Dear Friends in Christ,

Can you believe we are already seeing ads for Christmas shopping and the "holiday season?" It seems even earlier than in years past, but I will capture the moment to write a little bit about Christmas this week. Let us

recall that the liturgical Christmas Season begins on Dec. 24th and lasts until the Baptism of the Lord (Jan. 8th this year).

This year Advent is very short--beginning on Dec. 3rd and ending on Dec. 24th. That means, just like back in 2017, we have two mass obligations to fulfill within three days for the 4th Sunday of Advent and Christmas. Christmas, being a feast of great importance, is always a holy day of obligation (please note January 1st, since it falls on a Monday, is not a Holy Day of Obligation this year, although still a great day to attend mass!). Here is how our mass schedule will look:

4th Sunday of Advent

Dec. 23rd - 4:00 p.m. @ St. Luke, 5:30 p.m. @ St. John

Dec. 24th - 7:30 a.m. @ St. Patrick, 8:30 @ St. John, 10:00 a.m. @ St. Luke

Christmas Masses

Dec. 24th - 4:00 p.m. @ St. Luke, 6:00 p.m. @ St. John, Midnight Mass @ St. Luke Dec. 25th - 8:00 a.m. @ St. Patrick, 10:00 a.m. @ St. John

This year marks the 800th anniversary of the very first live nativity scene orchestrated by St. Francis of Assisi in the town of Greccio, Italy. Every year I look forward to setting up the Nativity scene as it reminds me of God's great humility. I'm considering having some type of live nativity scene at a local farm this year, stay tuned for updates on that...

In 2019 Pope Francis wrote a very beautiful letter on the meaning of the Nativity. Here is a passage from that letter:

"The Franciscan Sources describe in detail what then took place in Greccio. Fifteen days before Christmas, Francis asked a local man named John to help him realize his desire "to bring to life the memory of that babe born in Bethlehem, to see as much as possible with my own bodily eyes the discomfort of his infant needs, how he lay in a manger, and how, with an ox and an ass standing by, he was laid upon a bed of hay". At this, his faithful friend went immediately to prepare all that the Saint had asked. On 25 December, friars came to Greccio from various parts, together with people from the farmsteads in the area, who brought flowers and torches to light up that holy night. When Francis arrived, he found a manger full of hay, an ox and a donkey. All those present experienced a new and indescribable joy in the presence of the Christmas scene. The priest then solemnly celebrated the Eucharist over the manger, showing the bond between the Incarnation of the Son of God and the Eucharist. At Greccio there were no statues; the nativity scene was enacted and experienced by all who were present.'

Other Notes:

Our finance councils of each parish will continue to meet.


