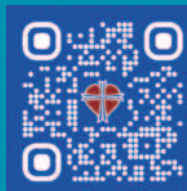

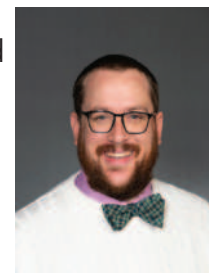

A MESSAGE FROM TYLER

Imitating the impossible: Finding Hope in the Holy Family

Being a parent is hard! I don't know about other parents, but I felt a lot of "dad fear" the moment the hospital released us after our daughter was born. I remember thinking to myself, Are you sure you want to let us go home? I don't know if I know what to do, and it's really nice just having a nurse here to guide us when we need it.



But we strapped our daughter in her carseat, double- and triple-checking that she was secure, and then we got in the car and started the drive home. During that 20-minute drive, I think I growled at every car that got within 30 feet of our car. I was honestly afraid those other cars would somehow cause us to get into an accident. But we made it home—and from there, we eventually figured out how to (at the very least) not mess up completely as parents for the past almost 8 years of our daughter's life.

In light of that constant struggle to be a good parent, we might experience today's feast of the **Holy** Family with some discouragement. With everything we may struggle with in our families, we may feel like we will never be good enough, like the Holy Family. On the other hand, we can instead be encouraged by the example of the Holy Family. Jesus, Mary and Joseph, can give us hope that we, too, can attain the eternal rewards we long for, even as we live in a broken world.

During these past eight years, my wife and I have had new and old arguments about parenting and life in general. Along with our daughter, we've also welcomed a son into our family. The four of us under one roof often have moments of frustration and disagreements with each other. It's hard to imagine sometimes how we can be holy. Still, in spite of these struggles, we have learned that the root of it comes down to one thing: love. In fact, whenever we discipline our kids, we come to them and ask, "What's the answer to everything?" In other words, why do Mommy and Daddy try to teach you and form you and care so much about that? Our kids know the ultimate answer to all of it is, "I love you."

As I reflected on this feast day, I looked at the opening prayer for Mass and took encouragement from it:

*O God, who were pleased to give us the shining example of the Holy Family, graciously grant that we may imitate them in practicing the virtues of family life and in the **bonds of charity**, and so, in the joy of your house, delight one day in eternal rewards.*

The Holy Family is a shining example for us in our own families. It's not because they were exactly like us—let's face it they weren't (**Jesus** is God, **Mary** was immaculately conceived without sin and remained sinless, and **Joseph** is believed not to have committed any sin during his life). Still, they're an example for us because, like them, we can strive to overcome the struggle and difficulties that we face in our own lives through the bonds of charity.

Mary and Joseph were betrothed, and then she was found to be with child. In response, Joseph didn't run to her in anger. It is believed that Joseph understood that there was some greater design at work in Mary. He was fearful and didn't know how he could be a part of that great plan (I get that—I still don't know how I can be a good dad to my kids and they aren't God incarnate!). So, out of his great love (this bond of charity) for both Mary and God, Joseph decided to divorce her quietly.

When Joseph and Mary presented Jesus in the temple, Mary was told that “a sword [would] pierce through [her] own soul” (Luke 2:35). Can you imagine as a mom being told, *Hey your child is set for the fall and rising of many, and that because of it your soul will be pierced by a sword.* That’s a bit much for a new mom (and remember, Mary was about 14 years old). But she, like Joseph, had such great love for God and her family that she was able to hold and ponder these things.

Then in a dream, Joseph is told that Herod is coming to kill their child and they would have to flee to a foreign country, (a country where their people were once held captive as slaves). Both Mary and Joseph are bound by such great charity to each other and God that they are able to trust in the plans the Lord has for them.

I could go on about the difficulties the Holy Family faced, but I think the common theme that we can take from their lives, is the bond of charity they have for each other and for God. We can work to imitate that, even if it is imperfect. How? In today’s second reading, we hear St. Paul tell us that we are to “[bear] with one another and [forgive] one another, if one has a grievance against another; as the Lord has forgiven you, so must you also do.” No matter the difficulties that we may face throughout our lives, it is that bond of charity that we must maintain through perseverance and forgiveness.

Sure, my family has fights and disagreements. We have faced our own difficulties and struggles that have caused us anxiety. But it is when we come back and forgive each other, bearing with each other through those difficulties, that we find hope and the strength similar to the Holy Family, as they faced the struggles of their lives for the hope of the ultimate goal of the joy in our Father’s house. This bond of charity is what we can strive for as we pursue holiness. After all, what is the answer to everything? “I love you.”

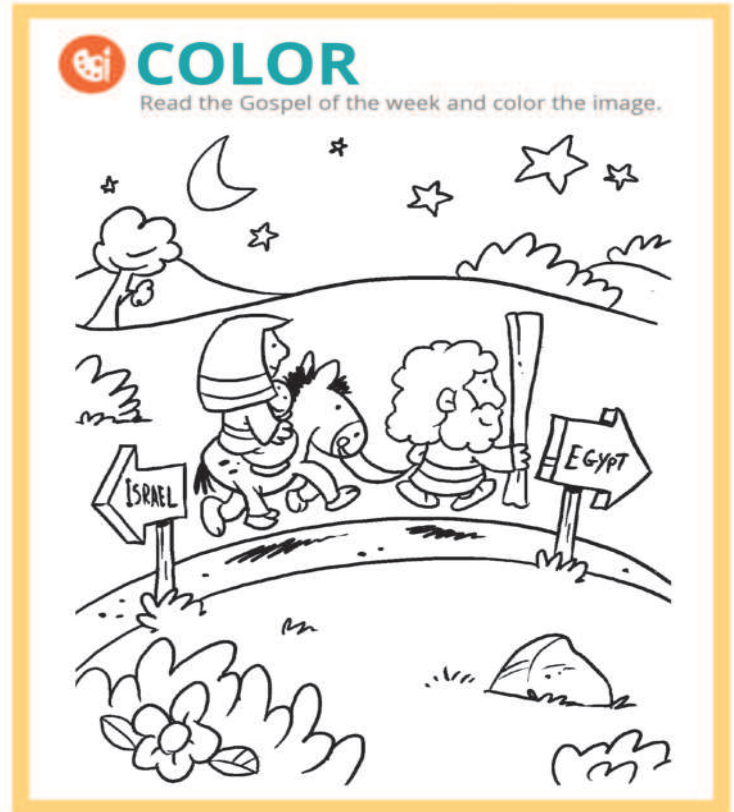

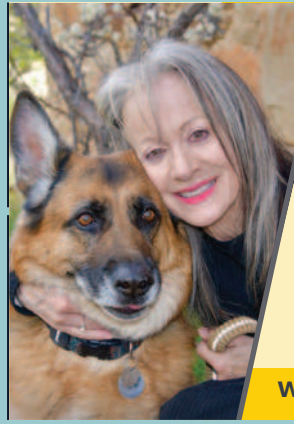
