A MESSAGE FROM DEACON

Have I said, "thank you"?

Our readings for the 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time give us advice on how we should live our lives as Christians. First we should remember to be thankful to our God and to others for what they do for us. Secondly, we need to love all our neighbors and accept them as children of God. We have heard this advice before, but we see in the Scripture readings where the Word turns into action.



Sunday's first reading and the Gospel reading tell the tales of two lepers and how they reacted when they had been cured. Leprosy is an infectious disease, causing severe skin sores and nerve damage. It has been around since ancient times. Despite medical advances, today about 200,000 people in the world are infected with leprosy every year including up to 250 cases here in the U.S. Not only do lepers have to deal with this terrible disease, they also sometimes live in isolation because they are shunned and not accepted by society. You can imagine how depressing the situation can be.

From Second Kings in the Old Testament, Naaman is cured of his leprosy after the prophet Elisha told him to plunge into the Jordan River. A grateful Naaman returns to Elisha to give thanks and to offer a gift to the prophet himself. But Elisha refuses to accept the gift because the healing is not because of his own powers, but instead the healing came from God. Elisha rightly so felt God should get all the glory. In the end, Naaman becomes a worshipper of God.

In the Gospel reading from Luke, Christ is met by ten lepers as he enters a village. They asked Jesus to have pity on them. Our Lord tells them to show themselves to the priest and as they were walking away, they were cleansed. Now when one of the ten men realized that he had been healed, he turned around, returned to Christ and fell at his feet glorifying God. Even though this man was a Samaritan, he wanted to give thanks to the Divine One who actually healed him. But what about the other nine men? Where did they go? Well they went to the priest to show themselves and supposedly thanked the priest, not God, for being healed. All of this was not lost on Jesus who asked the Samaritan where the other nine were? "Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God? Stand up and go; your faith has saved you." So much like the first reading, we hear in the Gospel about a person who is grateful for being cured of this hideous disease and wanted to give thanks.

I want you to think for a moment about the last time someone did a favor for you. Did you remember to say thank you? I would suspect that we don't thank people enough for when they do something for us. Why is that? Is it because we don't want to admit we needed help, or we just don't recognize the generosity of the other person?

Taking this one step further and on a much bigger scale, how often do we say thank you to our Creator? Do we appreciate what God has done for us? Do we give thanks to God for the gifts He has given us? Or do we take the Divine Creator for granted? Suffice it to say, we probably don't thank Him enough.

At the beginning I mentioned that the Scripture readings not only remind us to be grateful but also accepting of others. By example, God shows us he is loving and accepting of all whether you are a leper or a sinner. Christ is constantly challenging existing boundaries and pushing them ever outward. We should follow his lead because all are welcomed within the boundaries of the holy community Jesus has formed.




