Ministry Description: In 1994 Pope St. John Paul II established the Pontifical Academy of Life to educate and promote the intrinsic value of all human life. Thirty years later scientists have "learned" even more, but many people now "know" even less about the value of the human person, made in the "image and likeness of God." Men and women of all ages are urged to consider joining us in prayer, action and education. Guardians of Life meet monthly and engage in such activities as praying throughout the 40 Days for Life Prayer Vigils in front of Planned Parenthood; praying at a local strip club (engaged in human trafficking); leading pro-life Rosary processions in the local area; handing out brochures, rosaries, prayer cards, stickers, etc. and collecting donations of needed baby items and cash during May and October for local organizations (such as Women's Care Center, Babies and Beyond, and Care Net). Our fervent prayer is that all abuses against innocent human life end and that all who have been affected in any way may be healed! WE ENCOURAGE THE FORMATION OF A YOUTH CHAPTER AS WELL.
