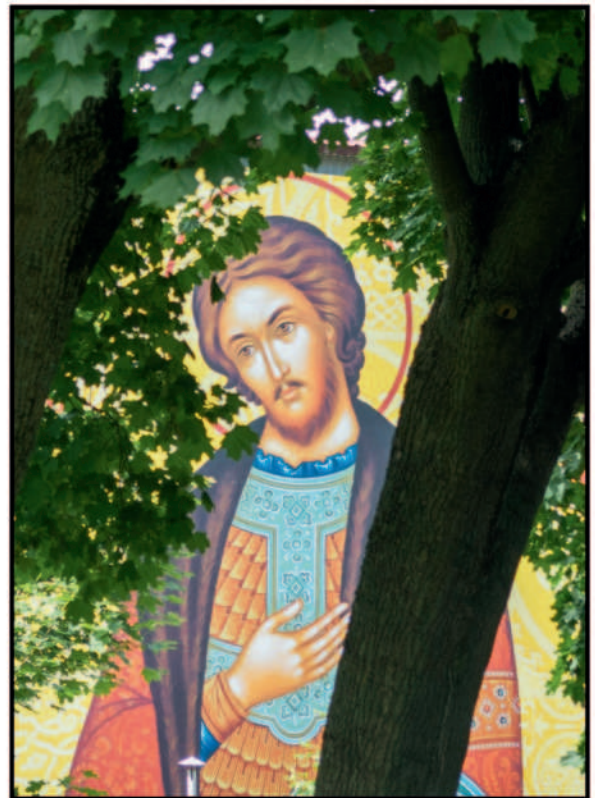

Second Sunday of Ordinary Time

This Sunday's Gospel continues the mystery we celebrated last week at the Baptism of the Lord. John the Baptist now points beyond himself and declares who Jesus truly is: "**Behold, the Lamb of God.**" With these words, John unites two great biblical images—Israel's Passover lamb and the suffering servant who bears the sins of many. Jesus is revealed not as a distant judge, but as the One who freely offers Himself for our salvation. John testifies that the Spirit descends and remains upon Jesus, revealing Him as the Son of God. This Gospel invites us not only to recognize who Jesus is, but to follow Him—trusting that the Lamb who takes away the sin of the world is also the One who leads us into new life.

Martin Luther King Jr. Day

On Monday, we observe **Martin Luther King Jr. Day**, a time to reflect prayerfully on the Church's call to confront racism and uphold the dignity of every human person. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops teaches that racism is not only a social issue but a sin—a failure to recognize one another as brothers and sisters made in the image of God. As Cardinal Wilton Gregory has reminded us, the work of justice begins with conversion of heart, honest dialogue, and concrete action rooted in love. May this day inspire us to renew our commitment to Christ's commandment to love one another and to build communities marked by respect, reconciliation, and hope.

January 22 – Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children

Each year on January 22, the Catholic Church in the United States observes a **Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children**, marking the anniversary of the 1973 *Roe v. Wade* decision that legalized abortion nationwide. Although the *Roe* decision was overturned by the Supreme Court in 2022 with the *Dobbs* ruling, the Church continues to call this day a solemn opportunity for **prayer, penance, and advocacy** for a culture of life, recognizing that many laws and policies still fail to protect the most vulnerable. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops urges the faithful to pray for the full restoration of legal protections for unborn children, to accompany women and families in need with compassion, and to work peacefully toward a society that cherishes every human life from conception to natural death.

A Prayerful Reflection



More than three years after the reversal of Roe v. Wade, the effects of decades of abortion on demand persist. Abortion remains legal in most states, with laws varying widely, and voters in several states will face abortion referendums this fall. While there have been significant pro-life advances at the national level, including efforts to defund Planned Parenthood and restore key pro-life policies, serious challenges remain—especially the increased use of abortion pills.

Much work remains to protect children, women, and families from the tragedy of abortion. Wherever we live, we are called to help build a culture that welcomes and protects human life through prayer, action, and advocacy. As we mark the anniversary of Roe v. Wade this January and remember the millions of lives lost, may we recommit ourselves to the cause of life and to supporting women facing difficult or unexpected pregnancies with compassion and care

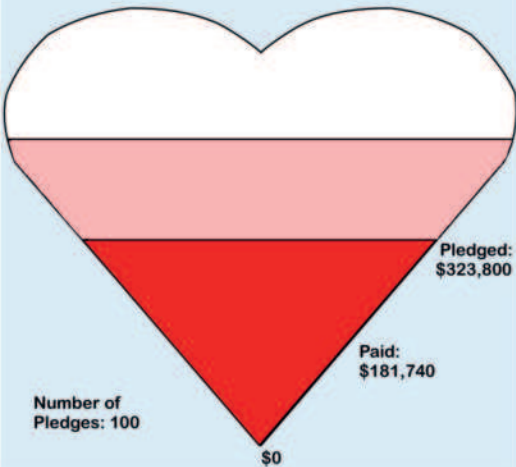

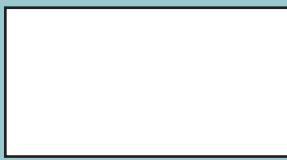
