



JUBILLE 2025 – PILGRIMS OF HOPE TRINITY SUNDAY

A story is told of the great theologian St. Augustine who was attempting to write a treatise on the Holy Trinity. As he walked along the Mediterranean Sea, he saw a young boy holding a shovel and small pail. As he looked on, the boy dug a hole in the sand, and then went to the water's edge. Grabbing his pail, he filled it to the brim and then proceeded to carry it to the newly dug hole, pouring the water from his bucket into it. Then he went back to the seashore, filled another bucket, and once more dumped it into the hole. This went on and on, as Augustine watched inquisitively. Finally, approaching the boy, Augustine asked, "What are you doing?" He responded energetically, "I am going to pour the water from the sea into this hole." Augustine replied, "That's impossible, you can never do that!" To which the boy said, "And you will never be able to explain the Trinity!" With that, the boy vanished.

The Mystery of the Most Holy Trinity stands, as the Catechism states, as "the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God Himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them (CCC#234).

In his Angelus address of May 30, 2021, Pope Francis said, "This God is the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Three persons, but God is one! The Father is God; the Son is God; the Spirit is God. But they are not three gods: it is one God in three Persons. It is a mystery that Jesus Christ revealed to us: the Holy Trinity....They are Persons. There is the Father to whom I pray with the Our Father; there is the Son, who gave me redemption, justification; there is the Holy Spirit who abides in us and inhabits the Church. And this speaks to our heart because we find it encompassed in that expression of Saint John which summarizes all of Revelation: "God is love" (1 Jn 4:8-16). The Father is love; the Son is love; the Holy Spirit is love. And inasmuch as he is love, God, while being one alone, is not solitude but communion, among the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Because love is essentially a gift of self, and in its original and infinite reality it is the Father who gives himself by generating his Son, who in turn gives himself to the Father, and their mutual love is the Holy Spirit, the bond of their unity. It is not easy to understand, but we can live this mystery, all of us, we can live it a great deal...."

"In the message of the Gospel and in every form of Christian mission, one cannot overlook this unity among us to which Jesus calls, following the unity of the Father, of the Son and of the Holy Spirit: one cannot overlook this unity. The beauty of the Gospel asks to be lived — unity — and witnessed in the harmony among us, who are so diverse! And this unity, I dare say, is essential to Christians: it is not an attitude, a manner of speaking, no; it is essential, because it is the unity that arises from love, from the mercy of God, from the justification of Jesus Christ and from the presence of the Holy Spirit in our hearts."

The mystery of the Trinity reminds all Christians that we are called to communion and unity. St. Therese said, as she pondered her calling at Carmel, "I have found my vocation, my vocation is to love." Love is at the center of the mystery of the Trinity, and thus is ours also.

proclamation, reflection, music, costumed dramatic storytelling, prayer, and inspirational exhortation.




