

From the Partor

Dear Friends in Christ.

Our first reading this week is another of my favorites, from the Book of Wisdom: "For he fashioned all things that they might have being." It

is a reminder of the shear gratuitousness of creation. As we read in the very first paragraph of the catechism: "God, infinitely perfect and blessed in himself, in a plan of sheer goodness freely created man to make him share in his own blessed life."

God created us not out of necessity (as if he needed some soldiers or laborers to help him out) but out of pure love. Each person was directly willed by God to exist because he simply wanted us to exist. God looks at every creature and says, "It is good that you are." To love is simply that: to value someone for their existence and not for their usefulness.

What does it mean to share in God's own blessed life? It could mean that in some way we are to act like God. After all, we are made in God's image. This means we are to treat all creation with reverence and respect. It could also mean that we are called to be co-creators with God. Those of you who garden or produce your own food know how rewarding it is to be a creator. If we were to ask the question: Are we acting more in God's image when we are creating or when we are consuming? The answer would certainly be when we are creating.

There is a great struggle right now in our culture between consuming and creating. Consuming has never been easier! (You can buy with just one click....). As human beings we need to consume, we cannot avoid it, but it shouldn't be our main activity. Consuming should be in the service of our creativity. Our main activity should be to work and be creative. In that way we are best imaging our Creator God.

Sometimes I could not say NO and sometimes I could not say YES to some people and events. The feelings of rejections & misunderstandings often came to disturb me, and to make me down and give up. But there were a few people who encouraged me. In their encouragement, I knew life was not a race, but rather that I should live each day in gratitude to those few who love you no matter what you are or who you are.

Today I can say proudly, among those few, You are one of them! And now I have decided to live each day in gratitude, making an extra effort to love my Lord a little more than what I did for the last few years. My soul magnifies the Lord my savior!

My heart bends low in gratitude to each one of you who made my 50th Birthday a great one. Your birthday cards, gifts and best wishes are so meaningful to me. You really made me feel loved. Thank you for loving me, accepting me and understanding me as your Priest and Father. I am also eternally grateful to my Bishop Hying for his fraternal love and concern and to Fr. Luke and my sister, Sr. Rina, who came all the way from India while facing lots of challenges to be with me on behalf of my parents and family.

Be assured of my prayers for you all. 50 began on 24th June but it continues until I am 51! So, continue to pray for me, to be a holy priest and not a good priest.


