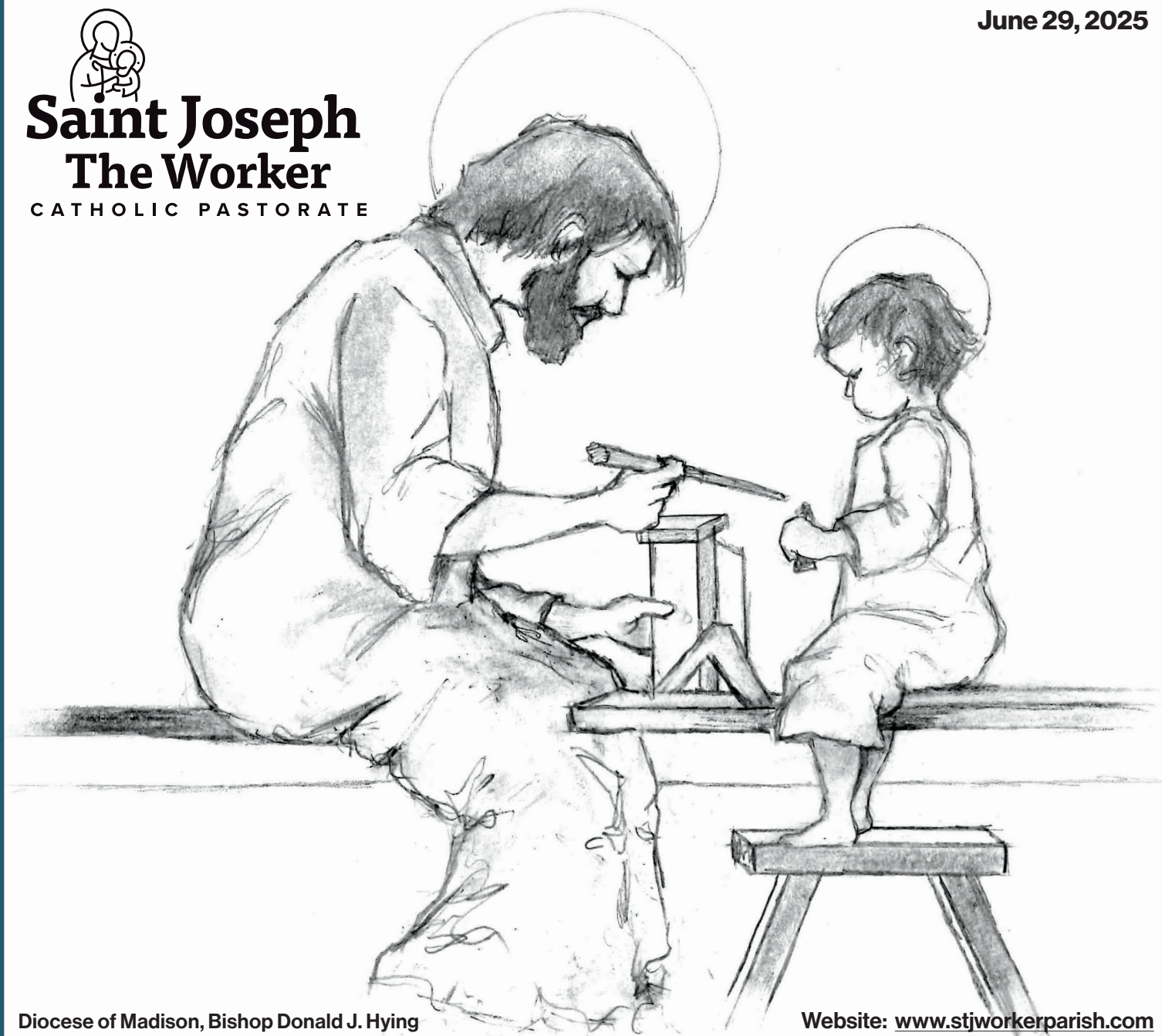

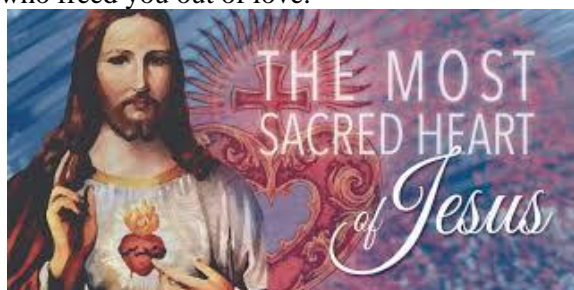

**FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION
AT ST. CLEMENT**

This Friday, July 4th, is once again our opportunity to spend time adoring the Lord Jesus present in the Blessed Sacrament. On July 4th, we celebrate our country's freedom. At every Mass we celebrate and give thanks to the One who set us free from eternal death and sin. In Pope Francis' encyclical on the Sacred Heart, titled "He Loved Us," Pope Francis wrote, "While no one should feel obliged to spend an hour in adoration..., the practice ought surely to be recommended. When we carry it out with devotion, in union with many of our brothers and sisters and discover in the Eucharist the immense love of the heart of Christ, we "adore, together with the Church, the sign and manifestation of the divine love that went so far as to love, through the heart of the incarnate Word, the human race" (#85). We are blessed that we have the opportunity to spend time in Adoration on this holiday. There are a few times left to fill; sign up at the Fatima Chapel and be with the Lord Jesus who freed you out of love.

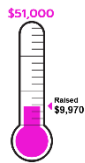

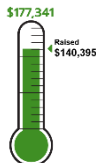

Adult Faith Formation at St. Clement

This week we continue our reflection of "KEEPING THE FIRE ALIVE: Navigating Challenges in the Spiritual Life," a six-part series with Fr. Albert Haase, OFM. In session two, Fr. Haase will discuss "Resisting Temptations." Temptations. Not one of us escapes temptation. Not even Jesus. We know from scripture that after the three-fold temptations by the devil in the desert, it says that the devil departed from Him until another opportune time. In this session, Fr. Haase will also discuss what we can do when our resistance is low, or we are deceived, and we give into temptation. We gather on Tuesdays following the 8:15 AM Mass, with session ending by 10:30. All are welcome!



JUBILEE 2025 – PILGRIMS OF HOPE THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

On October 24, 2024, Pope Francis shared with the Church and world his ENCYCLICAL LETTER **DILEXIT NOS**, known in English as "He Loved Us". This encyclical is a teaching on the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In it, Pope Francis puts forth the many dimensions of Jesus' Sacred Heart. The first and foremost of these is always the Love of Jesus for us, which we see in the 1st paragraph below. The remaining portion shared here reflects on the missionary dimension of Jesus' love. It was His love that motivated the apostles and disciples to go forth into the world. To read the full document, google "Pope Francis & Sacred Heart."

1. "HE LOVED US", Saint Paul says of Christ (cf. Rom 8:37), in order to make us realize that nothing can ever "separate us" from that love (Rom 8:39). Paul could say this with certainty because Jesus himself had told his disciples, "I have loved you" (Jn 15:9, 12). Even now, the Lord says to us, "I have called you friends" (Jn 15:15). His open heart has gone before us and waits for us, unconditionally, asking only to offer us his love and friendship. For "he loved us first" (cf. 1 Jn 4:10). Because of Jesus, "we have come to know and believe in the love that God has for us" (1 Jn 4:16)....

208. As we contemplate the Sacred Heart, mission becomes a matter of love. For the greatest danger in mission is that, amid all the things we say and do, we fail to bring about a joyful encounter with the love of Christ who embraces us and saves us.

209. Mission, as a radiation of the love of the heart of Christ, requires missionaries who are themselves in love and who, enthralled by Christ, feel bound to share this love that has changed their lives....

215. Jesus is calling you and sending you forth to spread goodness in our world. His call is one of service, a summons to do good, perhaps as a physician, a mother, a teacher or a priest. Wherever you may be, you can hear his call and realize that he is sending you forth to carry out that mission. He himself told us, "I am sending you out" (Lk 10:3). It is part of our being friends with him. For this friendship to mature, however, it is up to you to let him send you forth on a mission in this world, and to carry it out confidently, generously, freely and fearlessly. If you stay trapped in your own comfort zone, you will never really find security; doubts and fears, sorrow and anxiety will always loom on the horizon. Those who do not carry out their mission on this earth will find not happiness, but disappointment. Never forget that Jesus is at your side at every step of the way. He will not cast you into the abyss, or leave you to your own devices. He will always be there to encourage and accompany you. He has promised, and he will do it: "For I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Mt 28:20).

216. In your own way, you too must be a missionary, like the apostles and the first disciples of Jesus, who went forth to proclaim the love of God, to tell others that Christ is alive and worth knowing. Saint Therese experienced this as an essential part of her oblation to merciful Love: "I wanted to give my Beloved to drink and I felt myself consumed with a thirst for souls". That is your mission as well. Each of us must carry it out in his or her own way; you will come to see how you can be a missionary. Jesus deserves no less. If you accept the challenge, he will enlighten you, accompany you and strengthen you, and you will have an enriching experience that will bring you much happiness. It is not important whether you see immediate results; leave that to the Lord who works in the secret of our hearts. Keep experiencing the joy born of our efforts to share the love of Christ with others.

Questions for Reflection

When you see an image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, what speaks to your heart?

In what way have you experienced Jesus' love for you? Can you share this with someone?

How can remembrance of Jesus' promise to be with you always give you hope?

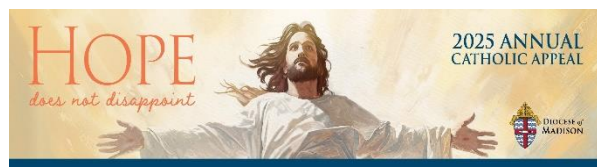
In case you missed this from an earlier post, one of the families that was in the program have been able to move into their own home! The family worked hard to achieve this, but this could not have happened without your support and care.

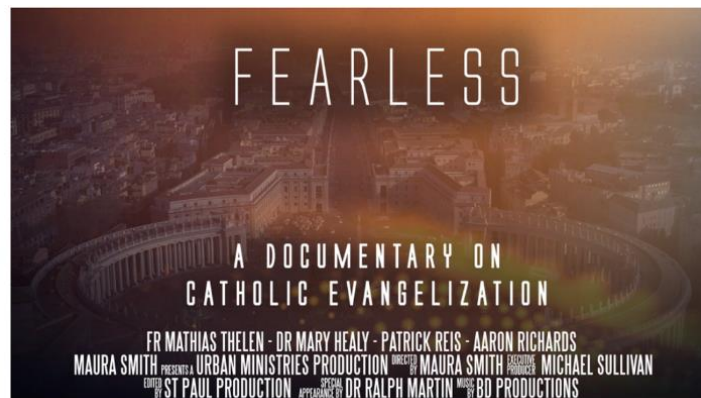
