilege for me to be a seminarian for the Diocese of Madison. I am thankful for this opportunity to be in formation for the priesthood with the diocese. In 2018, I was assigned to be at the Cathedral Parish in Madison, WI as my home parish in the diocese, now known as Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish.



For my college seminary studies, I attended Immaculate Heart of Mary Seminary in Winona, MN where I was blessed to receive a great formation that allowed me to encounter my identity as a beloved son of God and to make good friends who accompanied me to form my heart and mind according to God's will. I completed my first year of major seminary in Detroit, MI. I have been attending St. Francis de Sales Seminary in Milwaukee for two years, and I have the privilege to be assigned to our parish, Queen of Martyrs, during the weekends as my teaching parish. This summer I will be here with all of you, serving as a deacon.

This past May 16, 2025, I was ordained as a transitional deacon. As I reflect on ordination to the diaconate, I have been praying to remain in Christ's peace. I have experienced Christ's peace in this journey of formation. The Lord has provided so many blessings, like the support of the Diocese of Madison, fraternity with my fellow brother seminarians and priests, and the numerous friendships with different families around the diocese.

These blessings confirm and encourage my vocation to the priesthood. I am grateful to discern and to be able to say with moral certitude that God wants me to be a priest and so do I. The graces of my diaconate ordination have already been incredible and will continue to allow me to love, know, pray, and serve the people of God in a very particular and profound way through the Sacraments and as a faithful servant of the Church. I believe that as long as I remain in Christ's peace and close to His Mother, I will be able to remember my identity as a beloved son of the Father, my friendship with Jesus our Lord, and the indwelling of the Holy Spirit in my soul. Be assured of my prayers for you all in this process of formation.

What Is a Mass Intention?

A Mass intention is a specific petition for which the Mass is offered. Mass intentions can be requested on behalf of another living person—for example, the healing of someone who is sick or to commemorate a wedding anniversary. However, Mass intentions are most commonly offered in remembrance of someone who has died.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "From the beginning, the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God" (CCC 1032).

The graces that come with having a Mass said for a special intention are immeasurable. The Mass unites the Church on earth to the Church in heaven. The intentions of the Mass are lifted by the Body of Christ in its entirety.
