

From the Parter

Dear Friends in Christ,

We want Christ to reign! The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ King of the Universe marks the end of the liturgical year. Should we expect to see Jesus reigning here on Earth? Very often we might think

this world belongs more to Satan than to Jesus; after all Satan is called by Jesus "the ruler of this world." We also hear the Lord himself saying that his own kingdom "does not belong to this world." Yet we would be mistaken to believe that Jesus' should not reign here on Earth. Jesus is the Creator and Satan is not his rival but only his enemy. The Catechism teaches us clearly:

"The power of Satan is, nonetheless, not infinite. He is only a creature, powerful from the fact that he is pure spirit, but still a creature. He cannot prevent the building up of God's reign. Although Satan may act in the world out of hatred for God and his kingdom in Christ Jesus, and although his action may cause grave injuries — of a spiritual nature and, indirectly, even of a physical nature — to each man and to society, the action is permitted by divine providence which with strength and gentleness guides human and cosmic history. It is a great mystery that providence should permit diabolical activity, but "we know that in everything God works for good with those who love him" (#395)."

At the second Vatican Council the tension between heaven and earthly kingdoms was summarized in a brief statement from the document Gaudium et Spes:

"On this earth that Kingdom is already present in mystery. When the Lord returns it will be brought into full flower (#39)."

Jesus is the King of the entire universe, so He is certainly the one who reigns over all the Earth. We see his Kingdom in mystery in the various works of the Church: helping the poor, teaching the truths of the faith and celebrating the sacraments. The Catholic Church is the body of Christ and carries out his Kingship here on earth. His Kingdom belongs to heaven but serves everyone on Earth—it is a kingdom of service and love. You and I contribute to the up-building of God's kingdom every time we follow the good inspirations of the Lord Jesus—especially when they cause us to sacrifice some good thing or comfort here on earth.

Ad Orientem Worship

During advent on Sunday mornings the Mass will be celebrated Ad Orientem. During the Eucharistic Prayer the priest will stand and, facing the same direction as the congregation, offer to God the Eucharistic sacrifice. Advent is a special time where we "look east" for the coming of the Messiah—and Ad Orientem means "towards the east." I have decided to do this only on Sundays mornings because the rising sun in the east is a symbol of Christ's resurrection and second coming.

The change to having the priest face the people after Vatican II was not a requirement but it is, according to the General Instruction on the Roman Missal, "desirable whenever possible." Ad Orientem, however, is not forbidden and I believe it is good to experience this direction of prayer from time to time. I recall once in seminary attending a Chaldean liturgy (the Catholic rite found primarily in Iraq) and experiencing for the first time ad orientem worship. It felt like the priest was leading the people towards God. He faced the same direction as them and looked together with his people upon the large crucifix located on the eastern wall.

As Catholics we should always have a universal heart. We may have our preferences on liturgical direction but we should be open to what the church allows and what we might experience in other traditions like the Chaldean Catholic Church. After Advent we will resume the usual direction for all weekend masses.


